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
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Message from ACTING VICE-CHANCELLOR

Diverse study programmes

This was made possible through our FNU family of students and staff, and those who join our University will also be part of our mission to empower sustainability champions in our classrooms, homes and communities.

Our facilities

Students who join FNU will also enjoy the high-speed free WiFi available at all our campuses, digital infrastructure that is on par with universities in Australia and New Zealand, our support services and campus life activities, a digital library collection and the new Sports and Wellness Centre at our Nasinu Campus for those who live or study in the Central Division.

In addition to the Sports Complex, we have also invested in physical infrastructure such as a new home for the College of Business, Hospitality and Tourism Studies (CBHTS) and the recently-opened Naduna Campus in Labasa. Our new campus in the North is an exciting venture for the University as it provides a significantly enhanced learning and teaching environment for Vanua Levu students and enables FNU to expand its provision into new areas that meet local labour-market needs, such as catering and hospitality.

With this in mind, all our students can remain connected through the Fiji National University Students' Association (FNUSA) and its ten campusbased branch associations. FNUSA provides a range of cultural, social and sporting events to complement your studies, which gives students a holistic and enriching student experience while at FNU.





The Fiji National University (FNU) was established in 2010 with the objectives that it shall promote scholarships, research, free inquiry, academic excellence, and trade competence. Through this process, the institution would create, disseminate, maintain, and advance knowledge and productivity by teaching, training and other means, for the welfare and needs of the communities of Fiji and abroad. The University serves those who may wish to receive technical and vocational education and training and higher education that is consistent with international standards of teaching, research, and other academic activities in institutions styled as institutions of higher learning.

The functions of the University are:

- ► To provide for, and encourage the creation, advancement and dissemination of knowledge, through scholarship, research and teaching to the standards acceptable by the University Council.
- ➤ To provide courses of study or instruction, at the levels of achievement the Council considers appropriate, to meet the needs of the community, including technical and vocational education and training.
- ► To confer higher education awards and awards at other levels as determined by the Council.
- ➤ To provide, arrange for or regulate the appropriate training of persons or classes of persons, whether by way of apprenticeship or otherwise, to assist such persons or classes of persons in connection with employment.
- ► To assist and contribute towards the cost of training, and the promotion of training, of any person or class of persons.
- ➤ To participate in community discourse through the application of knowledge generated and advanced at the University to society, industry, and government in an environment where the rights of all are respected.
- ► To perform other functions given to the University under Section 6 (1)(a) to (g) of Fiji National University Act 2009.

A walk through time

Fiji National University has a long history of relevant education dating back to more than 130 years ago to the origins of its component Colleges. These were institutions were established according to national needs and aspirations over the decades.

1885 Fiji School of Medicine

The School of Medicine was originally established in 1885 as the Suva Medical School to train vaccinators. It has since developed into the premier medical institute of the South Pacific and continues to strive towards excellence in the training and education of health professionals in the region. The School, now one of five schools under the College of Medicine, Nursing and Health Sciences (CMNHS), provides training in most health science disciplines including medicine, dentistry, pharmacy, physiotherapy, radiography, laboratory technology, public health, dietetics and environmental health. New Postgraduate programmes has been developed to provide specialised training to local and regional health professionals.

1954 Fiji College of Agriculture

The Fiji College of Agriculture was established in 1954 to meet the human resource needs of the country in all areas of agriculture. The College has developed into the University's College of Agriculture, Fisheries and Forestry (CAFF) at the Koronivia Campus.





1893 School of Nursing

The School of Nursing is one of the oldest nursing education institutions in the Pacific and has been in existence since 1893. It is now part of CMNHS and offers programmes for local and regional students.



1963 Fiji Institute of Technology (FIT)

The former Fiji Institute of Technology (FIT) is now part of the FNU College of Engineering, Science and Technology (CEST) and is the University's Derrick Campus in Samabula, Suva. It was originally established in 1963 to train students in technical and vocational disciplines to meet the human resource needs of Fiji and the region in the fields of engineering, information technology and sciences.

