RESIDENTIAL TRIPS

Throughout Key Stage 2, the boys have the opportunity to take part in one of the residential trips which traditionally take place during the Summer Term. The aim of each trip is to teach the boys new skills which will be increased as they progress through Key Stage 2 and to provide them with numerous and varying experiences and team building opportunities.

The planned residential trips are listed below:

- Year 3 a two day/one night visit to High Ashurst, Dorking
- Year 4 a three day/two night visit to Ufton Court, Reading
- Year 5 a four day/three night visit to Mersea, Essex
- Year 6 a five day/four night visit to Bushcraft, Penshurst Place, Kent



UFTON COURT



Year 4 will visit Ufton Court, Berkshire taking part in various supervised activities, focused on building confidence and resilience through a range of challenging nature-based and

historical activities. Working closely together, children have a chance to test themselves away from the classroom and develop important life skills.

MERSEA

The centre sits inside 60 acres on the edge of the River Blackwater and is an ideal coastal location. The boys study coastal climates in Year 5 which will come to life on this

trip. They also take part in a variety of supervised activities, focusing on the water, alongside coastal discovery and team challenges.











PENSHURST BUSHCRAFT

In the Summer Term of Year 6, the boys have a residential trip which is organised in conjunction with the Bushcraft Company and consists of five days and four nights sleeping under canvas!

The course combines traditional bushcraft workshops including learning to light fires (under supervision), building shelters and cooking their own food with other adventurous activities.

HOUSE SYSTEM



The House system is an important part of school life. Each boy belongs to one of three Houses – Arundel, Balmoral or Caernarvon. There are a number of competitions across the year in which the boys compete against each other while representing their House. These contests may vary each term. The year culminates in a House Sports Day, in which all pupils participate. Each House is led by a teacher and a House Captain and Deputy. The Year 6 boys are given the opportunity to put themselves forward as the

most eligible candidates to lead their House to victory. The elected Captains are responsible for leading their House for the rest of the year, including running House meetings and being involved in developing new House competitions. Throughout each term, all the boys in the School are keen to receive House points that go towards the weekly totals. On an individual basis, boys also receive awards of Bronze, Silver, Gold, Platinum and Diamond to celebrate their hard work and exemplary behaviour.

At Surbiton High Boys' Preparatory School, we actively encourage and support boys to participate in a range of fundraising activities. Fundraising events are held and celebrated throughout the year, reinforcing the School's motto, 'May love always lead us' and supporting the ethos to serve and respect others.

At the start of the academic year, all boys are given the opportunity to nominate a charity for the School to support over the course of a term. They are required to give a short presentation to their forms, detailing the reasons why the charity





is important to them and the reasons why we should choose the charity. Once shortlisted, these charities will then be presented in front of the whole School.

The pupils then select three charities for the following year to support. We try, wherever possible, to invite a representative from the charity to present an assembly to the School in order to broaden the boys' knowledge of the importance of the charity. We also actively encourage and celebrate individual boys' fundraising initiatives through assemblies.

VECTO

SCHOOL COUNCIL

The School Council plays an active role in representing pupils' views and supporting school life. There are two School Council groups: one for Years 1, 2 and 3 at Charles Burney House, and another for Years 4, 5 and 6 at Avenue Elmers. Each group is led by a teacher

and meets weekly to discuss the views of the class, as well as any concerns and suggestions. Ideas and feedback from these meetings are shared with the Senior Leadership Team through the two leading teachers and the Year 6 representatives. Together, they review

the issues raised, discuss any actions taken and provide valuable feedback to pupils. In addition, members of the School Council play an important role in supporting the school's charitable work, helping to organise and run a wide range of fundraising events across the year.

As part of our commitment to providing the best educational opportunities for the individual pupils within our School, we are planning to run a number of Breakfast and After School Mathematics and English Clubs. Throughout the year, boys will be invited to attend the session most suited to their needs.

PHONICS AND GYM FINGER FUN


