A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE GATEWAY FOUNDATION

Founded by nine individuals in 1968 on Chicago's south side, Gateway's purpose has remained steadfast: **to help patients reclaim and live productive, socially responsible and healthy lives, free from drug and alcohol use and better able to manage symptoms of mental illness.** Gateway Foundation is one of Illinois's longest standing and largest nonprofit treatment providers with 15 residential, outpatient and recovery home locations across the state, and a variety of corrections and community corrections programs in Florida, Georgia, Michigan, Missouri, New Jersey, Texas and Wyoming. Launched in 2020, Gateway's adaptive recovery tool kit keeps treatment accessible for thousands of patients when barriers prevent physical attendance, and supports a growing network of alumni in all stages of recovery.

Gateway's professional clinicians currently touch over 40,000 lives a year, with personalized plans that address the underlying causes of substance use disorders, and which motivate those we serve to heal and thrive. Specialized programs serve women, young adults, survivors of domestic violence, and patients diagnosed with co-occurring mental health disorders.

Gateway has touched **over one million lives** to date and is proud of its diverse alumni community devoted to long term recovery.

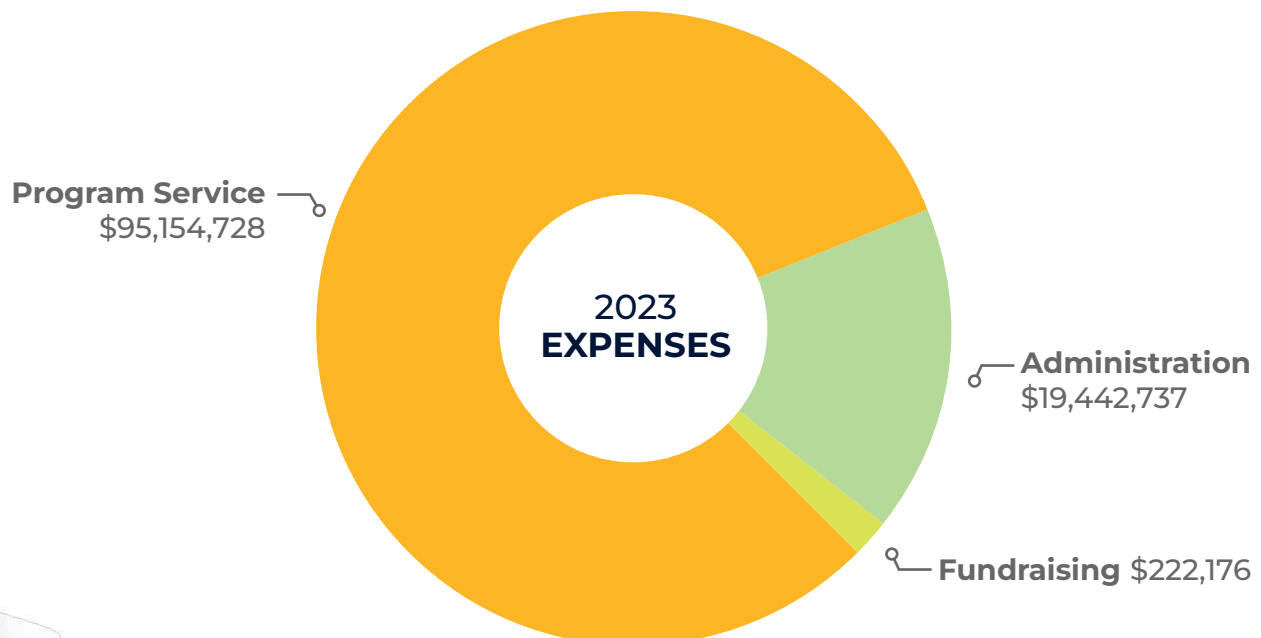
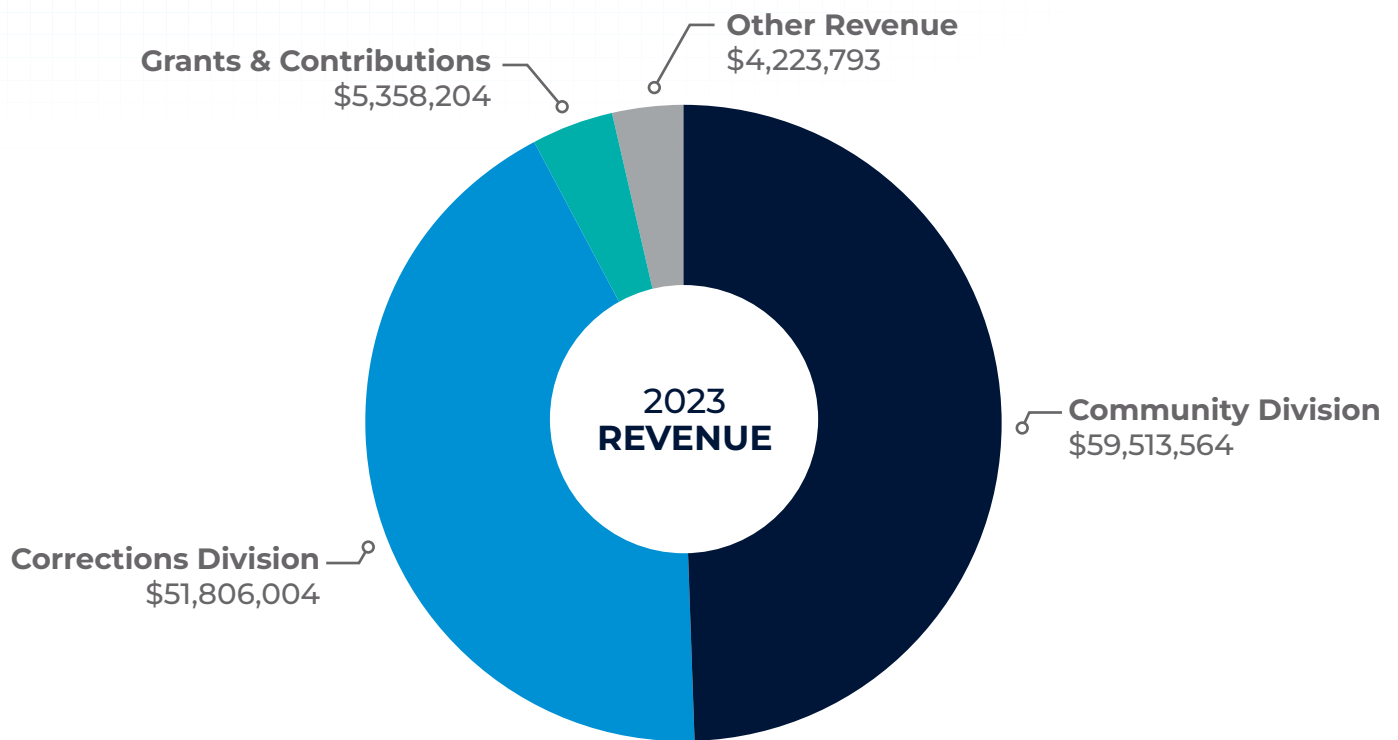

