FESTIVAL HIGHLIGHT: REEL VOICES

Since 2005, Pacific Arts Movement's Reel Voices program has empowered high school students, providing them with the tools to learn the art of documentary filmmaking. Each summer, we engage students from diverse backgrounds in an 8-week intensive program, equipping them with invaluable storytelling skills and technological proficiencies, with the aim of inspiring the next generation of storytellers. Facilitate the curriculum, and hosted a

premiere with a reception during the festival.

In 2024, Pacific Arts Movement supervised a cohort of eleven high school-aged students who completed the Reel Voices program, resulting in the creation of eleven documentaries that premiered at the 25th San Diego Asian Film Festival. This year's cohort spent their summer forging new connections, fostering camaraderie, and acquiring tangible STEAM skills applicable to real-world scenarios. Additionally, they honed their public speaking abilities during Q&A sessions and enjoyed a max capacity screening!

Thanks to the generous support of our sponsors and foundations, Pacific Arts Movement provided each student with a \$500 stipend. Furthermore, we submitted their films to other festivals, enlisted instructors and aides to facilitate the curriculum, and hosted a premiere with a reception during the festival.

Youth Days, a cherished program by Pacific Arts Movement in its 18th year, offers students a free day of movies during the film festival, engaging over 700 students from 20 schools across San Diego County in 2024. Featuring student-made films, AANHPI cinema, and discussions with filmmakers, the program aims to inspire and educate while breaking down barriers to access diverse film experiences for youth in the region.