FIT was also a starting point for the College of Business, Hospitality and Tourism Studies (CBHTS), which is now located at various centres, including the new Nadi Campus in the heart of Fiji's Tourism industry. The main administration centre of Fiji National University, including the hub of its extensive teacher training faculty, is located at Nasinu Campus. This was once Fiji's prestigious Queen Victoria School (known as "Vuli-Ni-Tu") in the early 1990s.

1973 Training and Productivity Authority of Fiji (TPAF)

The Training and Productivity Authority of Fiji (TPAF), formerly known as the Fiji National Training Council (FNTC), was established in 1973 by the Fiji National Training Act. TPAF became part of FNU in 2011 as the National Training and Productivity Centre [NTPC] to run the University's short courses that are designed to meet the local industries needs.



1907 Fiji College of Advanced Education

The Fiji College of Advanced Education established in Nasinu and the Lautoka Teachers College (LTC) has become part of the University's College of Humanities and Education (CHE). LTC is now FNU's Natabua Campus.



2010 Fiji National University

Formally established in 2010, FNU now has campuses at 10 locations throughout the country, running a total of more than 260 (exact number is 267) different programmes registered under Fiji Higher Education Council (FHEC) with a staff complement of more than 2000. As a new and dynamic institution, yet one with an illustrious history within its parts, FNU is daily developing, innovating, and expanding to provide Fiji and the region with the education and training that they most need.

Located at Kings Road, Valelevu. The Campus provides study programmes for the College of Business, Hospitality and Tourism Studies (CBHTS), College of Humanities and Education (CHE) and College of Engineering, Science and Technology (CEST).

Our Nasinu Campus is the main Campus of the University. It is home to the Vice-Chancellor's Office and most of the University's support services, such as the Human Resources Division, Finance and Capital Projects Division, and the Office of the Registrar's Academic or Student Services Office, plus the Division of Marketing and Communications amongst others.

The Campus is a hub for students as it is also home to the state-of-the-art Sports and Wellness Centre. It provides a safe environment for students to study, live and socialise. In addition to the modern lecture theatres and tutorial and teaching rooms, facilities on Campus include student accommodation, cafés, a gym, the Disability Centre, multipurpose courts and the UniClinic. The Campus is about a 15-minute drive to the Capital City and ten-minutes walking distance to supermarkets and other business houses in Valelevu, Nasinu.

Located along Ratu Mara Road, Samabula. The Campus provides programmes of studies for the College of Engineering, Science and Technology (CEST), College of Humanities and Education (CHE) and the National Training and Productivity Centre (NTPC).

Centrally located, our Derrick Campus in Samabula is a multidisciplinary environment for students studying engineering, science, or technology. The Campus has 44 classrooms, including drawing rooms, the main hall, 15 workshops, seven laboratories, and eight computer laboratories. This includes one computer laboratory for students to pursue self-study in their own time. Plans are underway for an integrated workshop and a 200-capacity computer laboratory to cater to the growing demand for laboratory spaces and PC terminals. About 2000 students are studying at the Campus in a wide range of programmes, from Certificate Level 3 to Master of Research and Doctor of Philosophy programmes.

The Campus also comprises of the Civil Engineering Lab Facilities, the Mechanical Engineering Laboratories, the Electrical & Electronics Engineering Laboratories, the Automotive Engineering Workshops and the Student Academic Services Team.

Located along Princess Road, on the hills of Tamavua. The Campus provides programmes of study in Health Sciences.

Our Public Health Campus is located in Tamavua along Princess Road. The Campus was the first medical School established in 1885 and now houses the School of Public Health and Primary Care, which offers programmes of study in health promotion, dietetics and nutrition, public and environmental health, to name a few, catering for 600 students. The Campus includes a number Ministry of Health facilities such as the Nuffield Clinic, Tamavua MCH Clinic, and is also a residential Campus with 58 beds.

