Presenters' Choice

Thursday, October 9th

Music Millennium was born on The Ides of March, 1969, as an 800 square foot record store on the corner of 32nd & East Burnside. Specializing in mostly underground music not found in outlets which existed at the time, Music Millennium filled a niche for the Portland music community.

The Couth Buzzard is a legendary hub of the Seattle literary and music community: a bookstore and café which is a meeting space which is a venue - for more than 30 years. New owners Tallis and Hilary Moore are glad to be carrying on the tradition. Karl Niece will present on behalf of the Couth.

Concerts at Our House takes place in a 107-year-old Victorian home with a stage and full PA system. The mission of the series is to introduce audiences to both seasoned and emerging artists they might otherwise not have the opportunity to see and for non-Seattle musicians to know they will have a sold-out, well-paying gig.

FAR-West Invitational presents something our conference planning committee finds especially reflective of FAR-West's mission, purpose, and vision. Folk by its very nature is music of the people, and the people are diverse and full of flavor. There's always something that makes us step back and say, "...YEAH!" This is for that.

Mississippi Studios is built, owned and operated by and for musicians. They offer incredible acoustics and sight lines with all-custom, non-parallel walls & stateof-the-art sound. The Studios is home to BAR BAR - its buzzing sidekick - which has a spacious all-season patio + one of the best burgers in town.

The Portland Folk Music Society is a not-for-profit 501(c)(3) actively preserving, presenting, and promoting Folk music and arts in the greater Portland, Oregon area since 1976. PFS sponsors song circles, concerts, in-person and virtual retreats, and helps its members and the whole community pass the word around about Folk music events from old-time ballands to sea shanties, from 60s protest Folk to contemporary singer-songwriters.

MEET THE TALENT

Terry Robb is hailed as one of the finest blues players and acoustic guitarists, as well as an Americana ethnomusicologist. Incorporating elements from Delta blues, ragtime, country, swing and jazz, Robb has built a unique blues sound that's made him a legend in a music career spanning four decades.

CARMAIG GEDDON is Re-released, eager to get back to work, and domiciled in Seattle WA, uke-punk-folk pioneer Carmaig de Forest teams up with drummer/percussionist/badass Aimee Zoe—here to thrill and delight you with murder ballads, work songs, political rants, urban noir, tales of forgotten Americans on the great great plain, and more.

The True North Duo are Kristen Grainger & Dan Wetzel, based out of Oregon's Willamette Valley. Kristen was named, along with Brandi Carlile and Dolly Parton, one of the "Women Who Wrote Our 2020 Soundtrack" by The Bluegrass Situation. Multi-instrumentalist and singer-songwriter Dan Wetzel builds the instruments played by the duo, including a guitar from the wood of the legendary mahogany "Music Tree" from Belize.

Hannah Mayree (they/them) is a cultural administrator, organizer and advocate for the advancement of Black social, spiritual and economic thriving. They practice and teach the cultural traditions surrounding the banjo as a form of generational healing to develop community connection.

Wonderly is the soulful, playful and ever-adventurous Portland duo Jim Brunberg and Ben Landsverk. Best-known for indie film soundtracks and podcast theme songs, their original songs and albums are most often defined by storytelling. They sound equally at home making epic symphonic soundscapes, twangy americana and bubbly pop, utilizing just about every instrument along the way.

Arietta Ward knows how to take the tragic and make it magic. Some would call her neo soul, others jazz, and still others R&B. But Mz. Etta is more focused on content and the responsibility that she believes every artist has. "Be mindful of how you deliver. Be mindful of your intent while delivering your messages." Her longtime collaborator Michael Elson will join her on the Presenters Choice stage.

A prolific road warrior since the late 90s, Neill tours throughout the USA, Japan, and Europe, performing at venues such as San Francisco's Great American Music Hall and the Newport Folk Festival.
- 8:30 PM Lauren Sheehan, Songster was spun by the joy and slight madness of New England contra dance into a life of music. Lauren's first career was as an educator before founding a small K-8 school in Oregon. She plays whatever music she likes: old blues, vintage, hippie and contemporary folk, tin pan alley, swing, fiddle tunes, instrumental compositions and original material.

