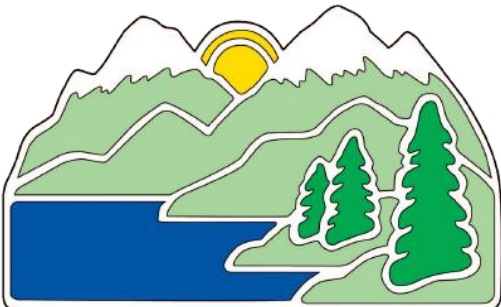


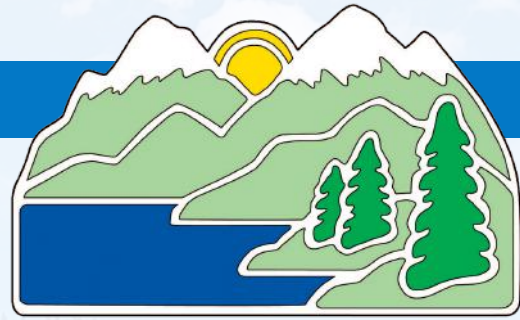

Online Registration Instructions

1. Visit tcpud.org/recreation-programs. Click **Sign Up Now!**
2. On desktop computers, click **Sign In** in the upper left corner to sign in or create an account.
On mobile devices, select **Sign In** in the upper right corner to sign in or create an account.
 - a. For questions on creating an account, please visit tcpud.org/registration for more information.
3. Register for activities:
 - a. Click on any of the category tabs or filter by keywords or activity names. You can also click on **Sign Up** in any of our Recreation Programs on our website.
 - b. Click on the program to view details and
 - i. Select Account Member (or members if enrolling multiple members for a program)
 - ii. Click **Add to Cart**
 - iii. Click **Close** to continue to register for other programs or **Checkout** to proceed with registration/payment
4. Once you hit **Checkout**:
 - a. Answer any prompts, if applicable, and click **Submit Responses**.
 - b. Acknowledge and sign TCPUD waivers and click **Confirm Waiver Agreement**.
 - c. Payment: You are able to add, edit, and remove programs and participants within your shopping cart. Click on **Continue to Payment** to enter billing information.
 - d. You can also click on **Catalog** or **Browse Catalog** to register for more programs before payment.
 - e. Select **Continue to Payment** to enter and process payment. Please be aware of our refund and cancellation policies.

NOTE: Activities with special registration guidelines are noted with  in the activity descriptions of this guide.

Resident and Non Resident Rates

Resident Rate applies to customers who live and/or own property in the Tahoe City Public Utility District water & sewer service area. Residents within the service area receive reduced rates for many of our recreation fees, as a portion of their property taxes are used to support TCPUD parks and recreation services. If you feel you may qualify as Resident, please email us (recreation@tcpud.org) with proof of your physical address (i.e. valid driver's license, TCPUD Utility Bill) showing a physical address within the district and the registrant's name.

Waiting List

- If a program is full and a waitlist is available, you will have the option to enroll your child(ren) on the waiting list. If space becomes available, you will receive an email stating availability in the program, program details and a link to sign up for the available spot. Please note, the link is only available for 24 hours.

Scholarships: 

The Youth Scholarship Fund was developed by TCPUD Parks & Recreation Department to assist local youth in accessing sports and activity programming. Funds are available to youth ages 17 years and younger.

To be considered, a Scholarship Application must be submitted. Applications are available by emailing recreation@tcpud.org or calling (530) 583-3440. All information is confidential.

Refunds & Cancellations: 


TCPUD reserves the right to cancel any activity. If TCPUD cancels an activity, a full refund will be issued. If a participant cancels at least 5 working days before the activity start date, 80 percent will be refunded. No refunds, will be issued if a participant cancels within 4 working days before the activity start date, or fails to attend an activity or class.

Air Quality Monitoring 

We continually monitor air quality conditions in the event of nearby fires affecting our area. If we need to cancel any outdoor programs or camps due to poor air quality, we will communicate closures as soon as possible for Camp Skylandia, golf, and sailing programs. Investing in a Healthy Mountain Community

In 2026, TCPUD is investing approximately **\$45 million** to improve our water, sewer, and parks & recreation infrastructure. Read about some of our key projects below.



Dianne Feinstein West Shore Tahoe Trail Reconstruction Project

TCPUD is investing \$3.5 million to reconstruct 1.4 miles of trail between Sunnyside and 64-Acres. Originally built in the 1970s, the West Shore Trail has benefited from TCPUD's regular maintenance, but after nearly 50 years, full reconstruction is necessary. This is the third year of a multi-year investment to reconstruct approximately 6 miles of the North Shore Trail and West Shore Trail.