In addition, facilities that enhance learning and teaching include the Postgraduate IT Lab, Environmental Health Lab, lecture rooms–Nutrition Hall, Nutrition Foyer and Research centres, Revitalization of Informal Settlements and their Environments (RISE) Lab.

Located at Koronivia along the Kings Highway. The Campus provides programmes of study for the College of Agriculture, Fisheries and Forestry (CAFF).

This College is committed to training in agriculture, fisheries and forestry, using modern techniques.

Initially established in 1954 to cater for only 50 students annually, the Campus has grown to cater for 1500 students undertaking highly sought-after programmes on offer. The Campus now boasts of lecture rooms ranging from 50 to 400 seating capacity, seven laboratories for different disciplines, nine tutorial rooms, and two teaching farms for livestock and crop production.

The Campus also houses the first-ever aquaponic system, combining fish and organic vegetable production. The programmes offered at this Campus range from Certificate Level 3 to PhD level, with sub-disciplines of soil science, biosystems engineering, animal science, crop science, crop and plant pathology, agribusiness, forestry, animal health and fisheries. All programmes provide sound theoretical and practical knowledge, and industrial attachment at the undergraduate levels.

Located next to the Votualevu roundabout, Nadi. The Campus is close to Nadi Airport, Fiji's main international airport. The Campus provides programmes of study for the College of Business, Hospitality and Tourism Studies (CBHTS), College of Engineering, Science and Technology (CEST), College of Humanities and Education (CHE) and National Training and Productivity Centre (NTPC).

Our Namaka Campus boasts a state-of-the-art lecture theatre, tutorial rooms that are mounted with top of the notch multi-media resources for quality lecture presentations, industry-standard production and pastry kitchens for culinary art enthusiasts, training restaurants for its hospitality and tourism training students, modern computer labs, and a library which is accessible for students to use seven (7) days a week.

The Campus hosted the first-ever Pacific Rim Challenge for chef's competition, which was done with the Fiji Chef's Association in 2010 / 2011. It also hosted the National Salon Culinaire for a number of years and the FNU Food Festival from 2012 to 2014, and there are plans to reignite these activities soon.

This Campus is also home to the FNU hangar for the Aircraft engineering programmes. At this Campus, you will be trained on complex aircraft systems and how to maintain avionics equipment and systems.

Located 6km away from Lautoka City. The Campus provides programmes of study for the College of Humanities and Education (CHE), College of Business, Hospitality and Tourism Studies (CBHTS) and College of Engineering, Science and Technology (CEST).

The Campus is renowned for its performances of choral music by the students. Previously home to the Lautoka Teachers College, the Natabua Campus has the most extensive lecture theatre in Fiji, with a seating capacity of 680 people. The theatre is appropriately named "Na WereLevu" (The Big House) and recognises the language of the traditional landowners of Lawaki.

The Campus provides an eventful environment for its students year-round with activities such as sports days and talent quests, environmental awareness weeks for the Go Green initiative with weekly clean-up campaigns, and the practice of social responsibility through its outreach activities, including community clean-ups and visiting the senior citizens and disabled.

The Campus has well-equipped teaching and learning spaces, including a modern Library, ITS Labs, Math Help Kiosk, Campus UniClinic, and a multi-purpose court on Campus. The Campus has its choir group, which actively participates in all College events. Trainee teachers in this group take time to sing to children at the Lautoka Hospital and the senior citizens at Golden Age Home. This prepares our aspiring teachers to better serve their community through continuous learning and development.



































Located at Natuyabia Road,

The Campus provides the study of programmes for the College of Humanities and Education (CHE), College of Business, Hospitality and Tourism Studies (CBHTS) and College of Engineering, Science and Technology (CEST) and National Training and Productivity Centre (NTPC).

To enhance learning and teaching facilities for students in the Northern Division, FNU recently opened its refurbished Naduna Campus to provide better TVET facilities and a holistic learning environment for students.