ILLINOIS

In July 2023, Gateway Foundation opened a new Jacksonville site that includes a full continuum of care and serves men and women. In Sangamon County, we partnered with the local county jail to provide Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) and outpatient services to individuals re-entering their local community.

FLORIDA

Added four additional service locations and awarded a contract for services in Leon County, Florida.



GEORGIA

Welcomed 11 programs and 9 locations in Spring 2023.



MICHIGAN

Expanded the Alger Correctional Facility to our five Upper Peninsula sites in June of 2023.



MISSOURI

Awarded a contract for four DORS programs in July 2023. Gateway is now the premier provider of SUD treatment services for justice involved individuals in the state.



NEW JERSEY

Offer in Prison SUD Treatment services in two main facilities and one assessment center; as well as alternative treatment service at seven additional sites.



TEXAS

Offer treatment and operational support in our Dallas County and Harris County facilities. Awarded a renewed contract at our Travis County facility where we provide operational support.



WYOMING

Operate programs in all five of the intensive treatment units for males and females in Wyoming and provide Youth Offender and Adult in Prison Outpatient, Inpatient and Residential services.



HIGHLIGHTS

COMMUNITY SERVICES DIVISION



Last year, we served over **10,000 distinct individuals** across all our levels of care with over half (56%) of them in 24/7 round-the-clock residential settings. Gateway Foundation has so many dedicated, intelligent and creative staff who live out our mission on a daily basis. It is a humbling experience to watch the many counselors, nurses, doctors and other staff work diligently day in and day out to endeavor to provide the highest quality care to those entrusted to us. Our division participated in its tri-annual accreditation survey by The Joint Commission on Accreditation of Healthcare Organization in February, 2023 and received an outstanding report acknowledging the fine work our staff does.

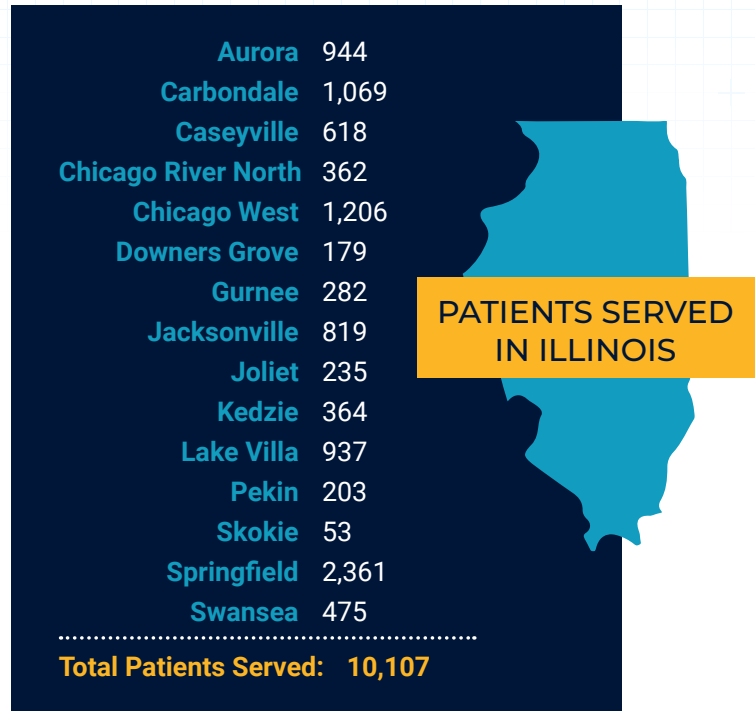
As the only substance use disorder provider with a state-wide footprint, we are excited about our two new outpatient locations opening in 2024. We are opening a state-of-the-art outpatient center in Bloomington, Illinois in March which will provide both substance use disorder treatment and services for individuals with only mental health and psychiatric needs. We are under construction for a similar facility in Peoria which will open in August 2024. We have rebuilt our Recovery Home and Outpatient space in Carbondale to provide more opportunities to meet community needs. Our team that plans for expansion of services and locations has worked very hard on the planning and execution of this growth.

We look forward to serving more of our communities with continued growth in the coming years!

