WEAR YOUR FOOTY COLOURS FOR KIDS WITH CANCER.

Just under 150,000 new cases of cancer are diagnosed in Australia annually – and almost 1,000 of them are in children and young people under the age of 18.

Fight Cancer Foundation's Footy Colours Day is a national fundraising event where thousands of Australians come together to show their support for kids with cancer. This campaign raises money to help fund patient accommodation for more than 1,000 families each year, as well as cancer research into better treatments and outcomes for people of all ages.

This annual campaign is held nationally from July to September. The campaign aims to inspire

schools and workplaces across Australia to host a "Footy Colours Day" event – which can include a morning tea, BBQ, pizza night or sausage sizzle! At the event friends and colleagues dress up in their favourite sporting team colours and incorporate games and activities.

2023's campaign raised an impressive \$600,000 with 1,249 registered workplaces, schools and individuals. Workplaces almost doubled funds raised from previous years.

We look forward to your impactful participation in 2024 to make this campaign the biggest year yet!









When cancer fight is only half the battle

Brave six-year-old Daisy Pearse is fighting cancer and winning. But her mother, Ash, says challenges beyond the hospital ward are a burden that regional families should not have to bear.

After the Pearse family was dealt the cancer diagnosis, they were thrust into the awful predicament of having no fixed place to live while Daisy was in hospital.

"Being told you're going to get a room and then it falling through is so disappointing," says Ash.

Fight Cancer Foundation found the Pearse family a long-term accommodation solution so the family could stay together.

Buttery Dried Fruit Slice

Ingredients:

- 170g Unsalted Butter (melted and cooled)
- 3/4 cup Castor Sugar
- 1 cup Coconut
- 1 cup Self Raising Flour
- 1 cup Mixed Dried Fruit
- 1 egg (slightly beaten)

Topping:

1/4 cup of Castor sugar

Alternate Flavours:

Fruit can be replaced with Choc Chips, Nuts, Sultanas or a combination of these.

Method:

- 1 Preheat oven to 170 c (150 c fan forced)
- 2 Line slice tin (suggest 33 x 24 x 3 cm deep)
- 3 Place all dry ingredients in a bowl and add egg and cooled butter. Mix all items together until just combined.
- 4 Put in the lined slice tin and pat down.
- 5 Evenly sprinkle 1/4 cup of sugar over the top to give it extra crunch.
- 6 Cook for 35 minutes, until the top is golden.
- Remove from the oven and place tin on a cooling rack. Leave the slice to cool completely then cut into square pieces.




Fight Cancer Foundation is a national charity dedicated to helping Australian families impacted by cancer by providing much needed accommodation throughout their cancer treatment.

\$29 provides a book or toy for our youngest guests or their siblings.
