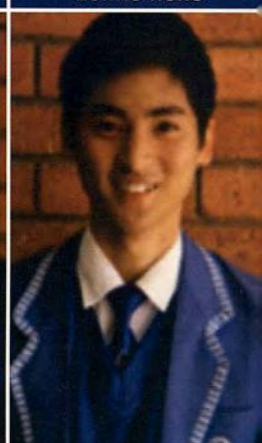

Well done to you all!

It's reassuring to see that, amid this flurry of activity, Mrs. Muller still found time to collect gowns and clothing for Nazareth House and Mrs. Byrne spearheaded stationery collection for the Alpha Day Care Centre in Diepsloot as well as the LIA's multiple donations of money they'd raised to various charities serving our greater community.

Mr. Malebana's Learner Driver initiative with the Department of Transport yielded immediate results and saw many of our children successfully passing their Learners' Licences on their first attempts. Pick n Pay's Road Safety day and School Club film shoot added some variation while Storm Fest reminded our neighbours, and greater Bryanston, what a well-located and ideal venue our school is for community events, an aspect of fundraising in which we'd like to see more growth in coming years. While on fundraising, kudos to the Debs and Squires for raising over 200k. Pupils recently visited distant Vietnam as part of the World Challenge, broadened their international horizons, and Daniela Gasser's triumph as Miss Teen Commonwealth sprinkled some glitz and glamour onto our lives.

There was also an element of very sad news with the passing of our Founding Principal Mr. Joel Alswang, and the sudden and tragic, too-soon, passing of a young matric lady, Megan Byrne.

As is always the case, there was a lot of "behind the scenes" activity, change and progress. The revamped old armoury is now a welcoming new location for the school shop and shortly our second-hand uniform shop will open to help alleviate some of the mounting financial pressure on families. The old boiler room was similarly gutted, revamped, and now hosts regular music lessons.

One of our quietest and most effective champions is Mrs. Knocker who, with her team, daily, progressively and ceaselessly enhances the beauty of our gardens. Thank you.

The GDE yet again changed the enrolment timetable for 2015 Grade 8s and sadly we once again saw evidence of how fearful Parents have become, finding it necessary to queue overnight to get into good schools like ours. If only one thing I say tonight gives you pause to consider our place in society, let it be this... what an incredible responsibility we bear in continuing to provide the best education we can. To deliver into society mature, educated, responsible and self-sufficient young adults, ready to study further or take up their places in the working world.

In order to deliver on this mandate, in such an inflationary environment with so many Parents struggling financially, budgeting has become even more important. And in this regard I want to say a huge "thank you" to Mrs. Peacock and Mr. Wrathall for their incredible efforts in preparing our budget for next year. This followed extensive consultation (and in some cases negotiation) with every member of staff responsible for a budget, subject, sport, activity or aspect of the school's smooth running and I am confident they have delivered an incredibly realistic and progressive budget for which I thank them effusively.

Our Governing Body and School Management Team met this year to refine and develop our longer term planning and the on-going implementation of plans already set in motion over the past years have seen a situation where maintenance and development take place smoothly and continually.

The fact that our fees are increasing by under 7% is itself testament to fiscal prudence, wise spending, and reaping the benefits of some tough decisions taken years ago. Well done and thank you to all involved.

While we're based in an ageing suburb where the number of potential pupils appears to have levelled-off, there is clear evidence of numerous cluster developments appearing in our immediate surrounds. If all goes well, these (and others to follow) will soon be filled with young families with children eager to get an excellent education right here in coming years. Our smallest Grade 12 group in many years matriculates shortly, and a larger group of Grade 8s join us to grow our numbers slightly.

I started by saying I always try to find a common thread that ties these bits and pieces together, and tonight I believe that word is "Pride". I am proud to be a Parent here and I am proud of the incredible amount of time, effort, energy and passion our staff put in to make it all work.

Mr Wilken for somehow finding the time and courage to deal with the challenge of Exemptions with Mrs Muller.

Mr Hillebrand for your burning passion and a determination we haven't seen in years, and for continually challenging the status quo.

Mr Dijkhuis for a welcome extra pair of hands and set of eyes on ensuring we aren't penny wise and pound foolish on maintenance, repairs and building.

Mr Tavener for your calm confident experience and advice after many years on governing bodies. While we're happy for your daughter finishing school, we're sad to lose you on our Governing Body.

