NATTA SECURES GILSTON INFRASTRUCTURE CONTRACT



CGI of the Newly Proposed Gilston Development

Natta is delighted to share a major milestone in its continued growth, having been appointed by the Places for People (PfP) and Barratt Redrow Joint Venture as the Main Contractor for the delivery of key infrastructure works at the Gilston Park Estate development.

This scheme, known as Central Stort Crossing North (1a and 2a), forms part of the wider **Gilston Park Estate** – one of the UK's most ambitious new communities. The project will support the delivery of up to 8,500 new homes, including a significant proportion of affordable housing, alongside extensive green infrastructure, schools, leisure facilities and community spaces. Thoughtfully arranged across six villages, it's connected by expansive green spaces and 15 kilometres of new walking and cycling routes, reinforcing a strong commitment to sustainability, biodiversity and long-term community wellbeing.

The prestigious project represents a significant step forward in shaping the future of the area and reinforces our position as a trusted delivery partner for complex infrastructure schemes.

Natta's scope of works comprises a comprehensive infrastructure package, including temporary works, bulk earthworks, ground improvement, embankment construction, sewer installations and associated services infrastructure. The project also incorporates footpaths, cycleways and wider connectivity measures designed to support sustainable transport and accessibility across the site.

This appointment represents a significant achievement for Natta, marking the company's largest single contract award to date. It further strengthens our position as a trusted delivery partner for complex,

large-scale infrastructure schemes and reflects our ongoing commitment to quality, collaboration and programme certainty.

We look forward to working in partnership with the Places for People and Barratt Redrow JV and the wider project team to deliver the infrastructure that will support a thriving, connected and sustainable new community at Gilston.

About the Joint Venture

Places for People (PfP) and Barratt Redrow have established a landmark joint venture to deliver one of the UK's most ambitious new community developments in East Hertfordshire. The partnership brings together PfP's experience as a master developer with a strong social purpose, alongside Barratt Redrow's scale and expertise as the UK's leading housebuilder.

Through a coordinated, infrastructure-led approach, the joint venture will deliver up to 8,500 new homes across a network of walkable, interconnected villages, alongside green spaces, community facilities and employment opportunities. The partnership is designed to accelerate delivery while ensuring long-term stewardship, social value and the creation of a sustainable, inclusive place for generations to come.

Looking Ahead

As the project progresses, we look forward to delivering essential **infrastructure** that will support a connected and thriving new community at Gilston.

BUILDING CARE HOMES THAT SUPPORT COMMUNITIES - EPPING IN FOCUS

Throughout the start of the year, Natta has made strong progress on a number of exciting care home developments across the Home Counties. In Sittingbourne, we are delivering a new senior living care home for The Graham Care Group, acting as the main contractor and carrying out the full design and build process. Alongside this, we continue our successful partnership with them in Chelmsford, Essex, where we are undertaking the complete construction package for Broomfield House, a 99-bed care home, also on a design and build basis.

New Contract – Epping Care Home

We are highlighting our Epping Care Home Project in Woodford Green. Here, Natta has been appointed as the main contractor for **Morrison Community Care Group**. The development will deliver a new three-storey, 120-bed care home, complete with a reinforced concrete basement.

Works on site are advancing steadily. Following the demolition of the existing buildings, construction is now well underway, with concrete blinding installed around the basement footprint and further excavation works completed to form the basement structure. Steel fixers have begun setting up internal walls for the lift cores, while preparations are ongoing for the next phase, including excavation for the pile mat ahead of installing ground beams and pile caps. The project also includes the construction of a new car park ramp and associated site infrastructure, forming a key part of the overall development.

Breaking Ground Ceremony

In April, we held a Breaking Ground Ceremony. To mark this milestone, our project team came together with the client and project partners to celebrate the successful start of construction.

This tradition commemorates the start of construction on site. Historically, it involves key partners gathering on site to break the ground, often with a shovel. The ceremony represents momentum, commitment, and the transition from planning to delivery. It also highlights the collaboration between the client, contractor, and wider project team.

It often helps to build excitement and anticipation within the community for what will be delivered.

