

Teacher in Focus: Mr McHenry

How long have you taught in Rowandale?
I am now entering my 14th year teaching in
Rowandale IPS – where did the time go! I have loved
watching the school grow and flourish over the years
and have made many great friends along the way!
Rowandale is a very special place and I feel
privileged that my own children were able to attend
the school for a number of years.

What is your favourite memory of Year 7?
Where do I start! I have so many fantastic memories with teaching in Year 7 in Rowandale. For me, it has to be our annual trip to Corrymeela each year. The fun, the laughter, and the connections which are made with the children in Corrymeela will stick with me for a very long time. What do you enjoy most about teaching Year 7?

The club are currently unbeaten after 4 games and Sophie has scored an impressive ten goals during these games which has included three hat-tricks.




Her dad is her coach at the club and he is greatly impressed at her improvement over the last number of months.

Senán is smitten!




