# **Exodus 20:13 (NLT2)**

**13 “You must not murder.**

## **Deuteronomy 27:24-25 (TEV)**

**24 " 'God's curse on anyone who secretly commits murder.' " And all the people will answer, 'Amen!'** **25 " 'God's curse on anyone who accepts money to murder an innocent person.' " And all the people will answer, 'Amen!'**

## **Genesis 4:8, 11-13 (NLT2)\***

**<sup>8</sup> One day Cain suggested to his brother, “Let’s go out into the fields.” And while they were in the field, Cain attacked his brother, Abel, and killed him. <sup>11</sup> Now you are cursed and banished from the ground, which has swallowed your brother’s blood. <sup>12</sup> No longer will the ground yield good crops for you, no matter how hard you work! From now on you will be a homeless wanderer on the earth.” <sup>13</sup> Cain replied to אָדָם, “My punishment is too great for me to bear!**

## **Revelation 21:8 (NLT2)**

**8 “But cowards, unbelievers, the corrupt, murderers, the immoral, those who practice witchcraft, idol worshipers, and all liars—their fate is in the fiery lake of burning sulfur. This is the second death.”**

## Genesis 4:4-7 (TEV)\*

<sup>4</sup> Then Abel brought the first lamb born to one of his sheep, killed it, and gave the best parts of it as an offering. **YHWH** was pleased with Abel and his offering,  
<sup>5</sup> **but he rejected Cain and his offering.** Cain became **furious**, and he scowled in anger. <sup>6</sup> Then **YHWH** said to Cain, "**Why are you angry? Why that scowl on your face?**" <sup>7</sup> If you had done the right thing, you would be smiling; but because you have done evil, **sin is crouching at your door.** It wants to rule you, but **you must overcome it.**"

## **Ephesians 4:26-27 (TEV)**

**<sup>26</sup> If you become angry, do not let your anger lead you into sin, and do not stay angry all day. <sup>27</sup> Don't give the Devil a chance.**



## **1 John 3:12, 15 (TEV)**

**<sup>12</sup> We must not be like Cain; he belonged to the Evil One and murdered his own brother Abel. Why did Cain murder him? Because the things he himself did were wrong, and the things his brother did were right. <sup>15</sup> Those who hate others are murderers, and you know that murderers do not have eternal life in them.**

## **Matthew 5:21-22 (NLT2)**

<sup>21</sup> “You have heard that our ancestors were told, **‘You must not murder. If you commit murder, you are subject to judgment.’** <sup>22</sup> But I say, if you are even **angry with someone**, you are subject to judgment! **If you call someone an idiot**, you are in danger of being brought before the court. And if you **curse someone**, you are in danger of the fires of hell.

## **Matthew 5:43-45 (NLT2)**

<sup>43</sup> “You have heard the law that says, ‘Love your neighbor’ and hate your enemy. <sup>44</sup> **But I say, love your enemies! Pray for those who persecute you!** <sup>45</sup> **In that way, you will be acting as true children of your Father in heaven.** For he gives his sunlight to both the evil and the good, and he sends rain on the just and the unjust alike.

## Luke 10:30-32 (NLT2)\*

<sup>30</sup> **ግደግደ** replied with a story: “A **Jewish man** was traveling on a trip from Jerusalem to Jericho, and he was **attacked by bandits**. They stripped him of his clothes, beat him up, and **left him half dead beside the road**. <sup>31</sup> “By chance a **priest** came along. But when he saw the man lying there, he crossed to the other side of the road and **passed him by**. <sup>32</sup> A **Temple assistant** walked over and looked at him lying there, but he also **passed by on the other side**.

## **Luke 10:33-35 (NLT2)**

<sup>33</sup> “Then a **despised Samaritan** came along, and when he saw the man, he felt compassion for him. <sup>34</sup> Going over to him, the **Samaritan soothed his wounds** with olive oil and wine and bandaged them. Then he put the man on his own donkey and **took him to an inn, where he took care of him.** <sup>35</sup> The next day he handed the innkeeper two silver coins, telling him, ‘**Take care of this man. If his bill runs higher than this, I’ll pay you the next time I’m here.**’

## **1 John 4:11-13, 16 (NLT2)**

**<sup>11</sup> Dear friends, since God loved us that much, we surely ought to love each other. <sup>12</sup> No one has ever seen God. But if we love each other, God lives in us, and his love is brought to full expression in us.**

**<sup>13</sup> And God has given us his Spirit as proof that we live in him and he in us. <sup>16</sup> We know how much God loves us, and we have put our trust in his love. God is love, and all who live in love live in God, and God lives in them.**
