For some, life has simply dealt a bad hand. Others are unable to realize their potential for financial reasons.


This is not a traditional NGO program.

Clarita, Yeiker & Family 🥩 🥩 Santa Cruz Bolivia 2022

Mi nombre es Yeiker, tengo 19 años. Somos refugiados. Con Clarita y nuestros hijos María 3 y Alexander 9 meses,

My name is Yeiker I am 19. We are refugees. With Clarita and our children Maria 3, and Alexander 9 months, we took 5 weeks to travel nearly 3000 k's from Venezuela to Bolivia by walking and truck. We carried the children above our heads when we crossed rivers.

Venezuela is our home but we could not survive. A few days after we arrived in Bolivia we met Colin in Santa Cruz. We had no money, family or friends here.

We set up a mobile food stall. Colin even sold food on the street with us!

We have a room now and very happy that Maria has enrolled in kindergarten. There are many hassles with no ID. But everything will be OK.







Narjis Khartoon Hearing Impairment School Skardu Pakistan





My husband and I are blessed with two daughters with a hearing impairment.

We live in a remote area in Northern Pakistan which struggles to help people with disabilities.

We decided to set up our own school. It was the right decision. We have 72 students. 50 live in town, the others stay at our hostel.

In December we achieved a milestone. For the first time students with hearing impairment appeared in board examinations. Our biggest challenge has been to change the general belief that educating differently-abled children was a waste of time and resources! We pay special attention to fine arts training, since the children are highly visual.

I met Colin in 2011. Growing up in Basti, one of Dhaka's largest slums, presented many challenges.

I persevered and completed my secondary and higher secondary education in 2014 . I earned a Diploma in Computer Science in 2018 and a B.Eng. in Computer Science from Jiangsu University of Science & Technology in China, in 2022.

The exciting news of being accepted for a Master's degree in Artificial Intelligence at Dublin Business School in Ireland, starting in September 2023, has left me feeling absolutely elated and radiant. The future holds endless possibilities, and I cannot wait to be a part of it!

At 1am on 10th October 2011 the police came and destroyed our home. With 500 others we were homeless.

One day I gave a ride to a girl with the same problem in her legs. We married!

We have 2 daughters. I now have a bigger delivery vehicle.

That is my story. Thank you.

Noor Nahar Tonima 🐠 Dhaka

Despite being born blind, I never suffered from depression. I can do all my daily activities, including cooking, shopping, and washing clothes, by myself and travel anywhere by public transport.

I use a screen reader software to write and read on a laptop. Two types of software are used: one, JAWS, which can only read and write in English, and another, NVDA, which can use other languages, including Bengali. When I put my hand on one of the buttons, it makes a sound and automatically writes on the screen.

I can't write much with my own hand, but I can sign my name.

Now in 2023 I am in 3rd year of studying English at a Bangladesh University. It is located in Mohammadpur, Dhaka. A scribe sits next to me while I take the exam and helps me write down the answers.

My village home is in Barisal district. Due to my strong desire to study, I left home and came to Dhaka without saying anything to anyone.

In the future, I intend to provide motivational training to visually impaired people on mobility and managing daily activities.


Huy Dang

My marks were good: I was encouraged to learn English, and attended courses in Hanoi at the British Council. I was 18 when I received a scholarship from the Glencoe Foundation's Learn for Life to study for my BA in finance at Deakin University. I seized the opportunity. I continued with my Masters in Professional Accounting at Monash University and graduated with high distinction.

For 6 years I worked for the Commonwealth Bank before joining a boutique wealth advisory firm in Sydney. My life is now very positive and I am extremely grateful for the support received.

Thanh Ba Computer Program 🥩

This program started very modestly in 2003 with 6 computers. It quickly grew to 70 computers in 4 schools.

The schools are in a rural area 80 k's north of Hanoi. Some 1500 children learnt keyboard skills, most for the first time. A specialist teacher Tran Viet Phuong was hired to support teachers and work with the most talented students.

One of the pupils , Huy, (see page 14) went on to successfully study in Australia on a Learn for Life scholarship.





Thang Long Vocational School 🜮 Hanoi

A private vocational college focusing on training women from ethnic minority areas In garment making and starting their own business.

Strong classes in mechanical repairs and electronics.

Learn for Life paid for over 100 enrollments and helped buy equipment.









Maria 🐲 Aileu East Timor Maria had congenital heart heart disease. She lived in a village near Aileu in newly independent East Timor.

I helped her come to Melbourne and funded a life saving operation at the Royal Children's hospital.

Frail, unhappy little girl, with big doleful eyes. Within 48 hours of the operation she was transformed with energy and inquisitiveness.

I went back to visit her, with the intention of supporting her education, but we lost touch.

A short time ago I was very happy to receive a picture of Maria with her daughter.

I learnt an important lesson from Maria: it doesn't take much to change a life

Computer Culture 💿 🐲 computer


Coen Cape York

The computer culture project helped make children's education the town's number one priority.

It supplemented the oral transmission of culture, by highlighting the connection between education and cultural survival. The project successfully trained students to record and save their elders' stories and culture.

Computer Culture was led by Noel Pearson. From Learn for Life, Lan Do, visited Coen several times to work with the students and to talk about the culture and lifestyle in Vietnam.

Learn for Life supported Amena Baki Residential School exploring the most effective ways to deliver on line teaching.

A digital lab was established with 45 computers purchased by Learn for Life.

Over 500 lessons were delivered in IT Maths and Physics to years 9 to 12 from our studio at Banani.

Conversational English was also taught on line from Australia, Vietnam, and UK by our scholarship teachers from Vietnam. The discussions between female teachers and students was particularly rewarding.
