# **Kiwanis Down Syndrome Foundation Klang Centre**



The Kiwanis Down Syndrome Foundation ("KDSF") Klang Centre opened its doors in a small rented home in June 1994 with one Teacher/Administrator (To' Puan Datin Janet LaBrooy) and 4 children.

In 2007 the centre moved to larger premises located at No 28, Jalan Kampar, 41300 Klang, which can cater for up to 65 children. Currently we are serving 61 children who attend the school twice a week for one on one teaching with our specially trained teachers / Therapist.

The Children Priority One is the club's principal programme and caters for children from birth till 6 years old.

We employ 6 full time staff comprising of Teachers/a Physiotherapist/ an Occupational Therapist/ A Child Psychologist and an administrator who attend to the children. Each child attends class for a maximum of twice a week and the ratio of teachers to children is 1:3 per session.





We have 2 sessions per day from 9.00am-11.30am and 1.00-3.30pm. The Centre opens at 7.30-4.00pm, Monday to Friday. Admission is strictly on a first-come first-served basis.

All admissions have to fill out a medical form which must be completed by a registered medical doctor before the child is enrolled at the centre. We place a great deal of

importance on bi-annual medical check-ups, annual eye and hearing tests for each child, so that any health problems can be quickly identified and dealt with. We work closely with the Klang General Hospital where many of our children are referred to for their medical check ups.





We accept children from birth to 6 years old. We encourage early admissions as the earlier the children gets to attend classes the better progress they will make. At the moment we have several babies under the age of 2 attending weekly and who are making great progress. We have 2 globally approved educational programmes which are used at as our syllabus.

#### They are;

- The Infant Stimulation Programme (ISP) for the newly born-2 years old and
- The Early Intervention Programme (EIP) for children from the ages 3-6 years old.







#### **PROGRAMS**

#### **Infant Stimulation Programme**

#### (ISP) - 2 months to 2 years old

For infants from as young as 2 months to 2 years old. This programme is used to strengthen an infant's physical weaknesses (such as low muscle tone) through physiotherapy and occupational therapy so that child can achieve early goals, to be able to crawl; to explore and manipulate objects; to have better reflexes; memory and sound imitation skills.



#### **Toddler & Special Education Programme**

#### Toddler Programme (TOD) - 2 to 3 years old

For toddlers from 2 to 3 years old, TOD builds up on the child's skills achieved so far, to help him or her move on the learning path. However more emphasis is now given to other skills development such as early language, preacademic, story telling, music and art appreciation, all within an environment of fun and play.



#### Special Education Programme (SEP) - 4 to 6 years old

For those who are 4 to 6 years of age, SEP continues to strengthen the skills acquired so far. Apart from refining skills in Gross and Fine Motor, Pre-Academic and Language, the child is now taught Self-Help and Social Skills. These latter skills prepare them for the admission into primary school.

#### **Learning Skills**

- Gross Motor Skills
   Children need daily exercises to build strength in coordination and balancing.
   Physical activities like sports & swimming are given to help children improve their motor planning.
- Fine Motor Skills
   Fine motor skills in all children depends
   on a solid foundation of the gross motor
   skills. Children will be taught eye-hand



coordination eg lacing cards, threading beads.

#### 3. Pre Academic Skills

Sorting objects of different colours & shapes
Matching colors, Matching pictures, Matching alphabets

#### 4. Language Skills

Receptive skills - using lots of concrete objects and pictures to teach.

Understanding concept and communication

Expressive skills – More on communication. Naming pictures/objects, concept and social skills


#### 5. Self Help Skills

Training on independent skills eg dressing & grooming, potty training, feeding

#### 6. Social Skills

Singing, music & movement.

Activities like School concerts and Sports Day



As the first Administrator and Head Teacher of the Klang Centre, she was instrumental in adapting the Robert Deller curriculum to suit the Malaysian students she was teaching, which continues to be used today. She also developed a system that addressed the individual needs of each Down Syndrome child.

Strict, yet caring, her priority was preparing the students for the challenges of life outside the Centre when they completed their course.

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