In 2026, we will:

- Pulverize and repave approximately 80% of this trail section.
- Widen the trail to nine feet where feasible.
- Add a new flashing crossing at Granlibakken Road.
- Add new signage, striping, railings, slope adjustments, and other safety enhancements.

Tahoe Cedars Water System Reconstruction Project

Rebuilding the Tahoe Cedars Water System is the largest capital investment in District history. The existing water system, first built over 60 years ago is actively failing.

This multi-year project will:

- Replace 15 miles of undersized and failing water mains with new streetside water mains and service laterals.
- Install 144 fire hydrants across the system, including additional hydrants in areas that previously lacked coverage.
- Install over 1,200 residential water meters.

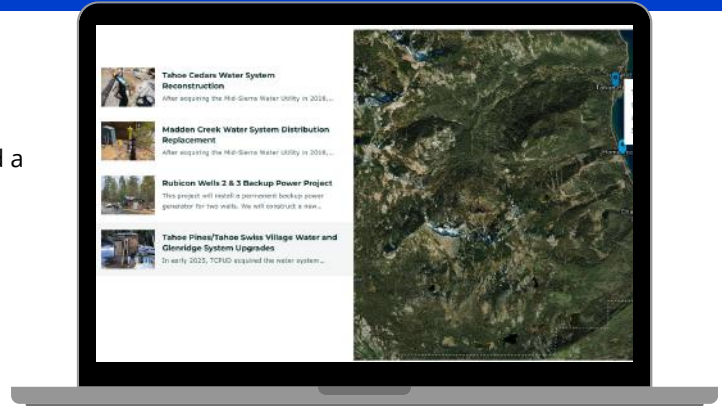
TCPUD expects to begin construction of Phase 1 of this project in Summer 2026, with subsequent phases planned through 2031. This investment strengthens drinking water reliability and significantly increases fire suppression capacity for the community. Learn more at tcpud.org/TahoeCedars.

TCPUD Secures Local and Federal Funding

Tahoe City Public Utility District has secured \$3.15 million in federal funding to complete the final phase of the Madden Creek Water System Reconstruction Project.

The funding includes a \$1.9 million grant from the US Forest Service through the Lake Tahoe Restoration Act in addition to \$1.25 million in funding allocated in the Federal budget by both Congressman Kevin Kiley and Senator Alex Padilla.




In addition, TCPUD received a generous \$1.5 million grant from the TOT-TBID Dollars at Work Program to support the 2026 Dianne Feinstein West Shore Tahoe Trail Reconstruction Project.

Help Make Water Conservation a Tahoe Way of Life



Did you know? Most of the water provided by TCPUD comes from deep groundwater wells throughout Tahoe City and the West Shore. These wells supply a network of storage tanks to supply our community with clean, high-quality Tahoe Tap that consistently meets all drinking water standards without significant treatment.

So don't take our groundwater for 'granite.' Help conserve it! Here are three easy ways to help protect this vital resource:

-  Water wisely and go native – Use native plants in your landscape. They look great and require far less water and fertilizer.
-  Turn off the tap while brushing your teeth or shaving, and avoid running water while waiting for it to get cold. Keep a pitcher of cold water in the fridge instead.
-  Check faucets, fixtures, and toilets for leaks and repair them promptly. You can also upgrade to high-efficiency fixtures. TCPUD offers rebates on water-saving household items.

Important 2026 Camp Information

- Camp Skylandia Summer Program 2026 Dates are June 22 through August 14.
- **You must register your child according to the grade they will enter in the 2026-27 school year. Grade adjustments may not be made after registration. Age verification may be required to ensure age of participant.**
- Payment & Registration must be completed online before attending Camp Skylandia.
- Parents must complete an updated Emergency Contact Form before the start of the camper's session.
- There is no Camp on Friday, July 3rd for the 4th of July Holiday.
- New, this summer are our Camp Skylandia Movie Nights aka "Parents' Night Out" evenings and are scheduled for Thursday July 9 and Thursday July 30 (Sessions C and F). These evenings are in lieu of our past camp overnights and are optional for Pinecones (aka Kinders), grades 1-6, and CITs. There is no camp on Fridays after the Camp Movie Nights.
- Parent Information Letters will be emailed each week prior to the start of each camp session.

- **Camp Skylandia; Grades 1st - Counselor In Training (CIT)**
 - Drop-off (9am-9:30am) and Pick-up (3pm-3:30pm) your child at Skylandia Park, corner of Lake Forest Road and Aspen Street.
- **Camp Sky Lil' Pines; Seedlings & Pinecones**
 - Drop-off (9am-9:30am) and Pick-up (3pm-3:30pm; 12:00pm-12:30pm for Seedlings Half-Day Option) your child at Tahoe City Community Center (TCCC), 401 W. Lake Blvd.
- Please let camp staff know ahead of time if persons other than yourself are picking up or dropping off.
- Campers, must bring with you daily:
 - Personal Water Bottle
 - Sunscreen
 - Closed-toe Shoes
 - Water Shoes for water play
 - Bathing Suit & Towel
 - Hearty Lunch with Snacks.

