### **Sharing the Hope of Jesus** in the Maritime Conference

As I observe the world around me, I notice an overwhelming sense of hopelessness. Inflation, crime, lack of love, injustice. It seems that from a world point of view, there is little hope anymore.

As God's people, we have been given a great work to accomplish. In **Matthew 28**, starting in verse 18 we were given instructions on how to provide *Hope* to the world around us.

<sup>18</sup> Jesus came and told his disciples, "I have been given all authority in Heaven and on earth. <sup>19</sup> Therefore, go and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit. <sup>20</sup> Teach these new disciples to obey all the commands I have given you. And be sure of this: I am with you always, even to the end of the age."

For the past several months, we have been co-partnering with Hope Channel Canada and Pentecost 2025 to create a spirit of evangelism within the Maritime Conference. Our goal is to make it possible for every church in the Maritime Conference to have the resources and funds so that each church can share the gospel of Jesus within each of their communities.

This past weekend, December 6th and 7th, we launched our Meet Hope initiative. It started on Friday night by having a season of prayer, which was led out by our Conference Prayer Coordinator, Erna McCann. We met on Zoom and spent time in a season of prayer, which was followed by a time of personal reflection. The time of reflection was a time for us to ask God to work in each of our personal lives. It was a time to invite the Holy Spirit to lead our Conference and also a time to listen to God speak to us. It was a time to ask for an outpouring of the Holy Spirit as it was on the day of Pentecost.

For Sabbath, Hope Channel Canada brought three Pastors to the Maritime Conference as we wanted all three of our provinces to feel a part of this Conference-wide initiative. Pastor Samuel Sinnanainar shared the message at the Charlottetown Church. Pastor Paul Antunes shared the message at the Moncton Church. Pastor Robert Zama was the presenter at the Halifax Church.

The Halifax Church provided a live feed for any of the churches that wanted to be part of the launching of Pentecost 2025. The three pastors from Hope Channel Canada presented a unified theme

that the world is in the midst of a storm, and Jesus is our only hope. It is up to us, as followers of Jesus, to present the solution to the world. All three shared that we must share with those around us the hope that Jesus brings.

On Sabbath afternoon, the team from Hope Channel Canada shared how our partnership will bring Hope to the Maritime Conference. They shared how the training resources, small group materials, and even full evangelistic series materials are being provided to the local churches of our Conference. Every church in our Conference will have these resources available for the evangelism that is going to be done in each of our local churches in 2025 and beyond.

In the Conference office, we have been praying daily for everyone who lives in the Maritimes that they will have a chance to *Meet Jesus, to Meet Hope*, and to have the opportunity to choose to be with Jesus throughout eternity. Please keep *Meet Hope* in your prayers.


#### Sandy Lake Academy Mission Trip
