Extracurricular activities for classes 7-8P day-to-day

Parents

- must notify the team in the event of absence, by phone or text message
- can change their contract for the following month

Children

- can only leave the school grounds with the consent of their parents and the team
- must tell the extracurricular activities team if their curriculum changes (support, optional classes, school council, etc.)
- must eat their meal in the dining room
- can do their homework supervised by the educational team

The educational team

- trusts what the child says and encourages their independence
- must know where the child is