Located within a large lakefront grass and sand area, there are group picnic sites and children's playgrounds. The park also has a group barbecue area that can accommodate up to 75 people. Adjacent to that is an amphitheater that will seat another 65. Each of these areas is available for private rental along with many other outdoor venues maintained by the Tahoe City PUD.



Fairway Community Center

330 Fairway Drive | Rental Hours: Daily, 8am-10pm

From the "Lakeview Room" to the "Fireside Room" to the "Tessie Room," the Fairway Community Center is perfect for both your small meetings and your large banquets. This center accommodates up to 223 people and includes a large banquet/meeting room adjacent to a large kitchen, and a large room with a hardwood dance floor. The pleasant "Lakeview Room" has a view of Tahoe City's natural surroundings and is an excellent spot for parties and receptions with a capacity up to 91 people. The downstairs "Tessie Room" has 1,500 square feet of hardwood floor, and is an excellent spot for dancing and movement classes.



Kilner Park

HWY 89 & Ward Ave. | Rental Hours: Daily, 8am-10pm | Tennis/Pickleball Courts: 8am-8pm

Lace up your tennis shoes and take your kids to this woodland playground! Looking to pick up that tennis or pickle ball racquet, swing from monkey rings, or enjoy a picnic? Then head to Kilner Park - the 7-acre park adjacent to the west shore bike trail. The park also has a group barbeque area that can accommodate up to 75 people. *Mondays, Wednesdays, Fridays: 9am - 12pm, reserved for drop-in Pickleball during the summer season.*



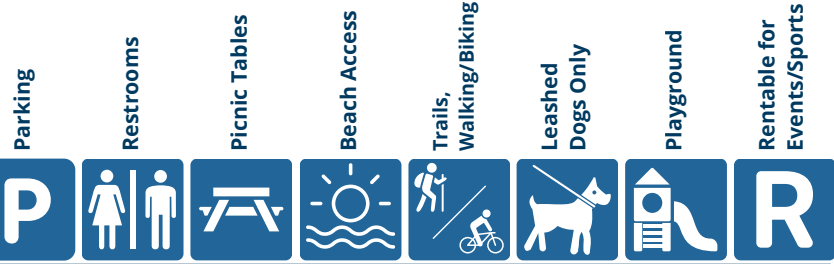
Skylandia Park

Lake Forest Boat Ramp

The TCPUD is excited to offer the Lake Forest Boat Ramp for launching in Lake Tahoe. The facility is located 1.5 miles east of Tahoe City off Highway 28 on Lake Forest Road and offers limited day use parking and restrooms. You can also enjoy a picnic area, playground, and small beach area at the adjacent Tahoe State Recreation Area (Pomin Park).

The boat ramp can be very busy at times during the summer boating season. Prepare before you launch and practice good etiquette to ensure a quick and efficient launch. Always recreate responsibly to protect yourself, others, and the outdoors.

Boat Launch Operational Policies

- Parking is very limited/No overnight parking allowed
- Open year-round with seasonal changes in hours of operation
 - January 2 - April 30; Inspections Available:
 - 8:00am - 6:00pm, Daily
 - May 1 - May 26; Sealed Boats Only; No Decontaminations:
 - 6:00am - 7:00pm, Daily
 - May 27 - September 5; Sealed Boats Only:
 - Monday - Thursday 6:00am - 7:00pm
 - Friday - Sunday 6:00am - 8:00pm
 - September 6 - September 30; Sealed Boats Only:
 - 6:00am - 7:00pm, Daily
- Boaters must abide by all posted entry and inspection guidelines, payment processing, launching and facility rules and exiting processes
- If your boat is NOT sealed you will NOT be permitted to launch. TRPA boat inspection appointments can be made online at tahoeboatinspections.com
- Mandatory Motorized Watercraft Inspections Required per TRPA

All watercraft and gear must be Clean, Drained, and Dry before and after launching to prevent the spread of aquatic invasive species. Paddlers, kayakers, anglers, and other beachgoers are encouraged to become Tahoe Keepers to help protect our watershed.

Motorized

All motorized watercraft must be inspected prior to launching to prevent the spread of aquatic invasive species. This includes boats, jet skis, eFoils, eSUPs, and all other watercraft with electric or gas motors. Visit

MULTI-USE TRAIL SYSTEM

The perfect way to tour the North and West Shore of Lake Tahoe is using our 23-mile multi-use trail network. Along the way you may find bicyclists, joggers, strollers, and even anglers enjoying the views. Parking for use of the trails is available at 64-Acres Park. Motor vehicles are strictly prohibited on the trails except for authorized maintenance. Please watch for maintenance workers and equipment. We request all trail users to be tolerant and respectful of everyone's mutual right to use these trails.