Also leaving us now is Mr. Govender who unfortunately had to resign recently owing to increased work pressures, but nevertheless contributed greatly over the past years.

Mr Skelton, you've survived and thrived another year; Deputy and Vice Principals, well done on leading the way. To our SMT, HoDs, Grade Controllers, Teachers and every member of the Bryanston Team and Family - thank you. Our ongoing provision of a leadership and training coach is intended to see your leadership skills enhanced, developed

and trickled downward to all our staff in leadership positions.

And most importantly this evening is the biggest thank you of all to Mrs. de Villiers who just gets things done.

It is an honour and a privilege to be a part of this team and I am proud to say "my son goes to Bryanston High".

The day began with entertainment in the school hall where every country flaunted their various traditional dances. Soon after that, the various food stalls were flooded with eager students, teachers and even parents.

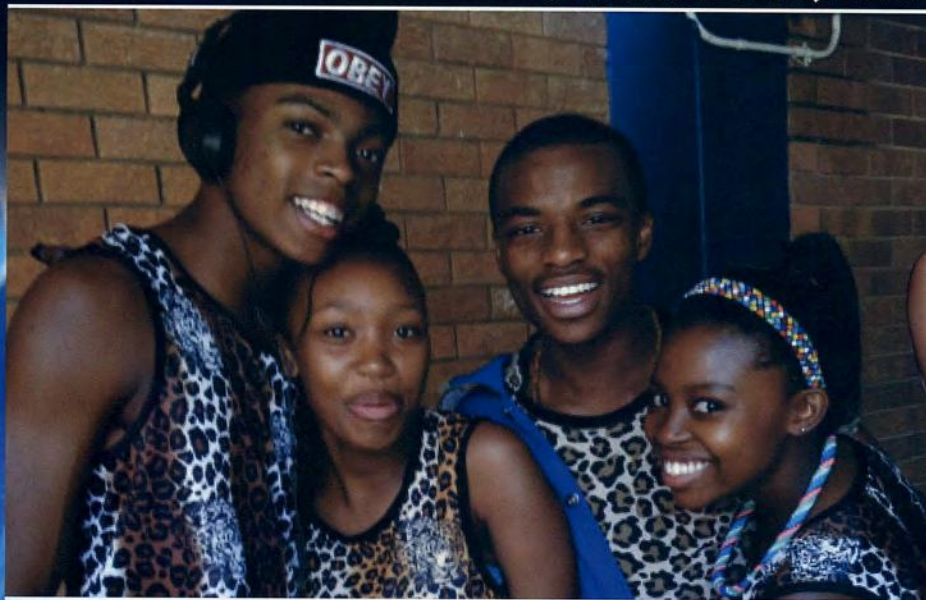

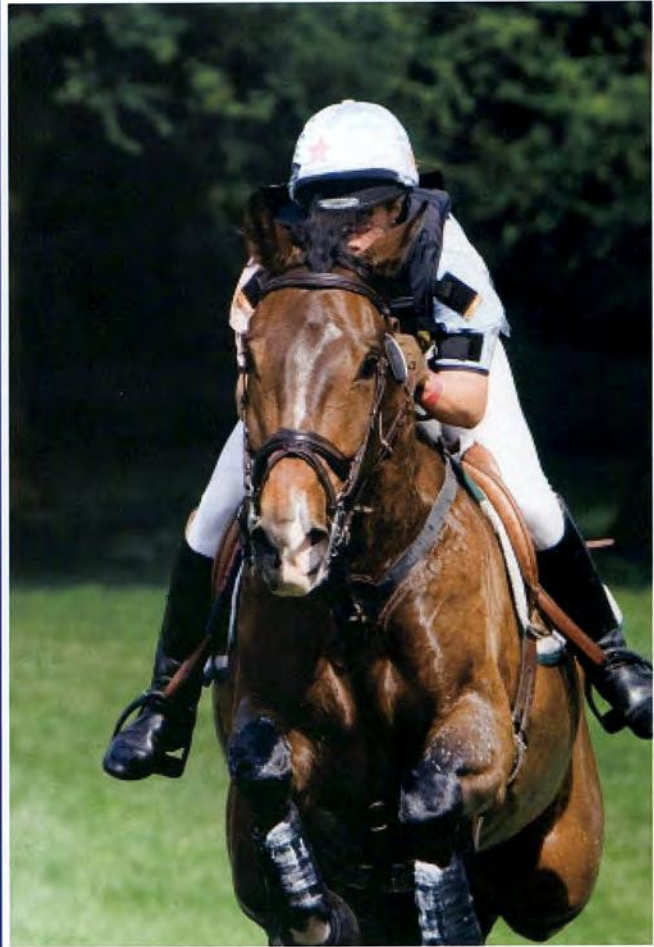
EQUESTRIAN

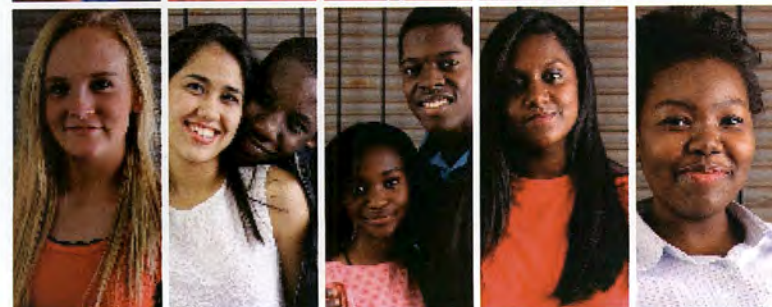

Well done to Apollo for winning the Inter-House Tournament and we hope that Neptune, Mercury and Jupiter will provide an exciting challenge next year.