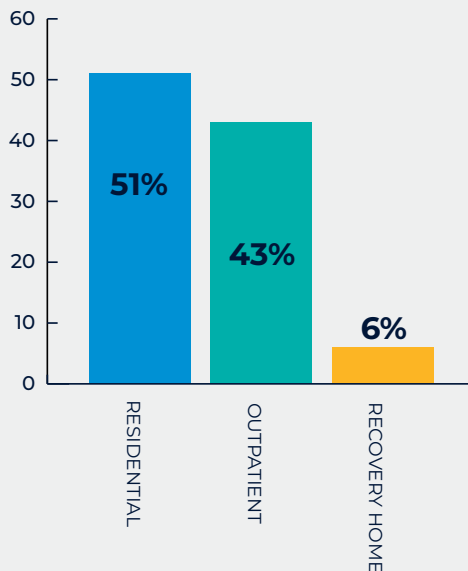

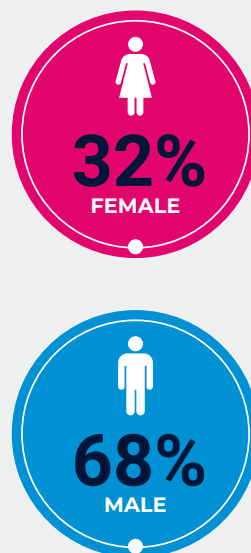
2023 PATIENT SATISFACTION RATES



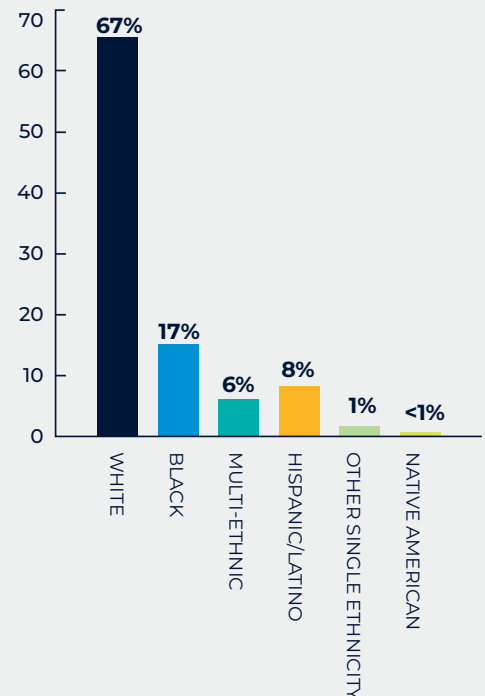

Gateway Foundation's virtual outpatient services connects patients to the treatment they need from the comfort of home. Our outpatient support platform provides affordable, accessible and comprehensive care to help our patients maintain a substance-free lifestyle. From therapy and social activities to educational workshops and other resources, these services are here to support patients on their long-term recovery journey.

The *Gateway Connect* app is our virtual substance use disorder treatment platform. Using the evidence-based programs we are known for, participants receive the same quality of care in online outpatient substance use disorder support. By accessing the virtual platform, patients have the opportunity to see and engage with therapists and peers in their group.

CLIENT SPOTLIGHT VIRTUAL OUTPATIENT PROGRAM

CASEY'S STORY



Casey D. is truly a success story. He was able to find connection, self-esteem, healthy relationships, better communication skills, and recovery through the use of virtual outpatient groups. He shared that “I never really drank normally. The last 5-6 years of my drinking is when I noticed that once I started, I couldn’t stop. I tried time after time on my own with no success. I knew I needed help.”

Casey connected with Gateway Foundation and enrolled in the Virtual Outpatient Program. Casey stated that the virtual program was a good fit for him because “it provided me with flexibility.” The ability to fit the groups into his busy work schedule, not having to commute, and doing the groups in his home environment were important to him.

Casey stated “the counselors genuinely cared about me, I had to be honest. I could relate to a lot of the people in the group. Just when you think you won’t be understood, there is someone that understands you. You can’t just sit there with your camera off. You have to be involved. You have to participate and recovery takes work. You have to be willing to do the work. Recovery is not spectator sport.”

Casey has over two years in recovery now without any alcohol. “Life is quite different now. I have been a better father for my daughter and I can be there for her now. I am a better husband to my wife. At work I can put forth a much better effort and I even got promoted. I recognize and value friendship. It has overall been pretty life changing and a great experience.” He would recommend virtual services “to anyone who has doubts with scheduling, worry about getting off work on time, social anxiety, and unable to commute. It is a safer option for people who may not be comfortable going in person.” Finally, he shared “you are not alone. Don’t talk yourself out of recovery because you are worth it. You have to ask for help and you need help from others and there is nothing wrong with that.”



RELATIONS PROGRAM UPDATE

In FY2023, the alumni relations program continues to be a resounding success, strengthening the bond between our valued graduates and their treatment programs. The program has remained dedicated to providing a vibrant, supportive, and engaging community for our alumni, fostering connections that continue to flourish irrespective of physical distance and passage of time. Through a wide array of events and support initiatives, we have strived to create a nurturing environment for our alumni to thrive personally and professionally.



DIVERSE RANGE OF EVENTS AND OVERWHELMING ATTENDANCE:

This fiscal year, the alumni relations program organized and hosted a remarkable 70 events, catering to the varied interests of our alumni network. From spirited sporting events to enjoyable pool parties and delightful picnics, these gatherings have drawn over 2,400 alumni. The inclusivity and diversity of our event portfolio have provided an enriching platform for our graduates to revive friendships, forge new connections, and celebrate the enduring ties that bind our community together.