They're based in Eugene OR with their toddlers.

7:30 PM - Larry Pattis names his early influences as his father singing during family car rides and listening to music diverse as Bach, Allan Sherman, Benny Goodman on the hi-fi at his grandparents' near-North side Chicago apartment. Pattis succeeds in merging styles of instrumental guitar music not normally found together His musical vision is a blending of emotive beauty with technique.



The Best of the West Awards celebrate individuals and organizations who have made a significant contribution to the FAR-West folk and acoustic music community.

Artist Award: Mary Flower

Mary Flower embodies a luscious and lusty mix of rootsy, acoustic-blues guitar and vocal styles that span a number of idioms – from Piedmont to the Mississippi Delta, with stops in ragtime, swing, folk and hot jazz. Before moving to Portland, this Midwest native taught and performed at legendary Folk school/venue Swallow Hill in Denver, CO.

It's never about re-creation; her dedication to the art form is a vital contribution to America's music. A finalist in 2000 and 2022 at the National Finger Picking Guitar Championship, Flower was a nominee in 2008, 2012 and 2016 for a Blues Foundation Blues Music Award, and many times a Cascade Blues Association Muddy Award winner.

Ambassador Award: Artichoke Music

Founded in 1971 by Judith Cook-Tucker, Artichoke Music began with a simple idea: "artichokes are all heart." The beloved Portland music store blossomed into a vibrant hub for music education, performance, and community connection. Steve Einhorn and Kate Power took the reins in 1981, relocating the store to SE Hawthorne. Under their leadership, Artichoke grew into a home for musicians of all ages and backgrounds, featuring a school of music and an intimate performance venue for folk legends and local talent alike.

The Artichoke was tended by the community that found home there, transforming into a nonprofit and deepening impact through outreach and education. We don't have room here to name all the gardners but we celebrate them at the BotW table. Artichoke continues to thrive as a space where music brings people together—one heart at a time.



Alicia has a background in digital marketing which she applied to her career as a musician. Alicia coaches other artists on crowdfunding their record projects. She hosts a house concert series and has taken on programming music for her community's public spaces like their concert in the park, community arts festival, and local library series.

Amelia Hogan is a San Francisco-based singer of traditional and contemporary Celtic Folk music. Her performances are both in the Irish music tradition of Sean-Nós, or "old style," as well as with traditional and contemporary accompaniment. Also a painter and mixed-media artist, Amelia hosts the podcast MixedMedia_Talks and recently joined the FolkWorks writing staff. Amelia fosters a deep love of communitybuilding in music education, and is committed to sharing how music can inspire people to connect through art.

APRYLLE DAWN has made a name for herself captivating audiences large and small and doing it on her own terms, with autobiographical stories and relatable themes of love, longing, and learning to be true to yourself, engaging her audience with nothing more than her voice and an acoustic guitar or her ukulele. She's become a regular in the Bay Area, performing prestigious venues such as the House of Blues on Sunset Strip in Hollywood CA and on the historic Golden Gate Bandshell Stage.

Ben Caron is a producer, facilitator, and musician. A rural lowa native turned Los Angeles creative, Ben has worked with organizations like the LA Philharmonic, The Hollywood Bowl, LA Opera, and The Apollo in NYC. Since 2016, Ben has focused on healing America's divides through projects like The Human Library, Braver Angels Music, and his YouTube series Home Again: Conversations from the Heartland.

Cameron Swallow has worked with the non-profit Braver Angels since 2018, moderating workshops, working with the national Music Team, and co-chairing the national convention in June of 2024. David Denz performs on Uilleann pipes, Irish flute, cittern, and more. David's background includes British Isles folk, Irish traditional, a fair bit of world music and a healthy dose of conservatory training. He appears with his wife Barbara as 'Otter's Holt' and backs singers around his home on Vancouver Island, B.C. Hannah is a cultural administrator, organizer and advocate for the advancement of Black social, spiritual and economic thriving. They founded and creatively direct the Black Banjo Reclamation Project, a creative eco-system curating musical, cultural and land-based healing opportunities, utilizing the banjo as a tool for reclaiming ancestral wisdom & creating Afro-futures.

