Branching Out – trees for today and tomorrow

More than 80 street trees will be planted in Winchelsea this year as part of a project helping to create a greener, cooler place to live.

Council is partnering with community groups including Growing Winchelsea in the first stage of a shire-wide Branching Out project funded through the 2024-25 budget.

A further 80 trees will be planted in Deans Marsh this year.

Planting in Winchelsea is expected to start late winter / early spring and is being guided by Growing Winchelsea's Arboretum Trail sub-committee concept plan.

Work in Deans Marsh is guided by planning initiated by Deans Marsh Streetscaping Group.

The Winchelsea plantings will be carried out in addition to the Winchelsea Greening and Stormwater Treatment Project, where stormwater will be used for passive irrigation of about 30 trees in selected residential streets.

The shire-wide Branching Out project is planned to run across six years, subject to future funding, resulting in about 1200 new street trees being planted in towns across the municipality.

Branching Out will also provide:


- · Compiling of a list of preferred tree species for towns, to ensure the right trees are planted in the right places; and
- Canopy cover, heat map and socio-economic data assessments to help determine future priority planting areas.

Exciting New Men's Shed Opens in Moriac

The township of Moriac is excited as it welcomes a new Men's Shed, designed to offer a space for men of all ages to gather, share skills, and build lasting friendships. This initiative, driven by the Moriac Community Network is to cater for social interaction for men, personal growth and it marks a significant milestone for the district of Moriac.

Located in the heart of Moriac, the new Men's Shed is part of the old CFA facility which the Moriac Community Network decided to repurpose after the CFA moved into new premises. Shed members have equipped the Shed with tools and resources for woodworking, metalworking from generous donations from other Men's Sheds in the region and many local private donors.

So far, the shed has concentrated on obtaining project material and making the donated machinery safe to work with. A vast amount of high-grade pallet wood has been recycled in the Shed from the Rokewood Wind farm. These are not your regular pallets they are some 4.5 metres long and 2.5 metres wide.

The Men's Shed at Moriac will follow in the steps of the Men's Shed Movement where it is more than just a workshop; it is a sanctuary for those seeking companionship and a sense of purpose. With a focus on mental health and well-being, the shed offers a safe space for men to talk, share their experiences, and support each other through life's challenges. Coffee mornings and BBQs have been organised to foster a sense of community and as a chance to welcome new members.

Members can not only enhance their practical skills but also contribute to community projects, such as building garden furniture, small wooden projects, gardening, and repairing items for those in need in the district.

The establishment of the Men's Shed in Moriac has been made possible through the generous support of the Surf Coast Shire, Bendigo Bank, government grants and local volunteers. The Moriac Community Network committee has driven the shed project over a period of 2 years to get it where it is today. It is now the desire of the community to have a Women's Shed that will share the meeting room area of the facility. Art classes have already started and proving popular with the ladies.

As the Men's Shed opens its doors, it invites all men in Moriac and the surrounding areas to become a part of this vibrant community. Whether you are looking to learn new skills, make new friends, or simply enjoy a cuppa with mates, the Men's Shed is the place to be.

The shed is open every Wednesday and Saturday from 9am to 12 noon.

The Climate Report

Victoria releases its blueprint for a secure and sustainable energy future

(from the Climate Media Centre)

The Victorian Government has released its first big plan for getting more of the state's energy from renewable sources like wind and solar. The Victorian Transmission Plan (VTP) – currently in draft form and open for public consultation – is VicGrid's long-term strategy to make sure the right infrastructure is in the right place at the right time. It's an essential plan as dirty, unreliable, costly coalfired power stations close down and more renewable power is needed to keep electricity affordable, reliable, secure and sustainable for everyone.

The plan identifies seven proposed regions (collectively covering 7 percent of the state) most suitable for new onshore wind, solar farm and battery storage development over the next 15 years known as Renewable Energy Zones (REZs). VTP gives investors

certainty while balancing considerations such as the impact on local communities, landholders and First Nations peoples.

