OUR CLASSES

Classes are available for students aged 4-Adult.

All of the classes at Rising Roots adhere to our philosophy.

YEAR LONG CLASSES

Year-long classes provide a comprehensive and in-depth exploration of the subject matter. These classes will run September – May. Sign ups close for year-long classes on August 14th.

F FLEX CLASSES

Flex classes run from September through May and are designed to be independent of each other. Unlike some other courses, they do not build upon themselves. This means that a student can join a flex class at any point in time, without any prior experience or knowledge beyond the class prerequisites. Students can take a flex class for just one semester or commit to the whole year, depending on their preferences and availability.

6162 SEMESTER CLASSES

Semester classes allow students to enroll in a wider variety of classes. The first semester runs from September to December, while the second semester spans January to May. During the traditional registration period in spring 2025, students may enroll in both Semester 1 and Semester 2 classes. Semester 1 classes are indicated with the S1 icon. Semester 2 classes are indicated with the S2 icon.

Alphabet Forest (52)

This class will teach kids the essentials and beyond about the software, hardware and computing packages at their fingertips on their personal computer. Students will bring their wi-fi enabled personal laptop to class, and each class will involve one-to-one instruction helping with their specific device. Please note, while tablets are also wonderful computing tools, they have limited functionality and frequently require app purchases or downloads to perform the same tasks as computers, often with logins required. For this reason, sending a child with a computer is strongly encouraged. This class is wellsuited to children bursting with their own strong ideas, opinions, and interests and desire to digitize their creativity as it will utilize project-based learning and focus on creating products.

No previous creative writing experience is needed, and if you're not sure if you're a writer, this is a great class for you to see what you can do and have fun with creative, supportive friends!

Note: This class is Fall 2025 only. It pairs well with Picture Books Illustrating with Procreate class (check the prerequisite) offered in Spring 2026. If you only want to do the writing, no problem—other student illustrators will work with your book manuscript in the Spring class.





Whether it's adopting a specific point of view, using imagery to convey emotion, or playing with structure, each week will offer new opportunities for creative exploration.