ISMAY is a Folk/Americana music project driven by California-based singer/songwriter Avery Hellman. Growing up backstage at their grandfather's Hardly Strictly Bluegrass Festival, ISMAY was inspired early on by artists such as Emmylou Harris, Gillian Welch and Hazel Dickens. Since then, they've appeared at Hardly Strictly Bluegrass as well as other festivals and renowned venues. Their music owes more to geography than genre, with songs about the sights, sounds, and singular characters found way out west on a new horizon.

James Lee Stanley James Lee Stanley boasts an impressive discography, including solo and duet albums, alongside artists like Peter Tork, Tom Paxton, Michael Smith, John Batdorf, Cliff Eberhardt, and Dan Navarro. Stanley's talents extend to TV and film scoring, producing artists such as Mike Pinder, and even appearing on Star Trek: Deep Space Nine. He recently won multiple awards for his documentary, The Opening Act. And he's still such a nice guy...

JANE BUSHMAKER is Director, DSP Audit at the Mechanical Licensing Collective (The MLC), where she oversees The MLC's royalty compliance audits of digital service providers (DSPs). Her work plays a vital role in enabling The MLC to fulfill its mission of ensuring that songwriters, composers, lyricists, and music publishers receive their mechanical royalties from U.S. streaming and download services accurately.

JASON LUCKETT was raised in Southern California but has roots in Maine, Mississippi, and Hawaii. His music mixes elements of classic singer-songwriters with the jazz, soul and samba he grew up with. He writes music for theater and film, has appeared in films and TV, and organized a monthly residency: Second Saturdays Jazz Night with Jason Luckett & Friends. As a teaching artist and facilitator, Jason works with students of ages ranging from 4 to 84. Fearlessly addressing topics of social justice has led to publication of his lyrics and essays in anthologies including The Black Body and Voices from Leimert Park.

JESSE LACY has performed over 600 shows across the U.S., from dimly-lit dive bars to introspective cafés to packed concert halls. His journey's taken him behind the scenes as well—crafting press campaigns for indie artists and films like Jimi: All Is By My Side (starring André 3000), orchestrating the first CD Baby Conference, and collaborating with outlets such as Rolling Stone and NPR's Tiny Desk. As a songwriter and performer, John's work spans stages, classrooms, and communities—always in service of building connection through music.

JOSelyn Wilkinson - **Board Member** of the duo Joselyn & Don, is an artist, educator and performing arts professional dedicated to music education for youth, environmental sustainability, and equal representation in music and the arts. Joselyn is a graduate of UCLA World Arts and Cultures and spent a year in West Africa. Joselyn & Don have just released their third album as a duo and tour the Western U.S.

KEVIN KELSO - Board Member after many years of wearing a suit and tie, started a new career as a singwriter in 2015. Since then, he has written and performed 4 one-person shows of his own songs at festivals in Indianapolis and Tucson, been featured on over a dozen episodes of the Nobody Listens to Paula Poundstone podcast, and played at venues and house concerts all over Southern California.

Kevin Smith, as a longtime employee of an independent newspaper, has been concerned with polarization in the media for years and became actively involved with Braver Angels in 2023. The Braver Angels Music program brings together just about everything he loves. Originally from upstate New York, Kevin Smith found his creative soulmate in 2010; they've been raising a family and performing together as The Jinxes ever since.

Ken Vigil is a folk musician from Portland, Oregon. He has decades of experience playing and supporting folk music around Portland and the Northwest. He is currently a board member of the Portland Folkmusic Society. He was a former board member of Artichoke Music. He has two recordings: "Woody's Ghost" and "Songs for Sisters (and Brothers)." Mr. Vigil is a seasoned performer and professional speaker and presenter.

LindSay White Beyond her musical accomplishments, Lindsay's impact extends to the LGBTQ+ community. She has performed and served as a speaker/panelist at countless queer advocacy events.