There are two sites that Labasa Campus is comprised of, one is located in Labasa Town and the other at Naduna. Located 10 minutes from Labasa Town, the Campus comprises of a Carpentry Workshop, Plumbing Workshop, Mechanical Workshop, Electrical Workshop, Training Kitchen, a Modern Library with collaborative learning spaces, Computer Labs, Classrooms, a Canteen and Central Academic and Administrative Offices.

Earlier this year, additional TVET courses from CBHTS were offered to students in the North, with plans to offer new courses from the College of Agriculture, Fisheries and Forestry (CAFF) and NTPC.



FMA has trained over 500 seafarers to comply with the Standards of Training, Certification and Watchkeeping [STCW] Manila Amendments. As the region's leading maritime training and education institution, the Campus has six simulators including two full mission bridge simulators and a full engine room simulator; and provides maritime education, short courses, and training for students. The Campus is located close to the National Stadium and National Gymnasium.

Currently, the Campus provides study programmes for those who wish to acquire theoretical expertise while also receiving practical training relevant to their programme of study.

Located at Queen Elizabeth Drive in Nasese. The Campus provides programmes of study for the College of Business, Hospitality and Tourism Studies (CBHTS).


The Nasese Campus was instituted in 1975 to meet the hotel and catering requirements of hotels and resorts in Fiji. The Campus has evolved to a modern setup and is fully equipped with ITS facilities (Internet, projectors with screens and PCs). It comprises six lecture rooms, one executive room, a fully-functional computer lab and library, and a training kitchen and restaurant. Students apply their theoretical knowledge during practical classes at the training kitchen & restaurant to perfect their skills and knowledge. The training restaurant is also open to the public and other corporate organisations for functions.

This helps students become industry-ready and helps increase their confidence when they graduate and enter the workforce. In addition, the number of programmes offered at Nasese Campus has evolved from Certificate to Bachelors programmes.






We are here to help!

A central place for you to access support services and resources to support your day-to-day well-being and find answers to your common queries.

Student Support Services such as Residential life, Student Health and Wellness, Career Services, Student Disability Services, Counselling and Uniclinic contribute to an exciting student experience at FNU. The Unit also conducts awareness activities on the FNU Child Protection Policy and Student Anti-Bullying, Harassment, Discrimination and Victimisation Policy. Students can also provide their feedback through the FNU Student Complaints Portal.

Students can also utilise the FNU Text Free platform on 857 for Vodafone/Ink users for admission, enrolment, examination queries and other academic services.

The University is dedicated to providing a complete learning environment for all of its students. The residential life programme at Fiji National University is likewise based on the notion that hostel living will give the students a unique opportunity to gain various experiences that will complement and supplement the formal classroom.









Secure, clean, and comfortable facilities are also necessary for the residential life programme.

COUNSELLING

Students will be given a secure, comfortable, and private setting where they can speak freely and be heard with compassion, respect, and understanding. This free walk-in service is provided at all three divisions (Central, Western and Northern).



UNICLINIC

Whilst students pursue their academic ambitions at the university, it is important that they maintain their health and well-being to avoid stress and other illnesses. Whether students feel unwell, need some medical advice or sexual health and/or general counselling, the physician and nurses at the University Clinic (UniClinic) are here to help you.

As a student at the Fiji National University, you are welcome to use the UniClinic as your primary health care facility for the duration of your time at the University.

We offer free doctor's consultations to all students. Apart from the dispensation of a few basic medications, all other medications will need to be purchased by you at an outside pharmacy. The UniClinic does not have laboratory or radiological services.

The UniClinic organises screening programs such as Wellness, HIV and STI Screenings and Breast and Cervical Cancer Screenings annually. The two University Clinics are located at the Nasinu and Natabua campuses.



CAREER SERVICES


Show employers you have what they are looking for!

The career and placement team provides the following services:

We are committed to creating an inclusive education system with hospitable, supportive, and empowering environment for students with special needs at the Fiji National University. The University has provisions for student to receive equal access, social inclusion, and appropriate accommodations for their academic endeavors We facilitate support services, making reasonable academic accommodations, raising awareness in the University community, and ensuring people with special needs are fully assisted in achieving their goals.

