RCGB Seminar: Sustainable Leadership in the AI Era

On 2 September 2025, RCGB hosted a seminar by Prof. Wing Lam, Professor of Organisational Psychology at The University of Manchester and Honorary Research Fellow at the University of Cambridge. Titled "*Sustainable Leadership in the AI Era: Navigating Change and Impact*", the seminar attracted over 40 academic staff. Prof. Lam shared key strategies for addressing leadership challenges in the age of AI, sparking an engaging exchange of ideas. The seminar underscored the importance of balancing technological advancements with sustainable leadership practices, offering attendees valuable perspectives on navigating the evolving organisational landscape.

Professor Wing Lam is a Professor of Organisational Psychology at the University of Manchester and an Honorary Research Fellow at the University of Cambridge. In 2023, she was recognised as an Outstanding Scholarly Alumni by both the Faculty of Business and Department of Management and Marketing at the Hong Kong Polytechnic University. Her research focuses on employee prosociality, the dark side of leadership and team dynamics. She is currently an Associate Editor for the Journal of Occupational and Organizational Psychology (JOSOP) and previously served as Associate Editor for the Journal of Business Research (JBR). From 2006 to 2023, her work has appeared in leading journals, including the Academy of Management Journal, Journal of Applied Psychology, Journal of Management, Personnel Psychology, Journal of Organizational Behavior, Leadership Quarterly, and among others. She has been invited as a visiting scholar and keynote or guest speaker in the UK, Netherlands, Norway, USA, Australia, Japan, Singapore, Kazakhstan, China, Hong Kong, Taiwan, and Mexico. She actively bridges research and practice, delivering training programmes for organisations across industries such as hospitality, logistics, healthcare, retail, IT, real estate, and banking, as well as for government departments.

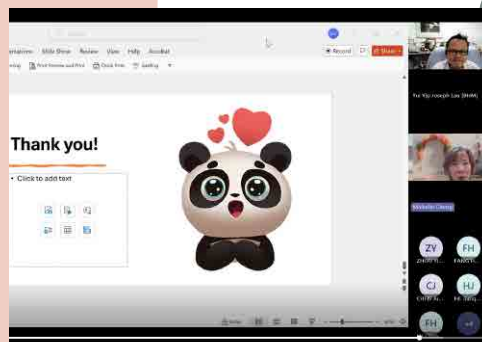

Deliverables include a bilingual research report and presentation designed to assist financial institutions in unlocking the potential of the silver economy. This initiative aims to promote innovation in elderly services and cultural tourism, contributing to long-term economic and social benefits.





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