Rules of the Trail:

Please help to increase everyone's enjoyment of the trails by observing the Rules of the Trail:

- Keep right, pass on left when safe.
- Blaze a trail of kindness.
- Alert when passing.
- Use safe speeds.
- Always use a light at night.
- Look and listen, be respectful.
- Speed limit is 15 mph.
- Class 1 and 2 E-bikes permitted.
- Bikes yield to pedestrians.
- Keep dogs on a short leash.
- Yield to oncoming traffic.

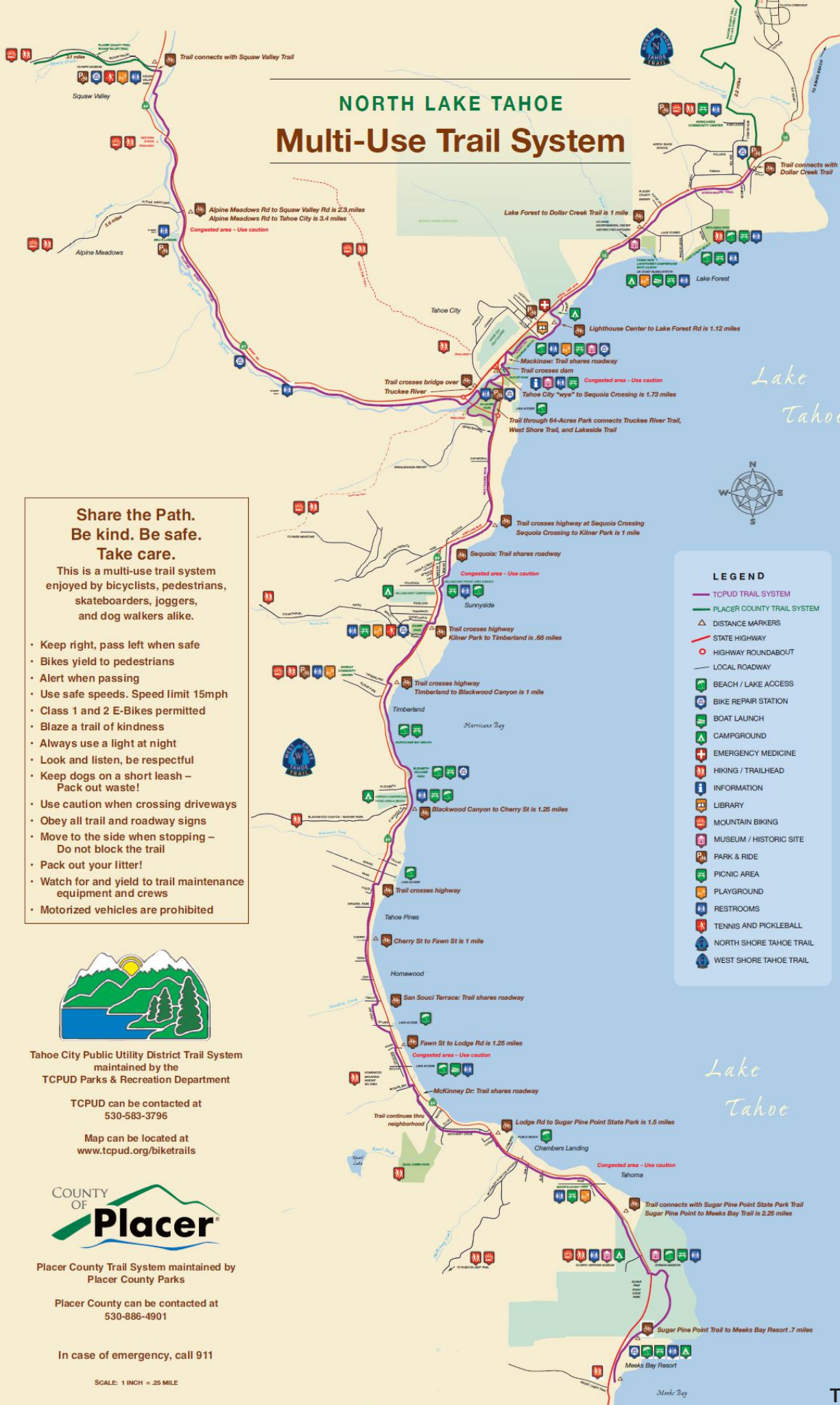

- Obey all trail and roadway signs
- Move to the side when stopping – Do not block the trail
- Pack out your litter!
- Watch for and yield to trail maintenance equipment and crews
- Motorized vehicles are prohibited
