THE BORDERPLEX REGION

- THE LABOR FORCE DECREASED BY 1,057 FROM THE PREVIOUS MONTH
- THE NUMBER OF EMPLOYED INDIVIDUALS DECREASED BY 1,096 FROM THE PREVIOUS MONTH
- THE NUMBER OF UNEMPLOYED INDIVIDUALS INCREASED BY 39 FROM THE PREVIOUS MONTH
- INDIVIDUALS WHO FILED FOR UNEMPLOYMENT DECREASED BY 332 FROM THE PREVIOUS MONTH
- THE TOP THREE UNEMPLOYMENT CLAIMANT OCCUPATIONS WERE PRODUCTION, OFFICE AND ADMINISTRATIVE SUPPORT

- EL PASO, TX MSA UNEMPLOYMENT WAS AT **5.2**% WITH A TOTAL OF **19,664** UNEMPLOYED INDIVIDUALS
- EL PASO, TX MSA ADDED **4,200** NONFARM JOBS SINCE AUGIUST 2022
- EL PASO, TX MSA LOST 1,200 NONFARM JOBS FROM THE PREVIOUS MONTH



The three Super Sectors with the least employment for the El Paso MSA in August 2023 were:


- 1. Financial Activities










UNEMPLOYMENT in August 2023











Of the **5,210** total Borderplex claimants, 9 are from the rural areas reflected on the data provided.

















UI CLAIMANTS DEMOGRAPHICS – BORDERPLEX REGION




