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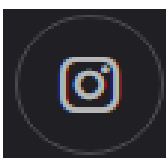
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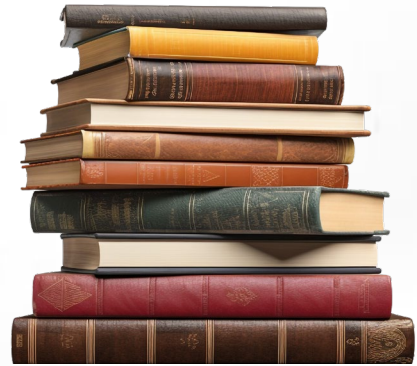
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The publishing industry has been around for thousands of years. There are different ways of getting the book you have written to the world for other to enjoy.

Let's take a look at the different forms of publishing. We will begin with the traditional publisher. What is traditional publishing? **A traditional publisher** (also known as a commercial or trade publisher) purchases the right to publish, distribute, and sell a manuscript (usually together with a bundle of other rights, known as subsidiary rights) on an exclusive basis. Large publishing houses and bigger independents pay an advance on royalties; small presses often don't. Traditional publishers are highly selective, publishing only a tiny percentage of manuscripts submitted.

There's no cost to the author with traditional publishing: publishers undertake the entire financial risk, handling every aspect of publication at their own expense. This investment is recouped from the sale of books to the public, and from the use and licensing of subsidiary rights. Traditional publishers are highly incentivized to invest significant resources in marketing and distribution support for the books they publish, in order to drive the sales that are their primary source of profit.

Who are the big traditional publishers? According to bookscoouter.com the big publishers include: Hachette Book Group, HarperCollins, Macmillan Publishers, Penguin Random House, and Simon & Schuster.



No doubt, if you are a person who likes to read, some, if not all, of these names are familiar. But, wait a minute, this is not all. These big publishers, have smaller publishing houses under their umbrella. Check these out:

Penguin Random House's current notable imprints:

- Knopf Doubleday- This imprint has multiple other imprints, as most within Penguin Random House. Knopf is known for publishing hardcover within all fiction and nonfiction genres, and the smaller imprints beneath Knopf itself are dedicated to genres from classics, to commercial fiction, to translation, and more.
- Crown Publishing- This imprint specializes in bestselling fiction and narrative nonfiction in categories including biography, science, history, politics, and so on. Fiction authors that have been published with this imprint include those of Gillian Flynn, Andy Weir, Ernest Cline, among many others.
- Viking Press- This imprint is dedicated to both fiction and nonfiction authors across all genres.

Simon & Schuster was founded in 1924. As of 2016, they were the third largest publisher in the United States.

Some of their notable imprints include (it is still too early to know the ins and outs of how PRH and S&S will be redesigned in terms of imprints and the merge):

- Howard Books- Publishing fiction across genres, as well as nonfiction including biography and memoir. They also publish Christian living, inspirational, and gift books.

- Scribner- Publishing fiction and nonfiction across genres. Stephen King is often published under Scribner. They have published authors such as Annie Proulx, Frank McCourt, Don DeLillo, and many others.

- Touchstone- Publishing fiction and nonfiction across genres.

Hatchette Livre was founded in 1826. The new merger was created officially in 1992.

Notable imprints:

- Grand Central Publishing- This imprint mainly focuses on fiction spanning from commercial to literary.

- Little, Brown and Company- All genres are published under this imprint.

- Mulholland Books- This is an imprint within the imprint of Little, Brown and Company. It is dedicated mainly to publishing mystery novels of all types.

HarperCollins was formed in 1989 through a multi-company merger.

Notable imprints:

AvonBooks- This imprint is dedicated to publishing romance of all kinds, including paranormal, erotica, fantasy, contemporary, and more.

- Harlequin Enterprises- Publishing mainly women's fiction and romance across all genres.

- Harper- Publishing fiction and nonfiction across all genres.

- William Morrow- Premier fiction and nonfiction publisher across genres.

McMillian Publishers was founded in 1843. The current embodiment of MacMillan was established in 2015 after company merges took place.

