

In 2024 74% of grades achieved were A*-C, 55% of grades were A*-B, and 21% of grades were A* or A. In an average year, around 90% of BC6F students have gone on to their first-choice university or higher-level apprenticeship, so BC6F is proud to be opening doors for our students and supporting them in setting and achieving their goals.

BC6F students have gone on to study at a range of universities including Liverpool, Leeds, Bristol, Birmingham, Sheffield, Oxford, and Cambridge, as well as making the most of local links with a number of our students going to the University of Nottingham and Nottingham Trent University.

BC6F students who have set themselves on a career path have gone on to start higher-level apprenticeships with organisations including Jaguar, Rolls Royce, Unilever, Experian and the Police Force. Many have also started career focussed courses such as medicine, nursing, paramedic science, midwifery, cyber security, law, occupational therapy and primary education.

BC6F works hard to ensure each student has the support they need to take their next steps with personal advice and encouragement.

Anya studied Photography, English Lit, Media Studies and EPQ. She is now working in digital media and marketing having done an apprenticeship and career in marketing. "Bramcote allowed me to become a more confident and creative person. The opportunities I had meant I could grow as a person, and the relationships I built with my teachers helped me achieve. Working in an environment where I was known gave me the confidence to achieve what I wanted, while encouraging me to step out of my comfort zone and go to London for Channel 4 experience days."



Whilst at BC6F George studied History, Psychology and Philosophy & Ethics A levels and did silver DofE. "I benefited from being able to study in small classes, with very supportive teachers who got to know me well and helped to motivate and encourage me. Faye and my teachers were very supportive in getting my UCAS application right, so I was offered a place at my first choice university but I was also successful in my application for the first ever Police Constable Degree Apprenticeship in the UK with Nottinghamshire Police and Derby University. I chose the Apprenticeship Degree which had just 31 places for hundreds of applicants; I'm sure that the support and experiences I had at BC6F made it all possible."

Why I chose to come back to BC6F

My college experience initially began at another local college, the learning environment was wrong for me personally, so I decided to come back to BC6F. The main reason I thought BC6F was the right place for me was the fact that it was so close to where I live and I hadn't realised the impact of travelling daily for at least an hour and a half, which was not beneficial, as it was making me feel exhausted all the time, leaving me with no energy to do the abundance of independent study they gave me or to do the activities I enjoy. Moreover, the sheer size of a much bigger college was overwhelming to me. Despite the fact that I liked the social aspect of the college and being there was a good way to meet new people, the number of students at the college made it a very stressful place for me. BC6F's small size means class sizes are also small, which means that the teachers can offer every single student the support that is necessary for everyone to achieve their potential. In addition, BC6F offer amazing extracurricular enrichment programs which are available to all students, like Gold DofE, British Sign Language, being in the school production and the engineering Gold Award.

I started a much bigger 6th Form, but I came back to Bramcote for several reasons. The first reason is because it's a more comfortable environment for me. It's much smaller and that helps the classes be more suited to you as the teacher knows you and can help you better when needed. Another reason I came back was because I like the style of teaching at Bramcote; this is because the teaching style feels more interactive and that personally helps me link to a topic better. I also feel less anxious in this college because of the smaller size of it as a whole and I feel like there is a more personal support here too. Owen

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

Our advice to students at BC6F is to take advantage of every opportunity that comes their way.

This includes trips to London, Paris, Portugal and more are being planned. These trips can be course related, or a way of broadening horizons, or participating in career related workshops. We also enjoy great links with a variety of universities, including local universities such as the University of Nottingham and Nottingham Trent and De Montfort University, as well as (Newnham College and Peterhouse) Cambridge. BC6F students can also challenge themselves by completing Silver & Gold D of E, British Sign Languages classes and Mandarin lessons.

In addition to our own trips and university links, we have excellent links with industry, including Boots, Rolls Royce, Unilever and Experian, so students are ready for work, university and higher-level apprenticeships.

Extended Project Qualification (EPQ) is a 14-month independent qualification that is the equivalent of half an A Level. It is highly respected by both universities and employers as it gives students the opportunity to work independently on a topic of their choice. Students produce either a 5000-word dissertation or an artefact such as a model, a book, a website or a play. The possibilities of what the student can do during the course is entirely up to them as the course is completely independent, providing life skills such as organisation, research, planning and networking. Many students who have taken EPQ have ended up with a better offer from their first choice university as it is recognised as such a worthy qualification. Results at BC6F have been consistently outstanding.



Our minimum requirement for students to secure a place at BC6F is 5 GCSEs at Grade 5 or above (or the equivalent in Level 2 BTEC).

Some courses would require a Grade 6 or above at GCSE to secure a place, such as:

- ✓ Biology, Physics, Chemistry (Grade 6 +)
- ✓ Maths (Grade 7+)
- ✓ Further Maths (Grade 8+)
- ✓ MFL (Grade 7+)
- Psychology (5+ in Maths & English)
- ✓ Computer Science (Grade 7+)

Specific pre-requisites for courses will be outlined individual subject leaflets.