MASTER DEVELOPER DELIVERY IN ACTION - MOWBRAY DEVELOPMENT

Mowbray Development, North Horsham

We are delighted to announce that Natta has won 2 new contracts at the **Mowbray Development** in North Horsham. These comprise the Bailey Road Extension Scheme and the build of the Mowbray Community Centre. Here, Natta is working as the main contractor for Master Developer, **Legal and General**. The Community Centre project will see us undertake the full design and build of an 8,000 sq. ft, purpose-built facility that will serve as a central hub for the growing local community.

The works comprise the construction of a new-build community facility designed to support a wide range of recreational and social activities. The development includes a main sports hall with associated changing facilities, a secondary multi-purpose hall, a library area, social breakout spaces, kitchen facilities, and administrative/support offices.

Externally, the building has been designed to achieve a contemporary yet rustic appearance through the use of Dakota brickwork as the primary façade material, complemented by fibre-reinforced cement weatherboarding to the front entrance gable ends and dormer roof elements.

Bailey Road Extension

Over at Bailey Road, the project will deliver approximately 400 metres of a new S38 road extension, forming a key piece of local infrastructure. Extensive bulk earthworks will be undertaken, including the relocation of existing stockpiles and the backfilling of an on-site pond to prepare the ground for development. In addition, an off-line bus turning circle will be introduced to improve public transport accessibility and operational efficiency.

A major engineering component of the scheme is the construction of two large precast concrete (PCC) box culverts, designed to manage water flow and improve resilience across the site. Sustainable drainage is further enhanced through the creation of two new SuDS basins, helping to control runoff while supporting environmental goals. The scheme also prioritises active travel, with the addition of a new footway and cycleway link to better connect the surrounding area. The project will be completed with a programme of landscaping and planting, ensuring the development integrates thoughtfully with its environment. We are proud to play a key role in bringing this important development to life.

Previous work at North Horsham for Legal and General

Natta delivered the essential **infrastructure** for the **North Horsham development**. Our work included extensive Section 278 highway improvements, with the standout elements being the construction of a major roundabout and significant upgrades to the junction at Ruser Road and the A264. In addition to the highway upgrades, a major feature of this project was the installation of a 52-metre Vierendeel-style footbridge. These enhancements played a vital role in the primary access corridor, improving connectivity to and from the large-scale development site. We were also appointed to undertake the East-West Greenspace. This included the creation of a significant area of public open space, designed to include play parks, paths, pedestrian bridges, open watercourses and hard and soft landscaping.

We have established ourselves as a trusted **civil engineering** contractor, delivering technically demanding infrastructure and substructure solutions throughout the South of England and the Home Counties. Our expertise spans diverse sectors, including residential and commercial developments, to highways, utilities, renewable energy and external works, providing clients with a full-service civil engineering capability and a “can-do” attitude that delivers on time and to specification.

Natta's services include roads and infrastructure construction, Section 278 highways and drainage, reinforced concrete and retaining structures, utility coordination and service diversions, flood prevention and SuDS (sustainable drainage systems), and temporary works design and earthworks management.

Daedalus Waterfront

Earlier this year, we were awarded a new contract for Patron Daedalus Ltd supported by Homes England in Daedalus, Lee-on-the-Solent.

As the Main Contractor, we are carrying out enabling works to support the development phases at Daedalus Waterfront, including constructing new bellmouths, new HV electric feed substations and drainage connections. We look forward to seeing the project progress and the positive impact it will bring to the area.

Stanway Spine Road, Colchester

Strong progress continues at our Stanway project in Colchester, where Natta has been appointed as the main contractor by **Mersea Homes** Ltd to deliver a new roundabout and spine road.

Recent photos capture the completion of surfacing works on the southern approaches to the new roundabout, marking a key milestone within the Section 278 works. Street lighting installation and footpath construction are now well underway, and the utilities contractor continues essential diversion works.

Along the spine road, we are focusing on the installation of the foul and storm drainage. On site, we have also set up a sustainable compound in which our **Solar PV**, **Battery Storage** and wind turbine systems power our welfare facilities.

HEALTH AND SAFETY

RIDDORS AND SITE AUDITS

One of the most important indicators of performance across our operations is the number of incidents recorded on our sites. This includes accidents, near-misses and service strikes. With over 2,334,417 hours worked without a reportable accident, this reflects a strong and consistent commitment to safe working practices across all sites. Maintaining this standard remains a key priority in everything we deliver.