These are the draft REZs prepared for public consultation:

- · Central Highlands
- · Central North
- Gippsland (This refers to the onshore Gippsland REZ, which is separate from the Gippsland Shoreline REZ)
- North West
- South West
- · Grampians Wimmera
- · Wimmera Southern Mallee

VTP also includes a separate proposed Gippsland Shoreline REZ, specifically designed to host onshore connection infrastructure for offshore wind generation.

Experts Comment:

Greg Bourne, Climate Councillor and energy expert;

"Renewable energy zones are key to building out the critical connections between projects and transmission infrastructure across the state. Australia is in the midst of modernising its grid, and these zones will be vital to keeping the lights on as our ageing coal-fired power stations retire.

"Victoria knows it has some of the highest energy prices in the country and is proactively looking to remedy this through deep electrification efforts to upgrade its electricity system, boost the state's renewable generation and capacity, and improve energy efficiency.

"These initiatives will see more Victorian homes and businesses benefit from more affordable, reliable, and cleaner renewable energy from the sun and wind, backed by storage. Community investment into these zones also deliver lasting benefits like good jobs and upgrades to essential infrastructure and services in communities."

Andrew Bray, National Director RE-Alliance:

"The release of the Victorian Transmission Plan finally gives Victorians some welcome certainty but the key will be engagement. This plan needs to be well communicated so communities understand how energy projects can be rolled out in the places they live."

Stephanie Bashir, Principal Nexa Advisory;

"Victorians deserve clean, cheap energy – and renewable developers are lining up to build it. There is over 16GW pipeline of proposed onshore wind and solar projects, as well as 5 GW of proposed battery projects – and that's not even including the various offshore wind development projects that have received feasibility licences.

"But none of it will happen without an overarching plan and clear planning approval processes for transmission and renewable projects from the Victorian Government. These will be crucial to ensuring reliability after the closure of Yallourn coal fire power station.

"Victoria has seen ongoing transmission delays and associated cost increases — including from VNI West, which has seen a 23% cost increase in recent years. This is now not expected to be delivered before 2031, well after Yallourn closes."

history of winchelsea

Frontier violence and a timber bridge

Last week I had the privilege of visiting the residents of the aged care facility in Hesse Rural Health Winchelsea Hospital. I met several Winchelsea locals there whose families had been here since the colonial days. I will endeavour in the coming weeks to record some of their stories and share them here. If

your family has been in Winchelsea for some time and you have stories of Winchelsea's history and culture, please come forward and contact me via the Winchelsea Star. Together we can ensure that the stories that never ended up in the archive, and survive exclusively in our community and the memories of those who live here, can survive for future generations. The next few articles here will be about the earliest settlers.

For every famous settler who set up on squatting runs here in the colonies, there were hundreds of Irish and working-class Anglo-Celtic people who worked as hut keepers, shepherds, shearers, labourers, domestic servants, and other various but essential colonial jobs, whose names are

largely missing from the mainstream histories. Many colonial histories will describe important events as involving wealthy people for example, Fyans, Armytage, Russell etc, but describe them as being attended by convicts, Aborigines or Irish whose names were not considered important enough to record. Together we can balance this by recording the names and stories of the ordinary people who made Winchelsea and who grew it into the vibrant, welcoming town we live in today.

In July 1836 for example, a squatter named Charles Franks and his shepherd were killed by Aboriginal people near Mount Cottrell in the Port Phillip District. The shepherd was a convict or emancipist, assigned to or employed by Franks' business partner, George Armytage, who found the bodies. Armytage later built Ingleby Homestead in Winchelsea and became one of Winchelsea's founding fathers. The murders were reported extensively through colonial and European newspapers.

Franks' death incited global calls for genocidal revenge, while the shepherd was not named in any newspaper report. In Police Magistrate Lonsdale's investigation the shepherd was named Flinders (or possibly Hindes). Historians still speculate as to whether that was his real name. While frontier violence

was common on both sides of the colonial frontier in Victoria Charles Franks was the first Wealthy settler to fall victim to frontier violence in Port Phillip.

In 1837. Solomon and Josiah Austin Came to the Winchelsea area with Hugh Murray's exploration Party. They named the area Austin's ford, owing to the natural ford on the river, which was the site where the original timber Barwon River Bridge was erected in 1849 for the Council of the Shire of Winchelsea, replaced by the current bluestone bridge in 1867. That area became the township of Winchelsea. In 1837, Explorers Gellibrand and Hesse disappeared in

the area, sparking search parties, bringing the Armytage, Hopkins, Highett and the Harding families to the area (more on that in coming weeks).