EMPOWERING SUPPORT GROUPS:

DISORDER PROGRAM

OUTREACH AND COMMUNITY INTERVENTION HIGHLIGHTS

Each year, Gateway Foundation seeks opportunities to enhance and build on our previous year's success related to community intervention and outreach. We've steadily been building a level of awareness of our gambling disorder program among targeted demographic groups throughout the state which includes: Metro Chicago and surrounding suburbs, along with Central and Southern Illinois.



In partnership with the Illinois Department of Human Services (IDHS) and the division of Substance Use Prevention & Recovery (SUPR) alongside the agency's ubiquitous marketing campaign, "Are You Really Winning", Gateway has taken a lead role among Illinois gambling disorder providers by being conspicuously visible at jointly organized community events and activities. Through these events, our gambling disorder program staff have had the opportunity to speak with hundreds of Illinois residents each month and share our gambling disorder program.

In an effort to expand Gateway's Gambling Disorder program visibility among underserved populations, staff targeted Veterans groups and made an effort to visit 20+ community-based Veteran Affairs' clinics throughout central and southern Illinois. Our contact with these clinics was well received and laid the groundwork to continue developing these relationships.



OUTREACH AND COMMUNITY INTERVENTIONS HIGHLIGHTS

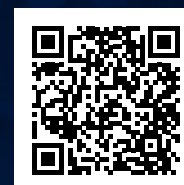
- » In 2023 we forged a unique partnership with Walker's Bluff Casino in Marion, IL. After meeting with the Director of Risk Management and Human Resources Director, we outlined a plan to provide the casino staff with training and Q&A sessions to help them identify the warning signs for gambling disorder and outline a process for referring individuals to Gateway Foundation for assessment.
- » With to community Intervention activities among Colleges and Universities on the rise, we continued to build upon our partnerships with Northern Illinois University, University of Illinois Chicago, Illinois State University and Southern Illinois University – Carbondale. Gambling program staff conducted lively and engaging tabling events at football and basketball games where fans were encouraged to discuss and learn about gambling disorder signs and behaviors.



WAGER DANGER PODCAST

Gateway's Wager Danger Podcast delivered 13 episodes and garnered 2,019 downloads throughout 2023. Episodes featured internationally recognized research experts Dr. Nathan Smith, Kindbridge Institute; Dr. Joshua Grubbs, Univ of New Mexico; and Dr. Celeste Napier, Loyola Univ). One episode featured author and Army Veteran Dave Yeager to discuss his newest book: Fall In | A Veteran with a Gambling Addiction.

BUILDING TOWARD A FUTURE OF SERVICE

The Corrections Division enjoyed a strong year of growth during Fiscal Year 2023. We added beds to existing markets, expanded into new ones, and recommitted our efforts to continuously provide quality care to patients across the continuum of care.

We were able to expand operations in Missouri – the first state we ever served outside of Illinois. Due to the excellent work done by our staff in that market over the past several years, we were asked to assume operations of four programs that were still run by the Department of Corrections. This enabled us to enhance the continuity of care across the entire state’s programming, and added over 1,000 additional beds to our service system.

In addition to the intrinsic growth from within an existing market, we also experienced growth from a new market. In early FY23, Gateway was awarded the statewide contract to provide Residential Substance Abuse Treatment (RSAT) services for the Georgia Department of Corrections. We assumed operations over eleven programs in nine institutions across the state, adding an additional 2,000 treatment beds to our footprint. The contract requires us to add over 100 new employees into the Gateway Corrections Family as well, all of whom have helped us learn the new landscape and develop new approaches to programming that match the needs of patients served throughout their system.

We also experienced growth in our community corrections service line, as we were asked to assist the Florida Department of Corrections with community outpatient services for probationers. We worked diligently to locate and site an outpatient clinic, and completed the purchase of a facility in Tallahassee at the end of the summer of 2023. We look forward to building out the continuum of care in the Florida market during FY24 and beyond, and we fully expect to establish programs in other Corrections markets where Community services are needed.