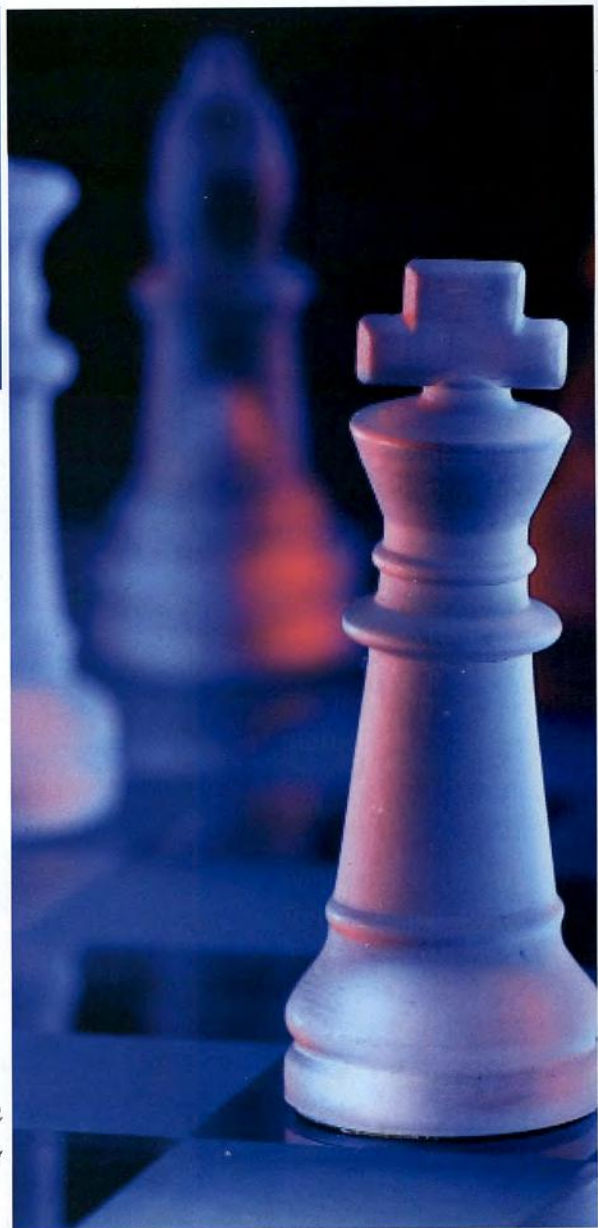

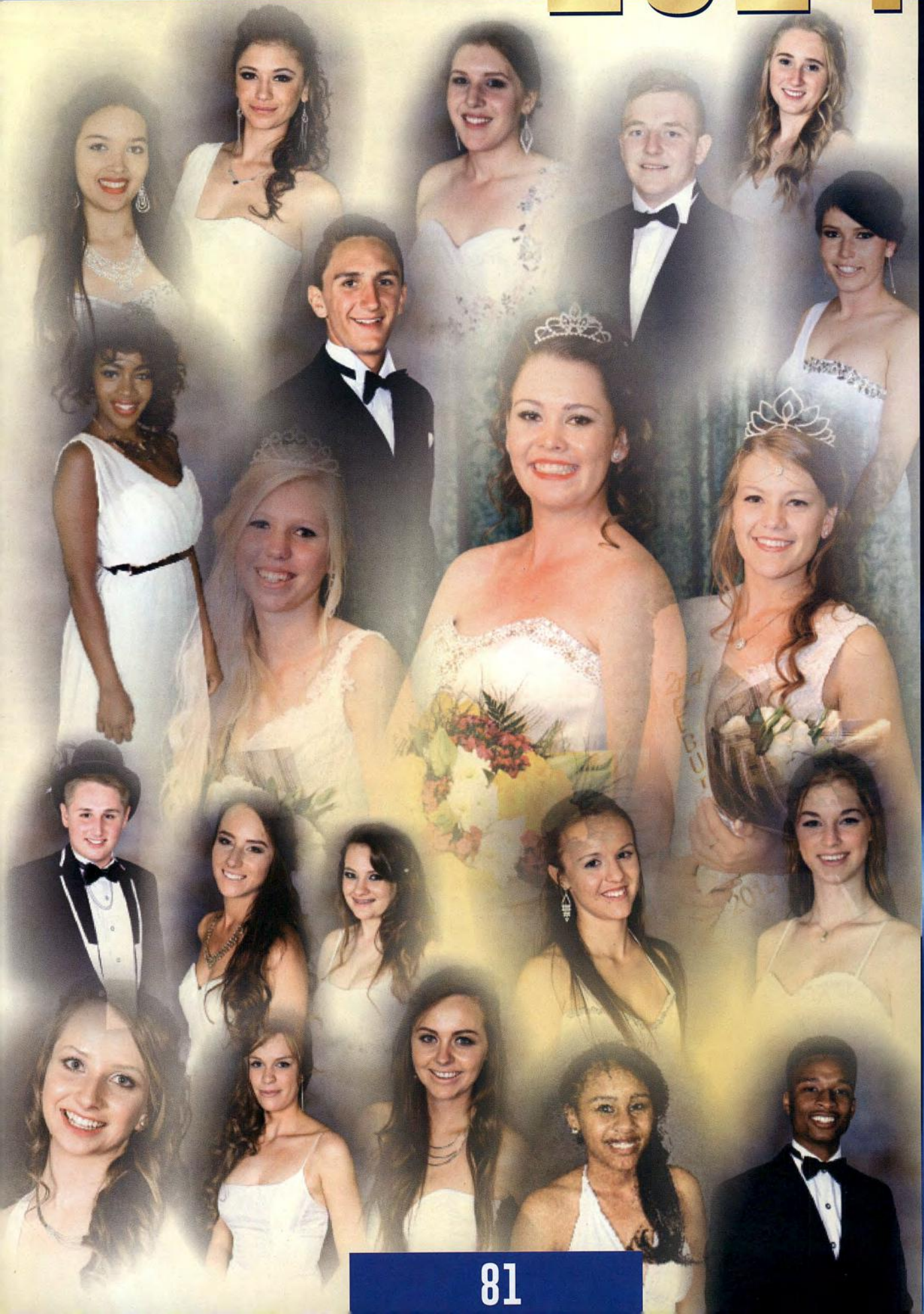

After having several near-death experiences on the roads of Vietnam, whose rules seem more like suggestions than actual laws, we made our way to one of several backpacker hotels that pride itself on its service. And it happened to have the most delicious tea, for free, in its lobby.

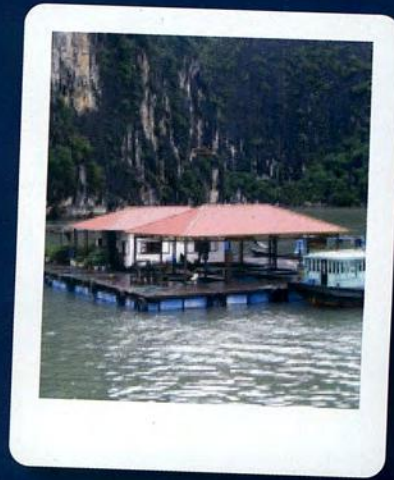
The next few days were about acclimatising to the country, getting to know our fellow expedition members and trying local delicacies.

