We thank our benefactors, volunteers, and partner companies for participating in this year's achievements.








### NATIONAL ORATORY CONTEST 2022



The National Oratory Contest is an educational project that promotes healthy competition, intellect, and leadership among young people who, through public speaking, address and analyze current issues that, year after year, have marked the country's historical evolution. In 2022, the CNO (Spanish Acronym) maintained its convening power among high school and high school students. In 17 editions, the contest has impacted more than 800,000 students nationwide.

The contest's Grand Finale captured the entire country's attention and brought to the fore a fundamental issue for a Panamanian society: Reimagining education in Panama. The contribution of young people in transforming and strengthening the Panamanian educational system, post Covid.





























# +TERCLASS


Our +Terclass project, in 2022, held four master classes in a virtual format. We had a cumulative audience of more than 800 viewers, between students and teachers, with an average of 200 questions and comments. This year, we emphasized STEM careers more to encourage girls to consider careers in telecommunications, engineering, science, and the like. We kept a colloquial format, with dynamic content and relevant data from each specialty area of the guests, to fuel curiosity and research.


# AYUDINGA FOUNDATION

# DONATION OF SCHOOL SUPPLIES

The CWP Foundation and the volunteers from +Movil and Claro traveled to El Valle de Antón in the Province of Cocle to deliver school supply kits in environmentally friendly bags. As a result, more than 30 students of the C.E.B.G. Toribia Rodriguez de Escudero received school supplies, Christmas gifts, and a celebration with entertaining games by the team of volunteers.



# PROMOTING SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY

Continuing the efforts of the Foundation, the volunteers had the opportunity to address the 830 students from the schools visited, in other activities, to motivate them to be interested in STEM subjects. 


### **RECYCLING PROGRAM**

#### **BEACH CLEANING**



As part of the celebration of "The Ocean's Month" volunteers from Liberty Latin America, +Movil and Claro participated in a Beach Cleaning Day in Costa del Este in Panama City, intending to support the protection and maintenance of Panamanian coasts and beaches. These activities help mitigate the impact of pollution by plastics and all kinds of waste that reach this sector. As a result, it was possible to collect glass, cans, plastics, clothing, and electronic scrap, among other non-organic items, totaling 558 bags, equivalent to 4.9 tons of waste.

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#### **BEACH CLEANING**



Within the framework of Mission Week, volunteers from +Movil and Claro and the residents of the Maria Chiquita township in the province of Colon collected 3.1 tons of garbage found in the community beach area. This activity, in which people of Colon of all ages participated, meant an educational moment to raise awareness about the problems caused by the contamination of beaches and oceans, affecting ecosystems and biodiversity.

#### REFORESTATION



As part of the environmental activities, +Movil and Claro's volunteers carried out support work in the institutional nursery of the Ministry of the Environment in Chilibre. The employees were divided into teams to cover the care and assembly of 958 seedlings. These will be distributed nationwide for various reforestation activities.

# CONNECTING THE UNCONNECTED



For the Foundation, access to technology guarantees education and helps expand development opportunities for communities, especially those that comprise the Guna Yala Region. Through the donation of tablets, the Foundation reaffirms its commitment to continue supporting education, giving young Panamanians from the Yandub - Nargana community access to technology.

The nine students on the honor roll from Felix E. Oller's High School and Rodolfo Chiari's Bilingual Center received a Tablet as a reward for their efforts.



# CONNECTING THE UNCONNECTED



During Mission Week, the Foundation, with the support of +Movil, donated mobile phones with Sim cards and LTE +Movil data to thirty low-income residents in hard-to-reach communities. Volunteers from +Movil and Claro identified people who did not have access to the Internet due to a lack of equipment, primarily women and older adults. In addition, our team of employees guided the beneficiaries in using the digital advantages of the equipment and the mobile service.

Connectivity is a necessary element for the development of people; for this reason, we remain committed to advancing the connectivity of all.





# FOOD BANK

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We support the Food Bank with work in the warehouse, a non-profit organization that seeks to alleviate hunger in Panama, providing food assistance to the country's most vulnerable sectors. The foundation's volunteers helped with food packaging and assembling bags with basic needs supplies that reached hundreds of families with limited resources—Reaching 7.5 tons of goods.



# SOLIDARITY SUPPORT TO THE COMMUNITY



With the foundation's financial support and the collection of donations from the +Movil and Claro employees, dozens of volunteers from all the provinces traveled to different sectors of the country to deliver basic needs supplies to vulnerable families affected by heavy rains and floods. In November 2022, Panama suffered the overflow of the La Villa, Tonosi, and El Cacao rivers in the provinces of

Herrera and Los Santos, leaving many affectations in the surrounding communities. Employees put together basic food kits with an accumulated weight of 1.9 tons. Families in Darien, Panama Oeste, Chiriqui, Bocas del Toro, Veraguas, and Colon benefited.





# "TÚ VALES" PROGRAM WITH NI1+ FOUNDATION



The official launch of the "Tú Vales" took place in alliance with the Ni Uno+ Foundation and the Ministry of Education (MEDUCA). A hotline (800-6410) will provide exceptional guidance to young people, victims, witnesses, and harassers, on school harassment (bullying) or cyberbullying (cyberbullying), in educational centers and communities nationwide. The Cable & Wireless Panama Foundation supported the "TÚ VALES" Program and donated to the call center system.

This cloud-based application works with mobile devices to allow volunteer agents and specialist psychologists to support school bullying (bullying) or cyberbullying victimS.





#### CHILDREN WITH DISABILITIES

24 employees who have children with special needs receive 1 monthly financial support from the CWP Foundation to help them with the expenses required for their exceptional health care. We understand the needs of these families, and identify opportunities for improvement—labor benefits of these employees beyond health insurance.

# **MEJORANA FESTIVAL**



The Foundation also supported culture through the Panamanian vernacular expression, sponsoring the contests of the Mejorana National Festival in Guararé. By this, the Foundation seeks

to promote folklore and strengthen the seedbed of musical and artistic talent.
