Letter from CEO

In November 2020, I began my tenure as President and CEO of Partnership for the Future (PFF) in the midst of a global pandemic. Our students experienced a complete disruption to their academic and social lives for nearly a year. 2021 was a pivotal year for PFF as it marked our return to in-person programming for the first time since the start of the pandemic and the return of some semblance of normalcy for our students. Organizationally we made some key investments into our overall programming to address learning gaps, equip our staff with tools to address increasing mental health concerns, and increasing the overall level of support we provide to our students. This included formally expanding our program model from a three model to a seven year program model which supports students through college graduation. This included the creation of a full-time, dedicated Director of College Success and Alumni Engagement to ensure our students are prepared for success in college and beyond. As a former PFF student, it is the opportunity of a lifetime to have the opportunity to support some of the best and brightest students in the Richmond, VA area achieve their dreams of obtaining a college degree.

The Class of 2021 excelled despite the significant disruption they experienced academically due to COVID. The Class of 2021 were collectively offered over a record 16 million dollars in scholarships. Additionally they class had two students offered over a million dollars in scholarships and one student who amassed over two million dollars in scholarships! This was truly an exceptional class with many "firsts" including the first PFF students to attend Stanford University and Princeton University, both on full-ride scholarships I might add. PFF continues to boast strong outcomes and our six-year college graduation rate is nearly 8x the national average for first-generation, low-income students as over 80% of our students are first-generation college students, and over 90% come from low to moderate income homes. Our organization illustrates the endless possibilities when equity meets opportunity. We are truly grateful for the volunteers and donors who invest in the lives of our students and ensure that they reach their full potential.




side. Such people are very hard to find in today's world. This ultimately helped me get through my junior and senior years which I allowed me to get into so many amazing colleges.
