EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE

March 12, 2023 • 19 Adar 5783

Dear Colleagues and Friends,

It has been pointed out to me that this will be my 22nd – and final – letter of greetings to you at the start of our annual conference. So what is sometimes a bit of a routine task takes on a bit more significance this year as I retire from my role as Executive Director.

What can I say that has not been said before? What words of guidance, encouragement and perhaps, even inspiration can I write in this space? How much more can I praise you, the Jewish educator working in the field, sometimes struggling, sometimes succeeding magnificently? How else can I let you know how much you are appreciated, even though it may not always feel that way? How else can I remind you that the Avodah, the work and the service of Jewish education is sacred work – God's work?

Our theme this year is Tradition, Transition and Change. Perhaps I can remind you of the old adage "the more things change, the more they stay the same." Like all of you, I am mindful of the enormous changes that are continuing to come to Jewish education. How we teach, when we teach, even who we teach are constantly evolving as our understand of how children learn, the use of technology and cultural norms continue to change. We struggle to keep up when, in fact, we should be the agents of change staying far ahead of the curve. It isn't easy.

Yet at the same time, we understand that good education, no matter what you call it, is still good education. Teaching substance in a manner that is thoughtful, engaging and that encourages intellectual exploration is good education – no matter what you call it. Personally connecting with students and families in a way that is impactful to their lives is still good education – no matter what you call it. Serving as a personal dugma – role model and promoting the joy of Jewish living and our special connection to Eretz Yisrael is still good education – no matter what you call it. In the military, they often use the term "assets in the field." You are our assets in the field facing the same challenges and fighting the same battles that have been fought for generations – how to bring the next generation closer to Judaism.

So my dear colleagues... So many of us are driven by our passion for our work and the importance of our cause. So many of us work far beyond our given hours and far beyond the contractual definitions of our jobs. I would never dissuade you from doing the most that you can and being the best that you can be. But I also share with you the words of Pirkei Avot that have become especially meaningful to me as I approach retirement:

ָלֹא עָלֶיךְ הַמְּלָאכָה לִגְּמֹר, וְלֹא אַחָּה בֶּן חוֹרִין לִבָּּטֵל מִפֶּוּה.

It is not your duty to complete the work, but neither are you free to desist from it.

By all means, tackle Jewish education with "all your heart, all your soul, and all your might." But !allow yourself the luxury of leaving something to do for those who will succeed us B'vracha.
