Pastoral Letter - Rev^d David Bickersteth

Dear Readers,

To believe or not to believe? On a recent river cruise on the Douro in Portugal (highly recommended!) one of the passengers, on being told my career, launched into a tirade (politely!) about the absurdity of belief in God. As a scientist, he said, he expected empirical evidence. He called himself a 'devout atheist'! His partner rolled her eyes and said she is a church going believer! I told him that as a curate, the church I served in, had over 12 members who were PhD's in science subjects and much more recently I served as Rector of Gosforth and Wasdale where he had 5 PhD scientist – all working in the nuclear industry. He said they were not being truthful to their science, believing in fairy tales!

He was not for turning, but what credibility is there for belief in a supernatural existence let alone a personal God? Two scientists have deeply impressed me, one died in 2021, he was Professor John Polkinghorne of Cambridge University where he was professor of mathematical physics. He resigned his post to become an Anglican priest and devote his life to explaining the relationship of science and religion. My second and living scientist, is Professor John Lennox, of Oxford University who in his eighties, is a globe trotting apologist for Christianity. He too was a Professor of Mathematics and like Polkinghorne, writes and speaks on the interface of science, philosophy and religion.

Both men have a Celtic background, Polkinghorne called himself a Cornishman, and Lennox proud of his Northern Irish heritage. Is faith a mystic gift? No, both men were convinced by intellect of the persuasive evidence for belief in Christ and the resurrection.

Polkinghorne was knighted and received the prestigious Templeton prize for his contribution affirming life's spiritual dimension. This is not the place to go into his writings, they can be looked up – but he tackles God and science and the problem of belief in God in a world where there is so much evil.

I'm totally baffled by Quantum Physics which Polkinghorne spent much of his life researching. At the end of the day, it's Polkinghorne the Christian pastor that I think I can understand. You Tube is full of talks by both men.

I struggle with the problem of evil – but at the end of the day I have a relationship with Christ, who suffered and suffers out of love for humanity. We are in this world for only a short time, it may not seem so to the young, but at my age mortality is knocking on the door. I have seen enough to believe my faith is based upon evidence, scriptural and personal. If I'm right, then surely, it's worth finding the truth for yourself. Eternity may depend on what you discover! 'Behold', said Jesus, 'I stand at the door and knock' (Revelation 3:20). Open the door!

140th Rusland Show – A Real Sizzler!

On the track and up on the fells the temperature was sizzling. The sunshine brought out nearly 70 eager runners for the first event, the Senior 5 Mile Fell Race. Jack Wright, last year's winner, fought off all challengers to retain the men's trophy and even managed to finish 43 seconds faster than last year. In the women's race was Cat Taylor who, to the delight of the crowd, had got engaged to partner Harry at last year's show during the egg throwing competition. This year she was first in the Women's 5 Mile Fell Race and then doubled up in the Short Fell Race, winning two brand new awards for female fell runners - The Julia Crowe Trophy and the Yvonne Haddow Salver. On the track, junior and senior athletes did battle in the heat while the sun-drenched spectators cheered them on and enjoyed their ice-creams.

The main marquee looked more splendid than ever as it sparkled in the sunshine. It was full to bursting with exquisite entries of flowers, fruit and vegetables and all manner of home produce and crafts. The floral art was outstanding, with every bloom looking crisp and fresh despite the heat. Spare a thought for our wonderful judges who worked so hard to choose the winners - with 14 Victoria sponges and 18 varieties of unbaked traybake, they had a tough day. In their classes, the children showed off their skills beautifully too, dispelling the myth that youngsters these days are only interested in their screens - it's certainly not the case in Rusland. Next door, the local interest and craft tents were buzzing. Happy shoppers were buying all manner of treats, artwork, glass, leather, wool and wooden items and also catching up with local organisations about everything that's been going on in the valley.

In the ring, the children paraded in their fancy dress costumes, 'Anything Beginning with B'. Two beautiful ballerinas took first and third prize, with a splendid miniature Bob the Builder sandwiched between them in second place. Pet and owner lookalike was clinched by Pip and 10-year-old Rosie who'd fashioned a fabulous pair of ears to match her puppy's. The dog with the waggiest tail was as hotly contested as ever, judged it with the help of a holiday maker selected from the audience so they could

run away quickly once the verdict was delivered. We needn't have worried. The prize went to Bailey, with seven-year-old Hessa, who we learnt had ALSO WON THE COMPETITION LAST YEAR. In two different shows, with two different judges, Bailey scooped the prize - he is officially and beyond doubt the waggiest dog Rusland knows.

Huge thanks are due to everyone who worked so hard to make the show such a wonderful day - to Maureen Boyren the Show Secretary, the committee, friends and family and all those who get involved. Two anonymous donors allowed us to increase the prize money for the senior track events this year and their generosity is much appreciated. Plus thank you to all participants, young and old, who ran, threw, grew, brewed, baked and crafted – you are the stars of the show and ensure that its tradition lives on. **See you all next year!**

Flood Risk - Coniston Emergency Resilience Group

Coniston is no stranger to floods and many people who have lived her for several years will no doubt have an understanding of which areas of the parish are more likely to flood and, more importantly, what they would do in the eventuality of that happening.

