LIBRARY GRAND OPENING



The anticipated grand opening for the **Vivian J. Lincoln Library** was held on Saturday, July 8, 2023, with remarks and a ribbon cutting before the doors officially opened to the public.

The library is located at 8901 McCart Avenue

in far southwest Fort Worth and was named by the community after the beloved longtime educator and first female African American principle in the Crowley Independent School District. The 18,000-square-foot facility features a large meeting room, study rooms, a creative lab, and a quiet room.

The art installation titled "Fabled", located at the new library, can be credited to the partnership between the Library and Fort Worth Public Art. The commissioned artwork by Area C Projects draws on the library's role as a teller of stories. Community members were invited to contribute pictures, videos, memories, words, and historical documents for a multi-media experience.

LAUNCHPAD: UNLOCKING STUDENT POTENTIAL



The culmination of a great year arrived in June, marking the success of 2023 high school graduates who participated in the LaunchPad College App mentorship program. Students graduated from local high schools, including Marine Creek, Dunbar, Paschal, Arlington Heights, and Southwest, as well as private schools.

Let's celebrate the 176 talented individuals who embarked on a transformative journey under the guidance of Dr. Paula Tyler and Dr. Teri Blaisdell to write, edit, re-write, edit, re-write (okay, you get the picture) multiple college and scholarship essays. Students' hard work paid off as they received acceptances from 60 institutions nationwide.

Many students chose to stay close to home and will make 19 major universities and regional campuses across Texas their academic homes for the next four years.

Across the county, 15 six-figure four-year scholarships were awarded to students based on the merit of their applications. The list of accolades includes the coveted Questbridge Scholarship to Rice University, Boston University Merit Scholarship, TCU STEM and Community Scholarships, SMU Distinguished Scholar Award, and Pitzer College Scholarship. Students have reported an astounding \$4.1 million in scholarship offers—a testament to their talents and the belief placed in their potential.

It's essential to acknowledge the profound impact of Launchpad director Dr. Paula Tyler on these extraordinary students. Many come from underrepresented backgrounds and have been overlooked as serious college candidates or are the first in their families to attend a higher learning institution. Students will forever be impacted by their LaunchPad experience as the mission to instill literacy beyond the college application carries on through to their upcoming classes and careers.
