Saint Bartholomew's members and students in our summer program truly rose to the occasion this year, embodying the heart of our mission to serve and uplift our community. Through your generosity, compassion, and willingness to step forward, we have witnessed the very best of what a church family can do together.

This summer, our church and summer school students partnered with River Valley Education Solutions to provide backpacks and school supplies to local students in need. Led in part by the tireless compassion of Maranda Leeper—who continually pours her heart into numerous ministries—we packed 38 of the 45 donated backpacks and still had supplies to spare. In total, our members and students contributed over 900 individual school supply items—from pencils and erasers to markers and highlighters—a remarkable testament to your generosity and love for our neighbors.

That same spirit of service carried into our Thanksgiving outreach. We are especially grateful for the "elves" who spent time shopping and preparing Thanksgiving baskets for 35 families. These meal kits were delivered to our food pantry families and 31 veteran families, ensuring that homes across our community could gather around a warm and plentiful holiday meal. We are blessed beyond measure to have members who care so deeply about the wellbeing of others.

As we reflect on this season of gratitude, we are reminded of the many blessings within our own St. Bart's family. This is what churches are called to do, and we are honored to share in this work with you.




POTLUCKS/PARISH MEALS

These will also help a lot with Parish meals like Thanksgiving and Easter, if it's one thing we know how to do is feed people with panache!



St. Bart's The Food Pantry, More than Just a Meal

Our Food Pantry is so much more than a place to get a meal. Often, we meet individuals who come in seeking more than food—they're looking for a kind ear, a prayer, or simply someone who cares. It is a profound honor to be trusted with their stories and their needs, and it's a responsibility we hold close to our hearts.

We see people's spirits lift when they realize we're here not just to meet physical needs, but to affirm their worth as beloved children of God. No one is treated as "less than." Every person who walks through our doors holds value, and we strive to make sure they feel it.

Some of our clients have been visiting us for years now. We've watched children grow up, celebrated new babies, and rejoiced in the good things happening in their lives. We've also stood with families through cancer diagnoses and treatments, job losses, health challenges, and, this past year, we mourned the loss of a woman who had been a long-time off-and-on client. Relationships take root here. They grow, change, and deepen. Offering a bag of food is only a small part of what we do—there is so much more to it than that.

While I am able to come in during school holidays, the day-to-day operations are faithfully carried out by Betty, Joan, and Irene. I may be behind the scenes, but these ladies are the true heart and hands of our food pantry. They are remarkable, and I cannot imagine doing this without their steady ministry week after week. I may not get to connect with every family the way I once did, but each chance I do have feels like a gift—just as it is a gift to watch these women interact with those we serve.

Our Food Pantry is about nourishing both body and soul, and every person who comes through our doors becomes part of our family.