For students with exceptional needs, the Disability Centre advocates for equal access to learning. This entails creating a user-friendly environment with specially developed amenities to make learning more accessible.

The Disability Unit offers the following services:

- Pre-enrolment assistance and enrolment assistance;
- ► Note-taking services, academic helpers, and sign interpreters;
- When dealing with accessibility concerns, lecture and tutorial locations are moved;
- Access to assistive technology;
- ► Disability Sports & Wellness session;
- ► Consultation with academic personnel concerning acceptable accommodations and
- Consultation with students with disabilities to establish appropriate accommodations that meet their needs for integrated campus life activities.





LEARNING SUPPORT

The Centre for Learning and Teaching Enhancement (CLTE) offers the following services to support FNU students succeed in their academic endeavours.

Math Help Hub (MHH) - a service that offers students of various disciplines, mathematical and statistical support and advice.

English Language Hub (ELH) - a flexible tutoring service that includes workshops, open and free English as a Second Language (ESL) classes, and a variety of resources.

Peer Assisted Learning (PAL) - PAL provides free structured study sessions led by peer students (PAL Leaders), who have a strong academic record and have successfully finished the courses firsthand.

Learning to Learn Online (LTLO) - a free online course that introduces students to online learning and their role as online learners.

Guide to Effective Learning (GEL) – a collection of self-help guides designed to assist students make the most of their time at FNU and beyond. These guides provide useful ideas for improving academic and personal skills

FIRST YEAR EXPERIENCE

Succeed@FNU - an online course that assists students to assess their academic potential, familiarise themselves with FNU's requirements and regulations, become aware of the support networks available at FNU, and understand the value of self-care.

FYE Mobile APP – an app developed to help students get the most out of their first semester at FNU. The First Year Survival Guide is a comprehensive guide to practically everything a student needs to know about University and what to expect if they attend FNU.







FLEXIBLE AND E-LEARNING

FNU's online delivery of learning and teaching allows students to study at their own pace from home, work, or at any location convenient to the student. This is known as E-Learning and Flexible Learning. Through Moodle, FNU's official learning management system, the Centre for Flexible and E-Learning (CFEL) collaborates with the colleges to develop courses and programmes for Online and Blended (Online + Face-to-Face) modes of learning.

Flexibility is provided for the type of assessments taken and its completion timeline. Through Moodle, students will be able to access course materials, participate in discussion forums, communicate with teachers and classmates, submit assignments, and take online quizzes and exams. Students can also create and submit electronic portfolios for assessment via Mahara, as well as check their assignments electronically to assess for plagiarism and improve their writing via Turnitin.

Flexible and e-learning is a viable option for students who cannot be physically present on Campus or can only be present in a limited capacity. Contact **cfel@fnu.ac.fj** for more information.

NOQUBUDDY

The ITaukei word "noqu" means "mine." As a result, noquBuddy signifies "My Buddy." This programme is designed to help our local and international first-year undergraduate students adjust to FNU smoothly. This short-term programme runs from week one to week seven of the semester and allows first-year students (noquBuddy Mentees) to connect with a second-year or above full-time FNU student (noquBuddy Mentor). The mentors will assist the first-year students in adjusting to university life and successfully overcoming any obstacles in order to make their first-year university experience an amazing one.

FNU BURSARY SCHEME

The Fiji National University's Student Bursary Scheme provides financial assistance to local full-time private students who have enrolled into any undergraduate Bachelor's Degree programme or Postgraduate Studies programme at FNU in 2022/2023.

Who is eligible to apply?

Entry is open to all enrolled students at FNU who have paid the mandatory enrolment fees and enrolled in a bachelor's degree programme or a postgraduate programme with a full course load (60 credit points).