A continued focus area is working safely around underground and overhead services. The risks associated with service strikes are well understood, including electric shock, burns, fire and explosion. In addition to these safety risks, such incidents can also have significant financial and reputational implications. This is particularly relevant when working around services sometimes perceived as lower risk, such as telecommunications cables.

All services are treated with the same level of care and diligence. Preventing service strikes protects not only those on site, but also the integrity of projects, our client confidence and long-term delivery performance. Every incident, regardless of scale, is taken seriously.

The identification and reporting of near-misses remains a key part of the company's proactive safety approach. These events provide valuable opportunities to identify hazards early and implement effective control measures before more serious issues arise. Capturing and learning from these insights supports continuous improvement across all projects.

Regular site audits continue to play an essential role in maintaining high standards. Each site typically undergoes two audits per month, covering safety, health, environmental and quality performance to ensure compliance and consistency.

This year, also an increased focus on the use of **FONN**, our project management software, ensuring that all required documentation is completed, securely stored and aligned with certification and accreditation requirements. Consistent application of this system supports transparency, traceability and compliance across all operations.

In addition, Contracts Manager Katherine Matthews has developed updated Safe Systems of Work. This includes a newly revised format for Risk Assessments and Method Statements (RAMS). From April 2026, all newly produced RAMS will follow this format, with compliance monitored through site audits.

The ongoing commitment to safe working practices remains central to delivering reliable, high-quality outcomes. A culture of openness and accountability is encouraged, ensuring that any concerns are addressed promptly and effectively.

Ultimately, maintaining safe environments across all projects ensures that work is delivered responsibly, protecting people, assets and the wider community.

NATTA JOINS SUNFLOWER SCHEME - HIDDEN DISABILITIES

We are committed to supporting greater awareness, understanding, and inclusion for individuals with hidden disabilities. Natta is an equal opportunity **employer**. We have developed a culture in which all groups and individuals engaged with or affected by the business are treated with the highest standards of integrity. We recognise the importance of creating environments where everyone feels respected, valued, and able to thrive. As part of this commitment, we are pleased to have joined the **Hidden Disabilities Sunflower Scheme**, which supports individuals with hidden disabilities. This approach aligns closely with its recognition through **Investors In People**, which Natta is already a part of and has been recognised with a Silver Award.

Hidden disabilities can include neurodevelopmental conditions such as autism, ADHD, and tourette's, and cognitive impairments such as dyslexia. Physical conditions can also be non-visible, including Ehlers-Danlos Syndrome (EDS), fibromyalgia, migraines, menopause, PoTS, and diabetes. These conditions are not obvious, so individuals may appear outwardly fine while still facing real challenges with concentration, communication, energy levels, or sensory overload, which is why awareness and understanding are so important in workplaces.

Construction environments can heighten these challenges. Busy sites often involve high noise levels, time pressures, and complex instructions, which can feel overwhelming. Natta recognises this and remains committed to supporting staff in ways that help them succeed.

What the Hidden Disabilities Sunflower Scheme?

The Hidden Disabilities Sunflower is a globally recognised symbol that discreetly indicates that someone has a non-visible disability and may require additional time, patience or support in a public and workplace setting. Typically worn as a lanyard or badge, it signals that the wearer may have a non-visible disability and may benefit from additional support, time, or understanding.

Organisations train their staff to recognise the widely recognised Sunflower symbol and provide appropriate support. It helps create a culture where people feel safe expressing their needs without a detailed explanation. By supporting the sunflower, we are taking a step towards removing barriers and fostering a more inclusive and compassionate culture for all.

Our Scope of Work

As part of the community project, we carried out the **groundworks** to support the future site improvements.

Work began by reducing the dig area in preparation for the workshop foundations, followed by excavating a pit and pouring a concrete slab to form the base for a new shed.

The team then cleared the surrounding area before installing the steel columns and beams to support the sleeper wall compost area. Holes were also excavated for the retaining wall posts.

In addition, they levelled and filled the ground to create a new maintenance bay. This prepared the site for the installation of a future polytunnel.

In total, the team worked 144 hours on the project, with labour, fuel and materials donated in kind, with a value of £5,417.92.
