1. Matches are 4 quarters of 12.5 minutes each way
 - Quarter-time is 2 minutes
 - Half-time is 5 minutes
2. Points: 3 for a win; 1 for a draw
3. To determine pool placings:
 - total points won
 - goal difference
 - goals for
 - result of the match between the teams concerned
 - if still equal, a Shootout competition will be held
4. Semi-finals & Final: in the event of a draw at full time, a Shootout competition will be held





ALL IRELAND SCHOOLS (BOYS) CHAMPIONSHIPS – RULES

5. Squad size: a maximum of 18 players may be used by each school during the tournament. A maximum of 18 players may be used in each match, of whom two must be goalkeepers in full goalkeeping equipment. If a team chooses not to include a second goalkeeper on the bench, then they are limited to 16 players (in line with FIH tournament regulations)

6. The removal of a goalkeeper for an extra outfielder is prohibited in this tournament

7. Colour clash:

- During group matches, the first named team shall change
- In semi-finals & final, first drawn team changes

8. Match ball:

- During group matches, the first named team supplies the match ball
- In semi-finals & final, Hockey Ireland will supply the match ball

9. Timings: a punctual start to all matches is essential

10. Umpires: schools must always have a competent umpire available for all matches

11. Cards: to reflect new timings of matches • Green card = 2-minutes • 4-minute yellow card (5 minute yellow) and 7-minute yellow card (10 minute yellow card)

12. Emergency committee:

The tournament director has the authority to convene an emergency committee to deal with disciplinary matters and they may alter, amend or adjust these rules as they see fit.

In the event of a red card, the committee will take immediate and appropriate action.

The committee reserves the right to review multiple yellow cards and take immediate and/or appropriate action.

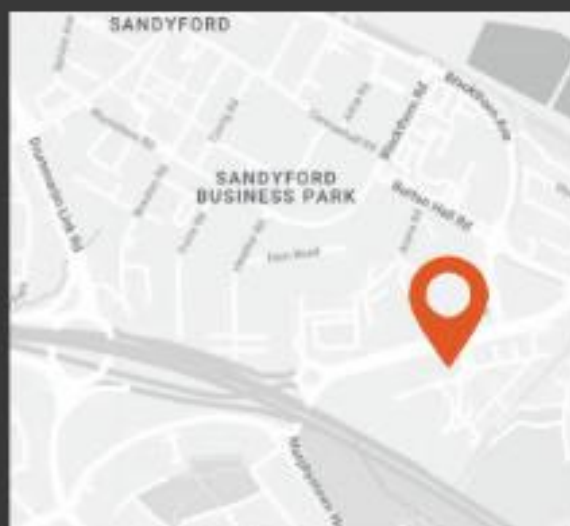

History of The Irish School's Tournament





At the Irish Hockey board (81/82) meeting an invitation came from a Dutch club wishing to organise a European club Under 19 competition. At that time, we did not play club Under19 events. I was at the meeting as Chair of Irish schools and suggested that the schools could run an event with the winner to go to Holland. The Board accepted this suggestion. With this as the go ahead I planned the tournament. It was agreed to play it at Halloween half term which would give the winner time to prepare for the Dutch trip.

1982 was the year – the venue Bangor. The grammar school would provide lunch at the school. Those needing accommodation would stay at the Savoy Hotel half a mile away. It would also be the site for the tournament dinner. Three all weather pitches were a mere 400 yards away and a fourth pitch at the girl's school about half a mile away – everything very convenient. It was decided that Ulster would have 8 teams, Leinster have 5 and Munster 3. Schools would be organised into four groups and seeded to try to get the four top teams through to the play off group. Each group would play off and then the winners would play off to determine the winner and the group second, third and fourth would play off to get the final order.

On the night of the dinner, it was very wet which created a pitch problem. We decided to cut our losses – play the top group and the remaining teams play one friendly against a team they would not normally play. This worked well as the original play would have not only have got a winner but also got a classification finding the bottom team – not really a great idea. The event went off well and we got a winner – Newry G S .

As you will see this format has held firm since this start. However, a number of points to note. The use of all weather pitches meant that finding four at a venue was easy and a wide choice of venues was available as a result.

The next change was the arrival of the synthetic pitch. So far as the tournament was concerned in1989 one pitch at Grange Road was available and used for group matches and for the semi finals and the final. Bangor G S won this first synthetic final. This became the formula with the whole tournament being played on Astro for the first time in 1992. Clearly it was more difficult to get a venue with four Astros within easy reach at that time.