To be considered, the applicant must have applied to the Student Bursary Scheme and met the following conditions:

- ▶ Be a Fiji Citizen.
- ▶ Must be fully vaccinated (two doses).
- ► Must have obtained a high school passing mark (Year 13) and have a minimum of 60% pass in each subject aligned to the respective discipline.
- Continuing students to have obtained an average of B pass.
- ► Postgraduate students should have a minimum average GPA of 3.0 and above in their undergraduate degree programme.
- ► Must not receive any other scholarship at the time of application and during the study.
- ► Combined household salary of less than \$30,000.
- ► Applicant should not have any disciplinary cases.
- ▶ Applicant should not have any outstanding fees or fines.

SCHOLARSHIP VALUE

\$2000 Tuition Assistance

will be distributed in Semester 1 and Semester 2 to each student.



At Fiji National University, we recognise the importance of making high-quality education accessible to all. With this in mind, we provide the country's most affordable tuition fees and financial assistance to our students through scholarships and support packages. This enables our students to complete their studies effectively.



STUDENT FINANCIAL AID SCHEME

The FNU Council has a Student Financial Aid Scheme (SFAS) that supports the recruitment of quality performing students, to promote and reward academic excellence, and to allow students who are financially challenged but academically deserving to access higher education.

OPTIONS/ MODE OF PAYMENT

Flexible fee Payment Plan

FNU allows students to pay their tuition in whole or participate in a flexible fee payment plan with the University's Finance Office. Tuition payments may be postponed and divided into instalments to be paid on specified dates at the start of the semester, trimester, or quarter.

Payments must be made on time and in accordance with the University's payment agreement. The entire Payment Plan must be completed two weeks prior to the final exam. The obligation to make all payments under the Payment Plan does not necessarily end with the cancellation of registration.

The scholarship will be held by the student for a term of three years. To be eligible to continue to receive allocation in the second term, students must maintain a full course load, be enrolled and have an average of a B grade pass. The scholarship may be terminated if the student withdraws, has disciplinary issues, or does not meet the criteria.

The Office of Learning and Teaching is developing its objective to undertake staff and student mobility through various exchange opportunities available at the regional and international levels. OVERVIEW OF GRADUATION

The Office of the Registrar's Graduation Unit works closely with the Colleges to plan all graduation ceremonies.

Every year, Fiji National University organises two graduation ceremonies for students. The ceremonies are usually held in January and August. FNU's graduation celebrations are unique in that each College has its own ceremony, making each event personal and distinguished, as the graduates rightfully deserve.

LIBRARY

At Fiji National University, the library is an essential place for students to study. We give access to specialised student services and physical and virtual places for teaching, learning, and research within the University. We offer approaches to improve educational and research opportunities that support interaction with the University and the larger community. The FNU Libraries are made up of the Nasinu Campus Main Library and various College libraries across the nation. Through services, collections, and inter-library cooperation that enable access to information and knowledge. our library staff work whole-heartedly to give students, staff, and alumni exceptional support in locating and accessing resources.

FNU's libraries complement the University's curriculum, learning, teaching, and research needs by constantly expanding its collection and ensuring high-quality service delivery. To equip you with information literacy skills, the University conducts campus-wide training sessions on issues such as navigating e-databases, browsing and acquiring information, proper referencing to avoid plagiarism and the capacity to maintain communication.

Tutoring is also available in the library, as these are ideal spaces where students can receive peer support with their queries as it provides a calm and quiet environment that enhances their learning experience.

FNU libraries provide our on-campus and online students with a positive learning environment, which in turn enhances their overall student journey.

The College of Agriculture, Fisheries and Forestry (CAFF) is located at the Koronivia Campus and has plans to expand its programmes and facilities to the West and Vanua Levu in the near future. The College has two Schools and eight Departments, offering nine technical and vocational education and training (TVET) programmes, four bachelor, four Masters (coursework and research) programmes, and the Ph.D. in Agriculture, Fisheries and Forestry. The College is strongly engaged in community activities, including stakeholder contract research.

We currently have students from the Solomon Islands, Vanuatu, Papua New Guinea, Kiribati and Tuvalu undertaking our programmes. There is a plan to develop the College into a forestry training hub for the Region.

