

THE CHALLENGE

35,500+

On any given night in 2023, 35,574 Veterans in the U.S. experienced homelessness. Of those Veterans, 20,067 were sheltered and 15,507 were unsheltered.*

- The number of homeless Veterans increased 7.4 percent in the same period, the largest increase in 12 years.
- Nearly all Veterans (98%) were experiencing homelessness as individuals.
 Of those individuals, 30% had chronic patterns of homelessness.

Why Nation's Finest Went Mobile

The idea behind the Nation's Finest MSU program is simple yet powerful: leave no Veteran behind. In rural areas, accessing care can be difficult due to limited resources and remote locations. We have seen firsthand how these challenges can adversely affect Veterans and hinder their successful reintegration into civilian life.

Initially launched during the COVID-19 pandemic, the MSU program aimed to connect isolated rural Veterans with health and medical services. The response was overwhelming, demonstrating a clear need to expand our fleet of MSUs and increase our capacity to provide care.

Our mission is to hit the road and reach those who can't come to us, ensuring that all Veterans receive the care and support they need to lead fulfilling lives.




MSU PROGRAM

The Mobile Service Unit Impact

Each year, one MSU can assist 350 Veterans through one-on-one engagement and telehealth, connecting them to various programs and services. In 2023, Nation's Finest expanded the reach of this innovative program, serving an additional 250 homeless and low-income Veterans and their families.

Homeless and at-risk Veterans served through the program experienced an 80% placement rate into permanent housing and a 20% increase in annual income. In 2024, Nation's Finest plans to double the program's size, increasing our capacity to deliver care and services to Veterans and their families in need.



Remembering Kenneth Gray's Journey of Resilience and Community

In 2023, we lost a special person in our community—Kenneth Gray. His passing has left a lasting mark on us all, and we honor this special U.S. Navy Veteran. A true fighter with a heart full of creativity, his life wasn't easy, especially after serving in the Navy during the tense Cold War times and then facing tough challenges back home, like homelessness and personal loss. But Ken had a special way of turning the tough stuff into something beautiful. He stumbled into stained glass art almost by accident, finding beauty in broken pieces of glass. This wasn't just a hobby for him; it was a way to heal and to make something bright out of the darkness. His art showed his incredible resilience and ability to see the good in everything.

Later in life, Ken became the heart and soul of Windsor Veterans Village, where people lovingly called him the "Mayor." He wasn't just about making art; he was all about bringing people together and creating a warm, supportive community for fellow veterans. Whether it was through organizing events or just being there for a chat, Ken made a huge difference. His story isn't just about the challenges he overcame; it's a reminder to us all about the power of community, creativity, and never giving up, no matter what life throws at you. Ken's legacy shines not only through his art but in the strong, caring community he helped build.


NATION'S FINEST 50

STORIES OF RESILIENCE


Nation's Finest is shining a spotlight on powerful stories inspired by the resilience of our country's Veterans.

Michael, a disabled Marine Corps Veteran, fell into a downward spiral during the pandemic. Struggling with health issues, including a heart attack, prostate cancer, and type 2 diabetes, he also battled internal demons such as PTSD and depression. By the early 2020s, Michael found himself homeless on the streets of Solano County.

In just a few days of discovering the assistance available to him, Michael was enrolled in a Nation's Finest program that provided shelter and support, effectively getting him off the streets. He also received access to crucial mental health services and regained his physical strength sufficiently to resume regular workouts. Michael's journey embodies the resilience we hope to instill in those who've served.