In 1838, a party of colonists set out from Melbourne on a retaliatory raid against the local Wathaurong (Wadawurrung) people in what became remembered as the Mount Cottrell massacre in retaliation for the killing of Charles Franks and shepherd Flinders. Many more such massacres followed throughout the Western District along with resistance to colonisation. We acknowledge and pay respects to those who lost their lives in frontier conflict and their descendents who carry their memory. Today Winchelsea is home to a number of Aboriginal people from various First Nations groups. We welcome them to share their stories and their living culture here. Their sovereignty was never ceded and their story is not mine to tell.

Community Tours Key Water Treatment Plant

Home to the region's largest water storage and main water treatment plant, Wurdee Boluc is central to Barwon Water's services.

It is here that about 80 million litres of water is cleaned to Australian standards every day, before being distributed in almost every direction to homes and businesses.

More than 110 community members learnt about the process of collecting rainfall in the Otways and sending high quality drinking water to their taps, at a tour of the plant in early May.

While Barwon Water regularly offers weekday school and community tours, it was first time the gates were opened to the public on a weekend for many years.

Central Treatment Coordinator Simon McCracken and Plant Operator Michael Murphy (both pictured) were among the Barwon Water employees who led visitors on a tour of the site.

Built in 1992, the treatment plant filters, disinfects and fluoridates drinking water that is supplied to customers in Winchelsea, Moriac, Anglesea, Airey's Inlet, Torquay, greater Geelong and the Bellarine Peninsula.

The adjoining reservoir was created in 1927, before being expanded in both 1956 and 1991.

With a capacity of almost 38 billion litres, it is the largest in the region and can hold enough to support all of Barwon Water's customers for about a year.

However, ongoing dry conditions have seen storages at Wurdee Boluc Reservoir decline to around 42 per cent.

More broadly, Geelong's water storages entered May at a six-year low (39.6 per cent). The extremely dry period has led Barwon Water to encourage customers to use water wisely.

By making simple changes inside and outside your home, like taking shorter showers, fixing leaks, washing with full loads and not watering your garden in the heat of the day, you can lower your water and energy bills, and help the environment.

Wurdee Boluc Water Treatment Plant

- Wurdee Boluc means 'big lake' in the Wadawurrung language.
- Treats about 80 million litres of drinking water per day, with the ability to double output if necessary
- An on-site 300 KW solar array and 200 Kw battery helps produce renewable electricity that meets half of the plant's energy needs
- Treats water that has fallen in a natural catchment in the Otways, which is collected in the West Barwon Reservoir and moved 57km to the plant via an open channel

I'm a Deakin university student currently doing my placement at Surf Coast Shire Council.


I just wanted to highlight the great work the Winchelsea Men's Shed are doing by building nest boxes for the community to purchase.


Nest boxes are important for our native wildlife, as tree hollows (where these animals prefer to live) become more scarce with land clearing, bushfires, storms and natural dieback.


Temporary housing (in the way of nest boxes) provide shelter from the elements for these animals.

Residents may be concerned about attracting species such as corellas, however you can select nest box entrance sizes to attract the species that you want to shelter in your yard.







RSPCA Warns Of Victoria's Horse Crisis

RSPCA Victoria is sounding the alarm of a horse crisis facing the state with more than 8,100 horses involved in animal cruelty reports this financial year and calling on horse owners to make sure they are prepared with enough feed and water for their animals.

With severe rainfall deficiencies and in some cases lowest recorded rainfall over the last 12 months, available feed is becoming increasingly scarce and ongoing cost-of-living pressures means many are struggling to buy necessary feed.

As a result, RSPCA Victoria's Inspectorate has received nearly 800 animal cruelty reports specifically related to 8,100 horses this financial year, a 37% increase on the previous year, with more than 800 horses still involved in active investigations.

Anyone with concerns about the welfare of animals with first-hand information is urged to make a report to RSPCA Victoria at rspcavic.org/cruelty-report or by calling 03 9224 2222.