We took a minibus trip to a place called Ba Vi. Keagan learnt why we purify our water (the hard way). We did our community work in a home for disabled orphans, war veterans and the elderly. We completed tasks such as nursing babies (as young as 2 months old), who had been abandoned, we painted walls (with frequent breaks at the instruction of one very commanding old lady) and gardened (which was quickly renamed "heavy labour farming".)

It was one of the most rewarding experiences of my life. It was heart-warming to see how a small gesture, such as a smile or a hug, could cause such joy and leave the disabled residents literally skipping away.

We stayed one night in Hanoi to recuperate after achieving some killer blisters from farming the land. Then we were off again to a place called Mai Chau where we completed a 3-day hike. We became more dependent on each other





than ever, and I doubled the size of my calf muscles going down into the valley. We saw breath-taking views and each night had different home hospitality in villages along the way. After the thirteen of us had had a turn to fall asleep in the hammocks of a local restaurant and had bartered with shopkeepers for intricate hand-made gifts and snacks, we left Mai Chau.

Once back in Hanoi, we visited a war prison. Our rest and relaxation phase took place in Ha Long Bay, where we spent the day on a boat. Because all of the known backpacker hotels in Ha Long were fully booked, we checked into a 4-star hotel called the Royal Lotus.

The trip was over too soon. But, the lessons we learnt were invaluable: actual cash-in-hand budgeting, converting between currencies and realising how lucky we are in our lives. We realized how able we are to help others. We witnessed another culture, had a taste of complete independence and gained a thousand new and irreplaceable memories. We also mastered the art of using chop-sticks and how to cross a road with "hectic" traffic.

I would like to thank everyone that made the trip possible: Mr Skelton, Miss Martin, Denine Van Heerden, Mignon du Preez (South African Women's Cricket captain), The current Lions Rugby team, Rivonia Barnyard Theatre, World Challenge and my fellow challengers - Dominic De Jager, Megan Denton, Keagan Hayman, Daniel, Bradley, Lia, Fat Matt, Mini Matt, Ivan, Meredith, Miss Rielley and Jim, who made this trip truly unforgettable. I met many people while travelling - I even encountered myself.

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ORIENTEERING AT BRYANSTON HIGH SCHOOL

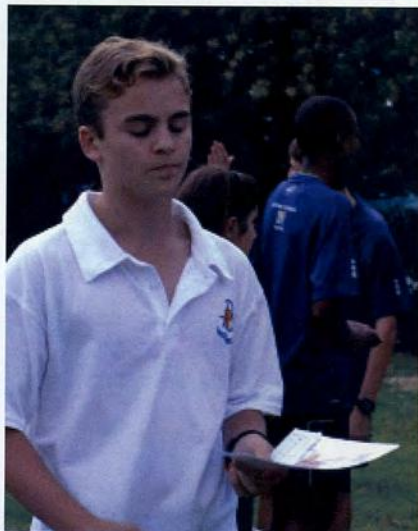
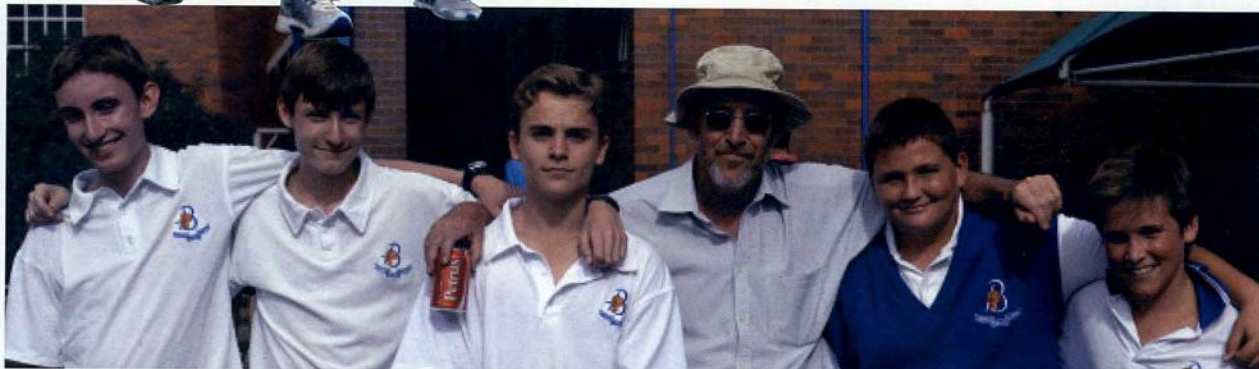