NOTABLE MENTIONS

The College produced the first Veterinary graduates in the South Pacific Islands in 2019, with most of them already engaged in the industry. Our Alumni, stretching to the Fiji College of Agriculture days, are contributing to the development of the primary industries in Fiji and across the South Pacific Islands.

We have staff and student exchange agreements with partner institutions such as the Hungarian University of Agriculture and Life Sciences; Charles Sturt University, Australia, and the Arava Centre, Israel. We are developing new agreements with other institutions. This provides our students a chance to explore a foreign educational system.

Post-COVID, the interest in the primary industries has increased and we are supporting local producers at the individual level to enhance productivity.

FMA is the country's only maritime training institution and welcomes local and regional students.

The major goal of FMA's programmes is to provide Preparatory Courses for Seafarers to qualify for the Maritime Safety Authority of Fiji's (MSAF) Certificate of Competency (COC) examination. FMA also conducts all mandotary safety courses for seafarers working onboard vessels.

The Academy develops programmes in accordance with the International Convention on Standards of Training, Certification, and Watchkeeping for Seafarers (STCW), as amended, and syllabi recommended by the International Maritime Organization (IMO) Model Courses in order to meet international standards in seafarer training.

The Academy awards students a Diploma in either Nautical Science or Marine Engineering. Graduates then pursue a career as a Deck Officer or Engineer, starting as Class III Watchkeeper. If students have seatime on a foreign-going vessel over 3000 GT for deck officer and a 750kw engine capacity for Engineers, they can progress to Class I Management Level.

National Apprenticeship Training Scheme



SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT GOALS (SDGS)



The Fiji National University (FNU) is committed to achieving the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals (UNDSDGs) through its learning, teaching and research.

The SDGs aim to address 17 key global issues that are interconnected, many of which are relevant to the core operations of the University.

SDG Goal 4, which highlights the need for quality education, also aligns with the instituition aim to be the premier national University providing quality and relevant higher education, technical and vocational education and training, research and development in Fiji.

As a testament to the University's commitment to Sustainability, FNU was ranked for the first time in the Times Higher Education (THE) 2022 Impact rankings that measure an institution's research, outreach, teaching and stewardship against the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). FNU was one of 1,525 institutions across 110 countries/regions worldwide to participate in the impact rankings for 2022. The Impact rankings measure how an institution's research, stewardship, outreach and teaching deliver against the UN SDGs – a blueprint to achieving a better and more sustainable future for all.

Below are several Goals achieved or addressed by FNU in various ways:



The Fiji National University's (FNU), College of Medicine, Nursing and Health Sciences' (CMNHS) conducted waste management, health, and sanitation training with selected villagers through the Watershed Interventions for Systems Health (WISH) Fiji project. A multi-sectoral project, WISH is the first of

its kind for Fiji, and is funded primarily by the Australian Department of

Foreign Affairs and Trade's Indo-Pacific Centre for Health Security. The funding was secured in 2018 by the University of Sydney, which has partnered with FNU in the delivery of this project. The three-day training at the Nataleira Eco Lodge consisted of about 70 participants from Matacula, Matacaucau, Navunisole, Nakorovou, Davetalevu, Nakalawaca and Deepwater settlements from the Namalata district.





Eleven students from Fiji National University's (FNU) Fiji Maritime Academy (FMA) have found employment with Swire Shipping Pte Ltd. Headquartered in Singapore with local branch offices in Suva and Lautoka, Swire Shipping is a leading provider of specialist customer solutions for a wide range of cargo and aims to provide a full suite of land and ocean solutions to its customers. The Fijian students were selected from a group of 16 candidates who had to undergo an assessment with the shipping company.

The Fiji National University (FNU) signed a Workplace Experience Programme Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the national airline carrier, Fiji Airways. The partnership paves the way for FNU students to undertake on-the-job training with Fiji's national carrier as per the university's curriculum requirements. The agreement is aligned towards the University's Pillar One Education for Employability as outlined in the FNU Strategic Plan 2021-2026.