The growth experienced in the past year was possible due to the foundation laid by Gateway clinicians over many years. From that history we continue to build a future of hope and opportunity for those we serve. The work done each and every day to assist a population that has been marginalized for far too long leaves me both humbled and amazed. Thanks to all of the Corrections staff, and those who support their efforts, for their undying commitment to quality care; care that reduces recidivism and rebuilds lives!



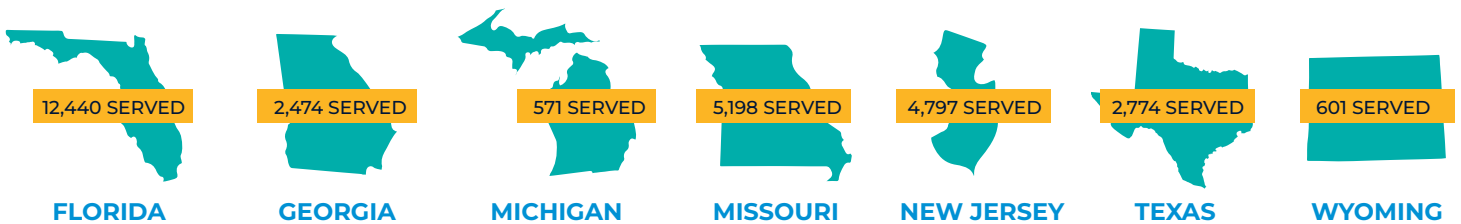

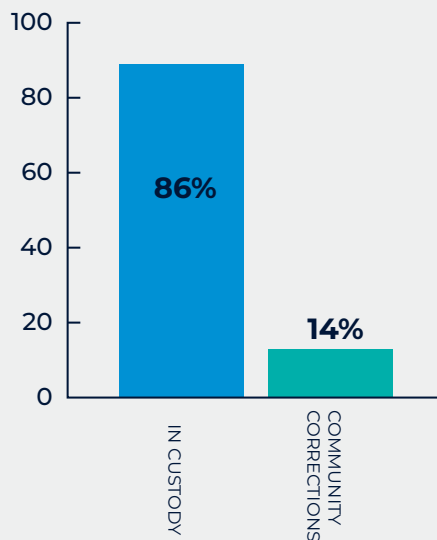
2023 PATIENT SATISFACTION RATES



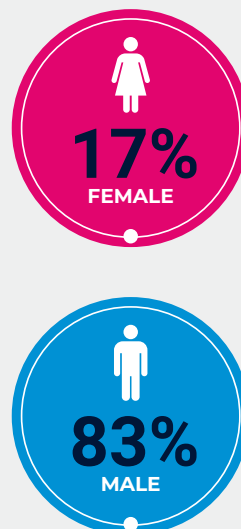
PATIENTS SERVED IN CORRECTIONS



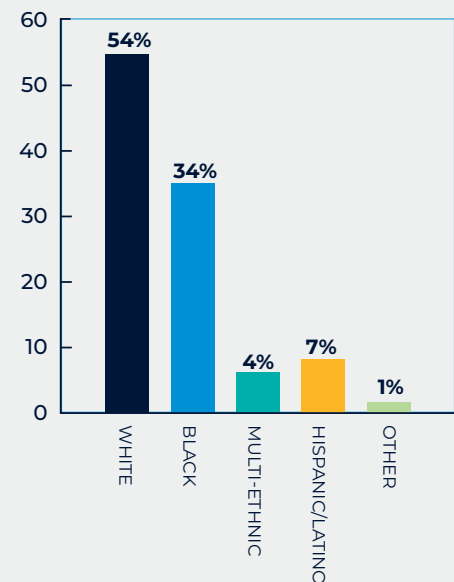

Karen Harrold joined the Gateway Foundation in 2008 as a receptionist. At that time, she had no idea how far her professional journey would take her. Right after obtaining her Bachelor's degree in Criminal Justice in 2009, she quickly enrolled in a graduate program in pursuit of a Master's in Human Services because she wanted to build clinical experience. Within her first nine months at Gateway, she transitioned into working full-time on the youth care residential unit. Karen loved the challenge, and quickly grew into her clinical role. Over the next few years, Karen's outstanding contribution to Gateway led to her being promoted four times—all while serving as a guardsman in the U.S. Air Force and raising two amazing children! As she completed her Master's Program in Human Services, she decided to start yet another journey to obtain a Master's of Social Work degree which she completed in 2019. **Karen currently acts as a Program Director at Gateway Foundation-Springfield, where she is able to use both her clinical and managerial skills to improve the lives of Gateway's patients and serve as a mentor to the staff she oversees within the three departments she manages.** She holds licensure as a social worker as well as CADC certification, and will be obtaining her LCSW in the near future.

