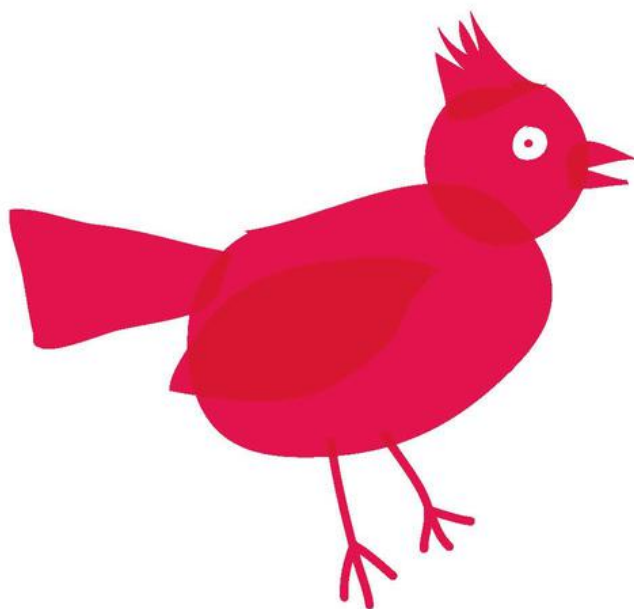

► For campers ages 3 or 4 by June 2026



Our youngest campers participate every day in story time, creative movement, dramatic play, arts and crafts, outdoor play, and rest time. They have daily water play at The Wilson School. Campers need to bring a snack, lunch, water bottle, towel, sunscreen, and a change of clothes.



Weekly registration available. Tuition: \$325 weekly (\$260 week 2 and week 4)

June 8, June 15 (weeks 1 & 2)

Little Explorers

Redbirds will set off on daily adventures discovering the world around them! From nature walks to sandbox “excavations,” campers will explore textures, colors, and sounds through hands-on play and discovery. Camp is closed on June 19, and tuition is \$260 for the week.

June 22, June 29 (weeks 3 & 4)

Color Creations

A bright and messy week full of art and imagination! Campers will mix colors, paint with unexpected tools, and create rainbow-inspired projects while learning about color, shape, and self-expression. Camp is closed on July 3, and tuition is \$260 for the week.

July 6, July 13 (weeks 5 & 6)

Big Top Fun

Step right up for a week under the circus tent! Redbirds will enjoy crafts, balancing games, scarf juggling, and music-filled fun as they discover the magic of the big top.

July 20, July 27 (weeks 7 & 8)

Splish Splash Summer

Beat the heat with water-filled fun! Campers will play with sprinklers, bubbles, and boats, explore floating and sinking, and enjoy outdoor art activities that make the most of warm, sunny days.

Please note: Children must be completely independent in taking care of their bathroom needs by the first day of camp. *Campers who are 4 years of age and do not require rest time can consider enrolling in the Yellow Lions group.*

The Yellow Lions group have all the fun of our older-group camp sessions, but include water play at school rather than off-site. Yellow Lion campers do not have rest time. Campers should bring a snack, lunch, water bottle, towel, swimsuit, sunscreen, and a change of clothes.

Storybook Adventures

Campers will dive into favorite children's stories and bring them to life through art, movement, and pretend play. Each day features a new tale to explore—complete with themed crafts, songs, and imaginative adventures inspired by classic picture books. Camp is closed on June 19, and tuition is \$260 for the week.

June 22, June 29 (weeks 3 & 4)

Little Scientists

Curiosity leads the way as campers explore the wonders of science through hands-on discovery! From mixing colors and melting ice to exploring bubbles and magnets, they'll make predictions, test ideas, and experience the joy of learning through play. Camp is closed on July 3, and tuition is \$260 for the week.

Under the Sea

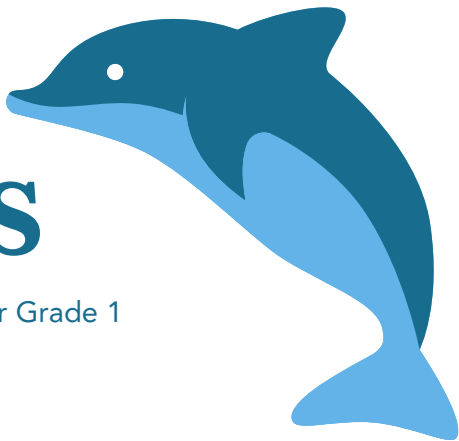

Morning Academic Camp

July 27-31 (week 8)

Phonics Foundations

This engaging morning program helps young readers strengthen phonics skills in a fun, supportive setting. Led by our Senior Kindergarten teacher, campers will practice letter sounds, decoding, blending, and reading fluency through interactive games and hands-on activities. Camp runs from 9:00-11:00 AM, with the option to join the full-day camp afterward. *These specialized sessions take the place of our standard morning theme class and are offered at \$150, or a discounted rate of \$100 for full-day campers.*

Wild Wonders

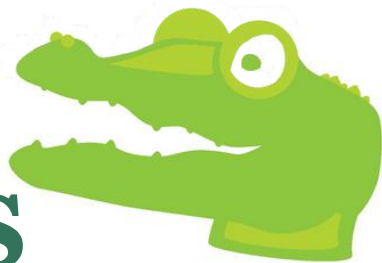

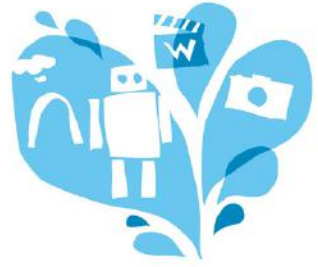
July 20, July 27 (weeks 7 & 8)

The Amazing Race: Camp Edition

Campers team up for a fast-paced, adventure inspired by The Amazing Race! Each day features new “destinations” with challenges in problem-solving, creativity, and teamwork. From puzzles to mini engineering tasks, campers complete missions and earn clues leading to the final challenge. Camp is closed on July 3, and tuition is \$260 for the week.

July 6, July 13 (weeks 5 & 6)

Eco Explorers

Campers explore nature around campus—plants, weather, insects, water, and habitats—through simple investigations, outdoor journals, and nature art.

July 20 (week 7)

Bloxels Game Lab

Develop your own video game with the aid of Bloxels Game Design. Create your own characters and power-ups for use in your game. Tell a story and have fellow campers play your game!

July 27 (week 8)

Jr. Mars Mission with Challenger Learning Center

Campers become astronauts and engineers for a week of hands-on STEM exploration. They'll design habitats, test rover models, and solve space-themed challenges. The highlight is a field trip to the Challenger Learning Center for a simulated mission to Mars!

Due to the included field trip and specialized programming, this session carries an additional fee of \$75.

SUMMER CAMP POLICIES

Behavior Policy