Notable imprints:

- Farrar, Straus and Giroux- Publishing fiction and nonfiction across genres, they also publish renowned poetry.

- Picador- Publishing literary fiction.

- Thomas Dunne Books- Publishing fiction and nonfiction across genres.

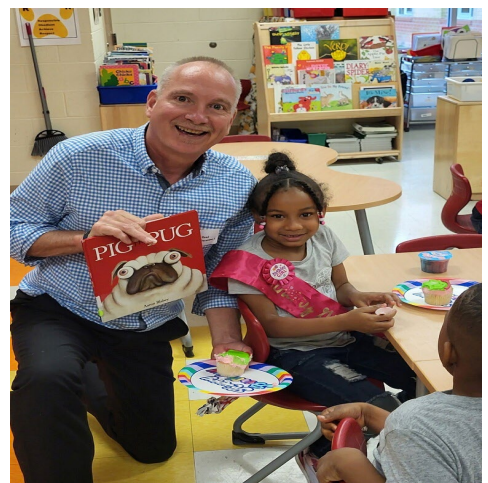


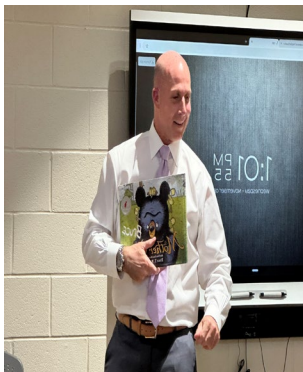

Women's History Month

In 1995 the Presidents of the United States of America began making annual proclamations declaring March as women's history month.

The origin of Women's History began in 1981 when Congress passed Pub. L. 97-28 authorizing and requesting the President to proclaim the week beginning March 7, 1982 as "Women's History Week."

L. 100-9 which designated the month of March 1987 as "Women's History Month" in 1987 after the National Women's History Project petitioned them. The way for a month-long celebration of women's history was further paved during the years of 1988-1994 as Congress passed additional resolutions authorizing the Presidents to make March Women's History Month.

The contributions and specific achievements women have made to the United States in a variety of fields during American history are celebrated during Women's History Month. International Women's Day is on Wednesday, March 8, 2024.

The theme for 2024 celebrates "Women Who Advocate for Equity, Diversity and Inclusion." Some key dates during Women's History month include:

- **International Women's Day** is celebrated on March 8, and was established as a holiday in 1911.

- **The first major march on Washington by suffragists happened on March 3, 1913.**

- **The National Woman's Party was formed in March 1917.** The group was dedicated to getting women the right to vote.

- Title IX was passed on March 1, 1972. In fact, the first-ever Women's History Week was created in order to bolster support for Title IX, which prohibited discrimination due to sex in federally funded education programs.

- **The Equal Rights Amendment was passed** in the Senate on March 22, 1972.

On March 8, 1857 in New York City, a group of women textile workers organized to protest unfair working conditions and unequal rights for women. This was one of the first organized strikes by working women with a result of a shorter workday and decent wages. This is the importance of March 8th.

Women have made countless contributions to American history. Just talk to older family members and you will learn things that aren't in the history books.

Did you know? Women's History Month began as a local celebration in Santa Rosa, California. The Education Task Force of the Sonoma County (California)

Commission on the Status of Women planned and executed a "Women's History Week" celebration in 1978. The organizers selected the week of March 8 to correspond with International Women's Day. The movement spread across the country as other communities initiated their own Women's History Week celebrations the following year.

In 1980, a consortium of women's groups and historians—led by the National Women's History Project (now the National Women's History Alliance)—successfully lobbied for national recognition. In February 1980, President Jimmy Carter issued the first Presidential Proclamation declaring the Week of March 8th 1980 as National Women's History Week.