During her 15 years of service with Gateway Foundation, Karen has made several contributions in efforts to enhance Gateway programs. She served as a project manager for the Impact Advisor grant, which was used to take a deep dive into Gateway's processes and procedures to ensure they align with others organizations in the industry. Karen has also served as a project manager for the implementation of Tiger Connect, a secured messaging application used currently by medical and clinical staff. She has taken the lead in the development and launch of several pilot programs Gateway offers such as Detox and Gambling Treatment. She serves as a resource for other site managers and staff by sharing knowledge and giving support when solicited. In addition, Karen has been utilized as a super-user for our EHR software system, myAvatar, and has served on various workgroups offering insight on ways to improve workflows for Admission teams across the division. Karen feels Gateway Foundation awarded her with the opportunity to grow personally and professionally in the field that she is most passionate about. She feels blessed to continue to be a part of the Gateway family.



CORRECTIONS STAFF SPOTLIGHT

SUSANNE WICKLUND

"I try my best to meet the patients where they are at and to give them a sense of hope and possibility."

In the Michigan-Upper Peninsula correctional facilities, counselor Susanne Wicklund is a role model for all of the Gateway values in her professional and personal life. Susanne has been working with patients since she began her counseling career at a local substance abuse treatment facility in 2018. Susanne has been a Gateway Foundation prison-based Substance Use Disorder Counselor (SUD) at Marquette Branch prison and Baraga Correctional Facility for over two and a half years, after "coming home to her Gateway family" following a brief time away. Susanne describes her decision to return to Gateway and carry on her work as "the best career decision I could have made. I missed my Gateway Team and feeling that my work has purpose." Today, Susanne has over six years of experience in substance use disorder treatment. She recently obtained her Certification as a Criminal Justice Professional (CCJP). Susanne is a Bachelor level Social Worker and is certified in Alcohol and Drug Counseling (CADC), along with a Peer Recovery Mentorship (CPRM).

Susanne is known by her teammates as someone they can count on. Team member Gabriele describes Susanne as "connecting with her patients on a very deep level. She listens to each patient's needs and has established phenomenal relationships with the correctional facilities and is able to advocate for her patient's needs." She promotes and demonstrates the ability of overcoming hardships and the benefits of positive behavior. Diane, another team member of Susanne's says, "What strikes me most about Susanne is how much of an advocate she is for her patients. She keeps their best interests in front and guides them to do the same...in spite of the challenges they face."

When Susanne was asked to describe how she feels about her work, she said **"it is a passion for me that is so rewarding and worthwhile. I try my best to meet the patients where they are at and to give them a sense of hope and possibility. I believe they are better than where they sit today and they are more than their past."** Susanne has always "been a fighter for the underdog" and is known as a kind and genuine professional counselor. Office Manager, Sheila stated "Susanne has one of the biggest hearts for her patients. She is always looking for ways to improve their lives and improve on her own life for the benefit of others also. She definitely deserves to be recognized."

Susanne arrives each day, with a smile on her face, a word of encouragement and an attitude of openness and compassion for her patients. Recently, one of her patients expressed interest in giving back to others in recovery. He asked about providing Peer Recovery mentorship when released from prison but did not know how to begin the process. Susanne noticed the qualities and commitment in this patient and felt they suited this work. As a result, the patient was selected to begin volunteering in a peer recovery mentorship capacity by our MDOC contract management team. He will begin helping others when he returns home. To add to the patient's success, once he completes the conditions of his parole, he will be able to apply for this position and continue to promote his passion for recovery. Susanne is a daily reminder that Gateway Foundation's mission of "helping people build healthier lives by reducing substance use, other addictions, and improving mental health" is working!