However, the Environment Agency has updated the information it uses for planning purposes, and it is worthwhile bringing this to your attention. This is especially important as the Agency has noticed that few of those living and working in areas with a higher potential for flooding have not signed up for flood alerts.

To get early warning to let you know whether heavy rain might result in some areas flooding you should sign up to flood alerts: <https://www.gov.uk/sign-up-for-flood-warnings>

The Environment Agency Website has a wealth of information that will help you prepare for flooding, however, a leaflet prepared by the Coniston Emergency Planning Group will be distributed to all residents and businesses in the early autumn.

The LDNPA has written to the Co-op to say that the property at 3 Yewdale Road has been nominated for inclusion in the Lake District National Park's Local Heritage List: "Local heritage listing is the identification of heritage assets that are valued by people locally but are not already protected through planning law... It should be noted that Local Listing does not provide any extra planning controls to the asset or change what works require planning permission... Inclusion of a non-designated heritage asset on a local list simply makes it a material planning consideration."

News from Coniston

The Coniston Parish Council has sponsored purple waymarks on an easy to follow walking route between Coniston and Hawkshead. It is a largely traffic free route which can be followed by those who do not have, or are not confident in using, maps. It is possible to walk one way and return by the 505 bus. The route is via the Hawkshead Hill Baptist Chapel (which is open to the public) and from which the bus can be taken if the whole route is too much. The aim is to enable visitors fully to enjoy the special qualities of the area, reduce vehicular traffic, encourage public transport use and support local businesses. The waymarking has been supported by the Hawkshead Parish Council, the National Trust, and the National Park Authority. The Parish Council is grateful to volunteers Geoffrey and George Cooper for their skilled design and installation work.

A Walking route to link Coniston and Hawkshead

It's not easy to find a good walking route on footpaths between the two popular Lake District villages of Coniston and Hawkshead. Fingerposts show a confusing range of signs such as "Boon Crag", "Tarn Hows", "Hawkshead Hill", "High Cross" and "Walker Ground". A route has now been waymarked in both directions using small purple discs showing a footprint. The route is about 4 miles and it's possible to use the 505 bus to return to your starting point. It should encourage walkers to stop for refreshments of food and drink in the villages. The project has been supported by Coniston Parish Council and descriptions of the walk in both directions with a map will be placed on local websites.



Grants from the Rawdon-Smith Trust

The Rawdon-Smith Trust is a charity that owns the bed of Coniston Water and uses the fees collected from moorings and jetties for the benefit of local communities around the lake.

The Trust owns a section of the old railway line from Coniston village to Haws Bank and maintains this as a permitted path. The track has been resurfaced and signed for walkers. It is a popular walk for locals and visitors who use it as part of a circuit with the lakeshore path. A traditional stone bench has been purchased and will be placed to offer good views over the lake and Grizedale forest.

The Trust's website: rstcharity.uk provides more information on its work and it has an application form for grants. The Trust regularly supports voluntary bodies and charities and recent grants have been made to the Coniston Football Club, the Women's Institute and Thurston Outdoor Education Centre.

Trustees meet four times each year to consider requests. Applications for grants must be made online through the website and be submitted at least 7 days prior to a meeting. The Trust's next meeting is on 13th November.

Torver Parish Council

The telephone kiosk by the bus shelter near the Wilson Arms has been purchased by TPC, and notices to that effect have been published in the village. Councillors have ideas but are open to suggestions from villagers for its future use. At the meeting of **4th September**, councillors supported the application for three two-story local needs houses, for sale or rent, on the land adjacent to Walna Scar View. TPC remains one councillor short of its allotted five: anyone interested in joining the council should contact its Chair, Peter Worth. What is involved? – over the year, six meetings each of an hour's duration (**7.30-8.30pm**) in the Schoolroom. The next meeting of TPC is scheduled for **Thursday 6th November**.

Our new Studio exhibition opens on **Saturday 4th October**. **The Ways of Turner: Tracing His Northern Tour** by artist Monika Müller. In 1816 William Turner undertook a sketching tour in the north of England on behalf of the publishers Longman and Thomas Dunham Whittaker, who were planning a nine-volume «History of Yorkshire» for which Turner was to produce 120 watercolours - the largest commission he ever had. He only completed 20 of them, then Longman ran out of money. A few years ago, Monika Müller discovered an art-scientific publication by David Hill on the aforementioned North England journey of William Turner in the display of a bookshop. Following the route described by Hill, she traced Turner's footsteps on his 1816 sketching trip to collect material for a 120-part cycle of drawings with the aim of completing William Turner's unfinished work.

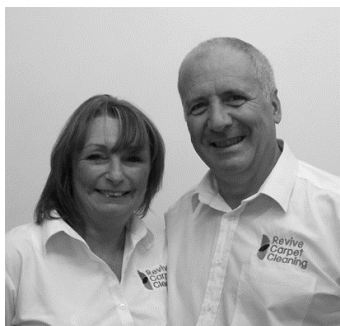

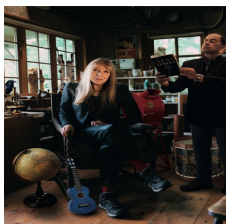
