Aboard specially equipped vehicles that allow for both comfort and proximity to incredible wildlife, you'll have a chance to view wolves, bison, elk, an array of bird species and other magnificent creatures that call the park home.

Visiting Yellowstone in winter is an experience that transcends words. The air is crisp with the scent of pine trees and the promise of adventure. A serene hush envelops the snow-covered landscapes, providing the perfect backdrop to nature's drama unfolding before your eyes.

In addition to daily park exploration, you'll venture to Mammoth Hot Springs to observe the awe-inspiring Old Faithful geyser, a true icon of Yellowstone's geothermal marvels. You'll also meet an award-winning wildlife photographer at his studio and hear his stories of amazing animal encounters.

Itinerary and Highlights (subject to change)

Day 1: ARRIVE IN JACKSON, WY Refresh at the hotel before gathering with fellow travel companions for a special welcome dinner.
Overnight: The Lexington at Jackson Hole (D)

Day 2: JACKSON | GRAND TETON NATIONAL PARK | NATIONAL ELK REFUGE | JACKSON Set off on an exciting animal safari through Grand Teton National Park providing an opportunity to spot for wildlife roaming through the stunning Teton Range. Visit the National Elk Refuge—home to an estimated 7,000 elk—for a special horse-drawn sleigh ride. This evening is at leisure to explore Jackson's town square.
Overnight: The Lexington at Jackson Hole (B,L)

Day 3: JACKSON | OLD FAITHFUL This morning depart Jackson for a scenic drive to Flagg Ranch keeping a keen eye open for wildlife across the snow-touched landscape. Journey aboard special safari snow coaches to reach the iconic Old Faithful geyser. Then set off on a nature walk to the Castle Geyser to explore the Upper Geyser Basin.
Overnight: Old Faithful Snow Lodge (B,L,D)

Day 4: OLD FAITHFUL | MAMMOTH HOT SPRINGS | LAMAR VALLEY, WY | GARDINER, MT Watch Old Faithful erupt before heading to Mammoth Hot Springs. Walk through historic Fort Yellowstone or along the boardwalk above steaming hydrothermal features. Continue to Lamar Valley teeming with bison, bald eagles and elusive wolves. Tonight gather with the group for a relaxing wine and cheese reception.
Overnight: Yellowstone Gateway Inn (B,L,R,D)

Day 5: GARDINER | LAMAR VALLEY, WY | COOKE CITY, MT | GARDINER, MT Safari through the Northern Range, where wolf packs have been spotted. This afternoon visit an award-winning photographer at his studio for a tour of his impressive gallery. Before returning to the hotel, and if weather permits, snowshoe along one of Lamar Valley's forested ski trails.
Overnight: Yellowstone Gateway Inn (B,L,D)

Day 6: GARDINER | LAMAR VALLEY, WY | PARADISE VALLEY, MT | BOZEMAN Venture into Paradise Valley flanked by snow-covered ranges to the east and west, where bison, elk and coyotes are often seen wandering. Stay alert for wolf packs tracking from a distance as they stay in range of their prey. Tonight gather together for a convivial farewell dinner.
Overnight: GranTree Inn (B,L,D)

Day 7: DEPART BOZEMAN After breakfast, transfer to the airport for flights home. (B)

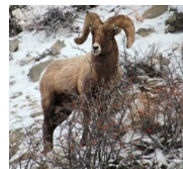


Activity Level: This itinerary has early morning starts. The majority of the program's activities take place outdoors with extended time walking on varying terrain. It is our expectation that guests can withstand cold temperatures; walk on uneven, frozen, or snow-covered terrain; climb in and out of all-terrain vehicles; and manage stairs without assistance. (Maximum elevation: 8,391 feet at the Continental Divide)

(B = Breakfast, L = Lunch, D = Dinner, R = Reception)

What's Included

- 6 nights accommodations
- 6 breakfasts, 5 lunches, 5 dinners (including special welcome and farewell dinners), and a wine and cheese reception
- A fully guided program with 2 expert Orbridge Expedition Leaders who are professional naturalists
- All unique excursions and activities listed in the 7-day itinerary, including transportation
- In-field lectures and presentations, including an overview of the wolf packs and family trees, a naturalist's summary of the science and research on the biological impact of the repopulation of the wolves in the Greater Yellowstone Ecosystem, and a discussion of the political history of the wolves' reintroduction
- Use of in-field gear, including high quality binoculars and spotting scopes, Yaktrax, snowshoes, and adjustable hiking poles
- Hot beverages, water, and snacks throughout touring
- Admission and park fees throughout
- Luggage portage
- Gratuities to Orbridge Expedition Leaders, hotel housekeeping staff, drivers, porters, and wait staff for included meals
- Airport transfers for guests arriving and departing during the suggested times

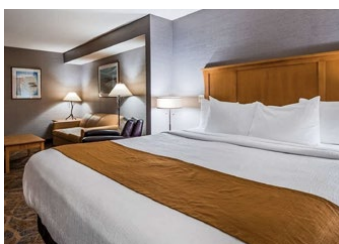
YELLOWSTONE GATEWAY INN