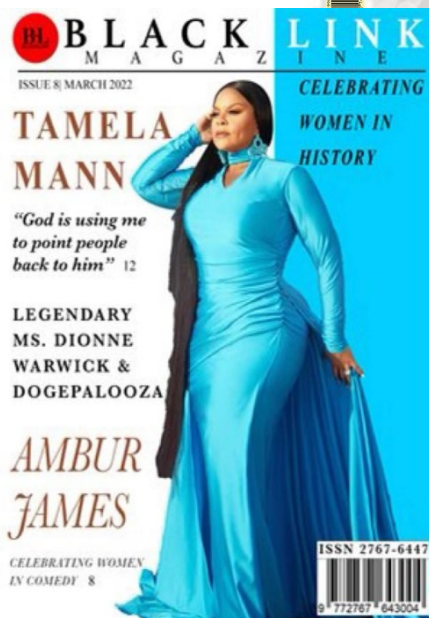
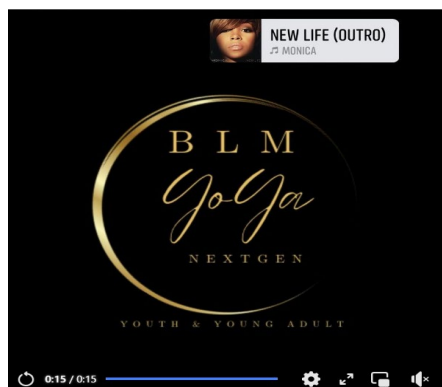

PARS has a vision to impact and improve the lives in the communities through empowerment of workshops, housing opportunities, budgeting, community development, workforce, and healthcare, to the undeserved urban residents in all communities with the Pee Dee region of South Carolina.

PARS began operating in 2021. The founder, Miriam James Singley saw a

need in the community and made it her mission to fulfill the missing services. During the year 2023 PARS donated backpacks filled with school supplies in multiple areas including Florence, Johnsonville, and Darlington. The organization is active in the community from decorating for the holidays, to participating in the annual Pecan Festival.

PARS is partnered with the city of Florence, SC through the Mayor's Youth Initiative. An air of collaboration among the partners (business leaders, educators, nonprofits, and more) is fostered to provide special events and service for the youth and their families in Florence.


The founder is determined to give clients life sustaining services. As such she is also partnered with and a resource for SC Thrive. This organization makes applying for state Medicaid, SNAP benefits and other assistive programs easy to do in one place. PARS can do these applications at their office without the client having to complete them on their own. They do not make the decision for the benefit; they only complete the application for the agency.

Through the Mayor's Youth Initiative, PARS has participated in the Annual

Youth Initiative Day held on July 8th at the Barnes Street Activity Center. The Pecan Festival, is a liaison to North Vista Elementary school, and so much more. The organization's introduction to the community was done on November 12, 2022. It was filled with local corporations, businesses, nonprofits, and people from the community. PARS used this Mix & Mingle as a fundraiser and has been going strong ever since. The list of clients that have been helped with housing, SNAP benefits, Medicaid, job connectivity and more continues to grow. Workshops on Budgeting, time management, self-sustainability, career planning and more are held on a monthly basis. PARS also supports other organizations who provide help to the community.

PARS is the parent company of MandD Unlimited. This is a case management company serving the community of those who receive Medicaid. The company will begin operating soon, so stay tuned.

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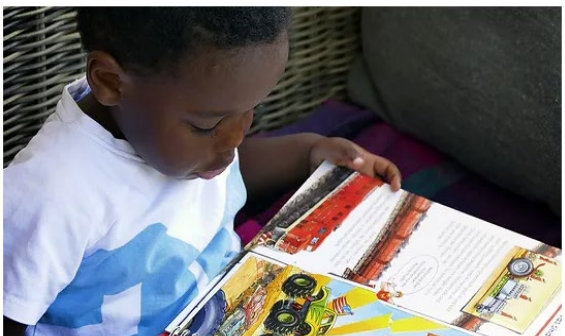
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There is a lot of talk about self-empowerment. So, what is it? Simply put, it is the intentional control of your life and destiny.

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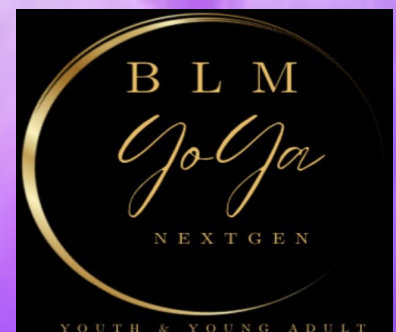
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