As you will see this format has held firm since this start. However, a number of points to note. The dinner was often discussed and one year we did not hold one – I seem to remember wandering around Limerick to find somewhere to eat! I think after that all realised the advantage of having a meal set up in one place and to socialise together.

The schools taking part seem to be the same but in fact that is not in fact the case. No school has played in every event and so far, 37 different schools have participated. You will note from the list of finalists how the winners have moved from Province to Province. The attraction of a Dutch trip lasted for a while but has run its time.

We have been fortunate to have had the help of the Umpires especially over the final day. It takes the pressure off the school staff at the final moments.

It was great for me to attend our 40-year event in Cork and to note that things are still working well within the original framework. It serves as a great gathering of school players and the opportunity to meet up at an old-fashioned hockey event. You will note that the format has held up well through time. The hosts have retained the key aim of bringing people together. It certainly brought teams to places in Ireland that they may not have been to before – 'sir where is this Limerick?' (or wherever)!

Hopefully as more Astros are built it may be possible to widen our venues again. One further point I must mention was the introduction of the Herbie Sherman trophy for play in positions 5 to 8. Herbie from Kilkenny had been great supporter of school's hockey, and this was a very suitable memory of his contribution. This was added in 2019.

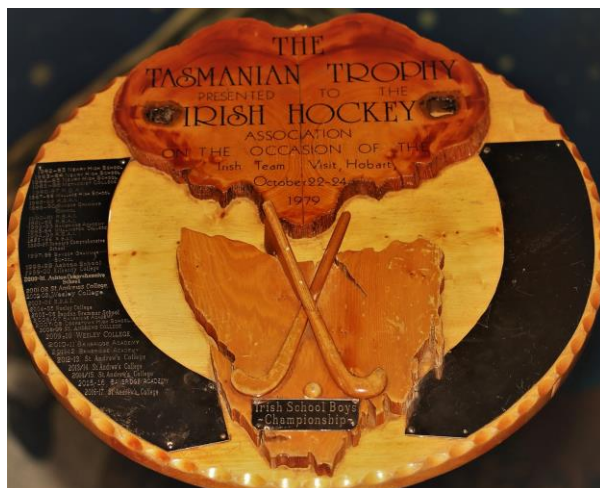

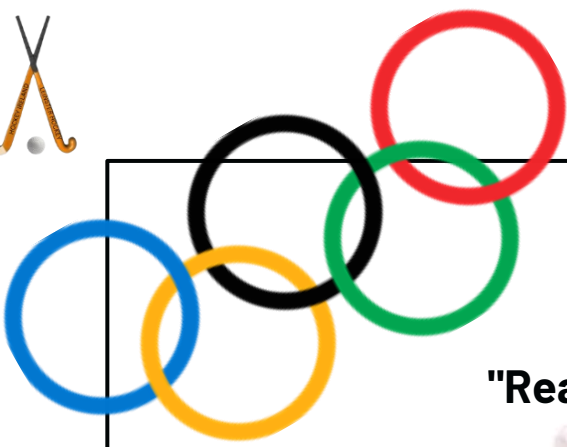
Shane O'Donoghue

Ireland's record goal scorer (125) since his debut in 2011, Shane played a key role in winning European bronze in 2015 and qualifying for the 2016 Olympics.

One of only two on the current side who played in Rio (scoring three goals to help Ireland finish 10th), and one of the nine whose hopes of making Tokyo 2020 were controversially dashed in a playoff in Vancouver.

Shane won two Belgian titles with KHC Dragons and was nominated for FIH's 2015 Young Player of the Year.





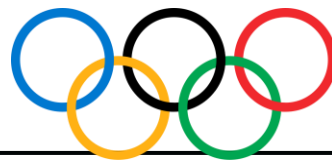
"Reaching for the Stars"

It's hard to believe that it's 15 years since playing in the School All Irelands down in Limerick. I still remember making the move from Templeogue College to High School, as daunting as it was, I was buzzing to have the chance to play school hockey for the first time. Like the majority of young lads in Ireland, I played all sports, but hockey was the one that I was destined to play. I knew from the age of 13/14 that I wanted to play for Ireland, and nothing was going to stand in my way. From playing underage in my home club Glenanne, to wearing the blue of Leinster, to my four years playing professional in Belgium for KHC Dragons,

I always wanted to challenge myself to see how good I could be. The road is never straightforward nor easy, and not qualifying for London 2012 was the first of a few tests of character and resilience. Every athlete you meet has setbacks, and you learn more about yourself, what you can do better than the big victories. Winning bronze at the 2015 Europeans and netting two goals in the match was the first taste of international success.

