Mr. Malebana's Learner Driver initiative with the Department of Transport vielded immediate results and saw many of our children successfully passing their Learners' Licences on their first attempts. There was also an element of very sad news with the passing of our Founding Principal Mr. Joel Alswang, and the sudden and tragic, too-soon, passing of a young matric lady, Megan Byrne.

As is always the case, there was a lot of "behind the scenes" activity, change and progress. The revamped old armoury is now a welcoming new location for the school shop and shortly our second-hand uniform shop will open to help alleviate some of the mounting financial pressure on families. The old boiler room was similarly gutted, revamped, and now hosts regular music lessons.

One of our quietest and most effective champions is Mrs Knocker who, with her team, daily, progressively and ceaselessly enhances the beauty of our gardens. Thank you.

The GDE yet again changed the enrolment timetable for 2015 Grade 8s and sadly we once again saw evidence of how fearful Parents have become, finding it necessary to queue overnight to get into good schools like ours. If only one thing I say tonight gives you pause to consider our place in society, let it be this ... what an incredible responsibility we bear in continuing to provide the best education we can. To deliver into society mature, educated, responsible and self-sufficient young adults, ready to study further or take up their places in the working world.

In order to deliver on this mandate, in such an inflationary environment with so many Parents struggling financially, budgeting has become even more important. And in this regard I want to say a huge "thank you" to Mrs. Peacock and Mr. Wrathall for their incredible efforts in preparing our budget for next year. This followed extensive consultation (and in some cases negotiation) with every member of staff responsible for a budget, subject, sport, activity or aspect of the school's smooth running and I am confident they have delivered an incredibly realistic and progressive budget for which I thank them effusively.

Our Governing Body and School Management Team met this year to refine and develop our longer term planning and the on-going implementation of plans already set in motion over the past years have seen a situation where maintenance and development take place smoothly and continually.

The fact that our fees are increasing by under 7% is itself testament to fiscal prudence, wise spending, and reaping the benefits of some tough decisions taken years ago. Well done and thank you to all involved.
















LEADERSHIP IN ACTION CARNIVAL DAY OWE VEERLY OWEN BOING

The day began with entertainment in the school hall where every country flaunted their various traditional dances. Soon after that, the various food stalls were flooded with eager students, teachers and even parents.


















SPURTS HULKE





With this knowledge they are able to help with minor injuries. When the injury is more serious they will contact professionals and request an ambulance.



WORLD CHALLENGE



Travel is like knowledge. The more you see, the more you know you haven't seen. On the 30th of June we, along with Reddam House Atlantic Seaboard and Bedfordview High, began a 16 day trip to Vietnam that would change our perspective on life and give us some new lifelong friends.

We landed in Hanoi and were immediately struck by the mercilessly hot and humid weather, which we only just got used to by the time we came back to SA. After having several near-death experiences on the roads of Vietnam, whose rules seem more like suggestions than actual laws, we made our way to one of several backpacker hotels that pride itself on its service. And it happened to have the most delicious tea, for free, in its lobby.

The next few days were about acclimatising to the country, getting to know our fellow expedition members and trying local delicacies.

We took a minibus trip to a place called Ba Vi. Keagan learnt why we purify our water (the hard way). We did our community work in a home for disabled orphans, war veterans and the elderly. We completed tasks such as nursing babies (as young as 2 months old), who had been abandoned, we painted walls (with frequent breaks at the instruction of one very commanding old lady) and gardened (which was quickly renamed "heavy labour farming".)

It was one of the most rewarding experiences of my life. It was heart-warming to see how a small gesture, such as a smile or a hug, could cause such joy and leave the disabled residents literally skipping away.

We stayed one night in Hanoi to recuperate after achieving some killer blisters from farming the land. Then we were off again to a place called Mai Chau where we completed a 3-day hike. We became more dependent on each other







than ever, and I doubled the size of my calf muscles going down into the valley. We saw breath-taking views and each night had different home hospitality in villages along the way. After the thirteen of us had had a turn to fall asleep in the hammocks of a local restaurant and had bartered with shopkeepers for intricate handmade gifts and snacks, we left Mai Chau.

Once back in Hanoi, we visited a war prison. Our rest and relaxation phase took place in Ha Long Bay, where we spent the day on a boat. Because all of the known backpacker hotels in Ha Long were fully booked, we checked into a 4-star hotel called the Royal Lotus.

The trip was over too soon. But, the lessons we learnt were invaluable: actual cash- in-hand budgeting, converting between currencies and realising how lucky we are in our lives. We realized how able we are to help others. We witnessed another culture, had a taste of complete independence and gained a thousand new and irreplaceable memories. We also mastered the art of using chop-sticks and how to cross a road with "hectic" traffic.

I would like to thank everyone that made the trip possible: Mr Skelton, Miss Martin, Denine Van Heerden, Mignon du Preez (South African Women's Cricket captain), The current Lions Rugby team, Rivonia Barnyard Theatre, World Challenge and my fellow challengers - Dominic De Jager, Megan Denton, Keagan Hayman, Daniel, Bradley, Lia, Fat Matt, Mini Matt, Ivan, Meredith, Miss Rielley and Jim, who made this trip truly unforgettable. my beautiful South Africa her colours now bright. Our rainbow nation and diverse land has been brought together.