Twelve students from the Fiji National University's (FNU) College of Medicine, Nursing and Health Sciences (CMNHS) were part of the Climate Change Simulation Conference in collaboration with the Association of Pacific Rim Universities (APRU). APRU is a non-profit network of about 60 universities in the Asia-Pacific, with the Secretariat based in Hong Kong. The APRU Student Global Climate

Change Simulation is a role-playing exercise in which students will form multi-country, multidisciplinary teams to play the role of delegates to the UN Climate Change Negotiations.

As Fiji's national university, FNU provides holistic and relevant learning, with programmes undergoing regular review in consultation with industry partners and international higher education institutions to ensure it meets local and global standards.





FNU promotes gender equality and inclusion in our learning and teaching and encourage more women to study and excel in science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM) and other traditionally male-dominated fields of work. One such avenue

of promoting this is through the University's National Apprenticeship Scheme under the National Training and Productivity entre (NTPC). Apprentice Afiel Alisha Khan is one such student challenging to break stereotypes and smash the glass ceiling. Khan works in a challenging environment that necessitates electrical skills as an Electrical Engineering (Fitter Mechanic) apprentice at Vatukoula Gold Mines Limited. According to the apprentice, women should not be afraid to apply for male-dominated jobs as times have changed and females have proven to be as capable as their male counterparts in all areas of work.







Fiji National University (FNU) alumna Cema Olimaipa Talei is passionate about safeguarding and preserving our planet for future generations, hence she is encouraging more individuals to take a proactive role in advocating and combatting the impacts of climate change. Talei, a Bachelor of Civil Engineering graduate was part of the Yadrava na Vanua team that won the Space for Planet Earth Challenge, receiving a \$42,000 grant to continue research on carbon sequestration – a process of capturing and storing atmospheric carbon dioxide that seeks to reduce the amount of carbon dioxide in the atmosphere. The goal of the Challenge was to use space technologies to find new and innovative solutions to address climate change issues in New Zealand, Australia, and the Pacific Islands.

FNU has also implemented various sustainability schemes to achieve its Environmental Sustainability objectives as part of the University Strategic Plan 2021-2026. The University has implemented the three Rs concept – reduce, reuse and recycling, to address its waste management process on campus. As the national institution, FNU strives to lead by example. This initiative is also aligned to our Sustainability Plan 2021-2026 and emphasises our commitment to this issue. We aim to incorporate greener measures in all aspects of our learning & teaching, and operations. Tree planting exercises were also held at various FNU campuses throughout the year.



There is a need to nurture more stewards who can protect and conserve the natural environment. These sentiments were expressed by the Fiji National University's (FNU) College of Agriculture and Fisheries and Forestry

(CAFF) PhD scholar, Tiraon Taioti. Taioti is pursuing his PhD studies after securing a scholarship under the Australian Centre for International Agricultural Research (ACIAR) Pacific Agriculture Scholarship and Support – Climate Change (PASS-CR) program. Taioti is currently pursuing research on the Contribution of Agroforestry Towards Rural Livelihoods and Forest Restoration, which is part of a project led by Professor Helen Wallace of Griffith University in Australia.





HIGHER DEGREES BY RESEARCH

Since research and innovation are critical to Fiji National University's (FNU's) aspirations in knowledge creation and knowledge exchange as a regionally relevant and globally competitive University, FNU has targeted research with real-world impact as a key pillar of the 2021-2026 FNU strategic plan.


SELF SERVICE DROP/WITHDRAW COURSE(S)



Quota based programmes are those where due to the nature of specialisation, limited places are available in a course or programme to accommodate the number of applicants. For such programmes, thenumber of admissions shall be controlled. This applies to College of Medicine, Nursing and Health Sciences programmes, Certificate IV in Aircraft Engineering (Avionics and

Mechanical Engineering), Diploma and Bachelor of Engineering (Honours) in the following majors: Civil, Electrical and Mechanical and Certificate III in Commercial Agriculture.