From that moment, I knew the journey was worth the sacrifices and commitment. After a breakthrough year in 2015, when we won the bronze, nominated for Young Player of the World, winning the Belgium championship with KHC Dragons, the ultimate goal was achieved - qualifying for the Rio Olympics. An experience of a lifetime, representing your country, your club, your family, your friends, and of course, your school.





Playing against the best of the best, sharing the Olympic village with the likes Usain Bolt, the Williams sisters, and Rafa Nadal - Rio was a moment in time that I'll always be proud of. Getting to the top of the mountain for some is a dream come true and enough to satisfy some, but not for me, I wanted more. We used that as a platform to qualify for the 2018 World Cup in India, where I broke the goal scoring record, previously held by the Cork legend John Jermyn.

As I mentioned before, the road is not without its bumps along the way and boy did we hit a big one when travelled to Vancouver to play Canada in two games to qualify for a second consecutive Olympics in Tokyo. In the most heart-wrenching fashion, our dream, my dream was snatched a way in the school, of ways. Four years and nothing to show for it. I'll never forget flying back from the Tokyo qualifiers glassy eyed and fog like mind. Arriving back to Ireland, not knowing what to do next, contemplating retirement, it was a dark period in my life, I won't lie. Setbacks are part of the journey, and I knew there was another Olympics in me.

Roll the clock forward four years playing in Paris this summer on front of all my family and friends - I can proudly call myself and two-time Olympian, Irelands record goal scorer and proud to have given my all to the sport that gave me so much.

But out of all the memories in the green of Ireland, and playing abroad, I cherish the time where I got to play in the All-Ireland schools in Limerick, a tournament that has a different edge to it and one where you get that first sense of real competitive hockey. A chance where you get to represent your school, and it would be amiss of me not to recognise Paul Fitz and Dougie Miller who made that trip what it was - a great memory. Since retiring, I look back on a period in my life with immense pride, one full of memories and friendships that'll last a lifetime!

I wish all the schools the very best of luck and most importantly - enjoy it!

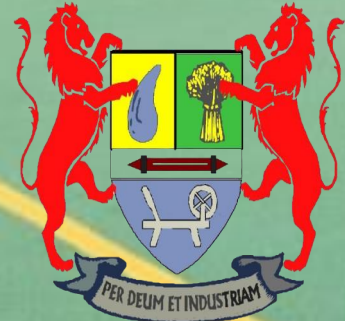
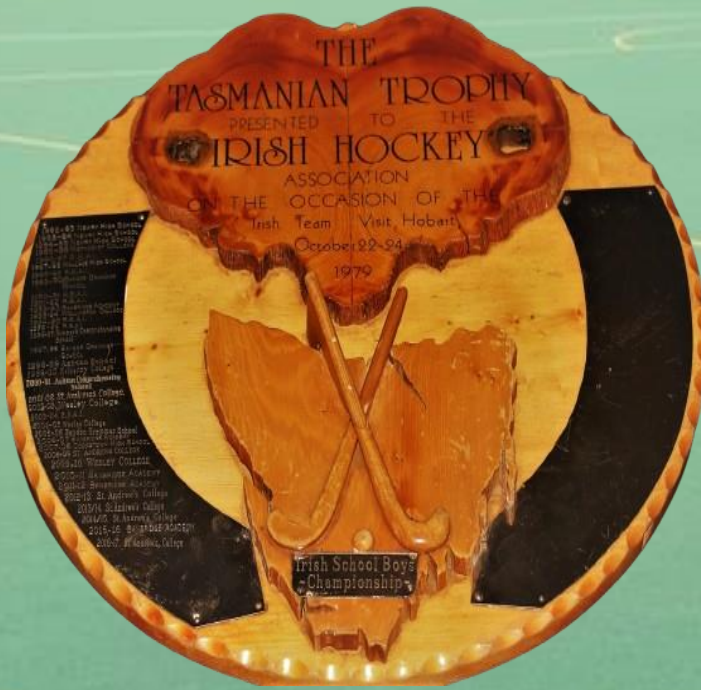

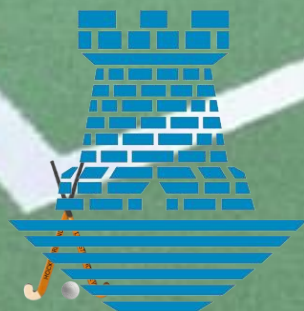
