Since its opening in 1894, The Woodward School has been empowering young women to realize their true potential and to discover their individual passions. Building on the success of our Woodward Senior Project, we are pleased to announce Impact Learning at Woodward, a challenging academic option for all Woodward Upper School Students beginning in the 2022-2023 academic year.

IMPACT Learning @ Woodward provides students with an immersive, hands-on, real-world learning experience. This innovative program consists of two consecutive weeks of either immersive learning on campus with a Woodward staff member, a supervised independent project, or an internship. After the second week, there will be built-in prep-time, followed by a symposium designed for the Upper School students to showcase their learning and articulate their experiences to our academic community.

PERFORMING *Arts*

CREATIVE EXPRESSIVE IMAGINATIVE

Through improv, script analysis and theatre games, students examine the craft of acting while exploring the various avenues an actor can take to create a polished and dynamic performance. Our students are provided opportunities to actively apply these techniques through group scenes, plays and even writing their own material.

Blue Hills Day

The Blue Hills Field Trip is a true Woodward tradition dating back to the early 20th century. If you are unfamiliar with the Blue Hills Reservation, it is a beautiful place to hike, ski, and explore. Each fall, our students hike through the Blue Hills and then convene for field games and a picnic lunch in their recreation area. This event allows our community to bond and have fun together during this time-honored tradition.

Presidential Wreath Laying

Each fall, on John Adams Birthday, one Woodward senior is selected as a speaker at the Annual Wreath Laying Ceremony in Quincy's Church of the Presidents.

The Ceremony is part of a national tradition established by President Lyndon Johnson in 1967. A Presidential Wreath is placed at the final resting place of all deceased Presidents on the anniversary of their birth. Each year, descendants of the Adams family, representatives from the Adams Historical Park, the Naval Operations Center in Quincy, the Mayor of Quincy, City and State Government members and citizens gather for this annual tradition.

Thanksgiving Feast

Woodward students and faculty gather each year for our Annual All Thanksgiving Feast, a beloved school tradition to celebrate the conclusion of Quarter 1 and to give thanks. Students coordinate their lunch by grade with the help of their advisors. Then everyone assembles in the auditorium to watch each class perform a different Thanksgiving-themed skit, ranging from fabulous dance routines to spoofs of TV game shows. Each grade prepares their performances over a period of weeks, and all participate with enthusiasm and a good dose of foolishness.

Winter Solstice

No Classes! Just fun! Students arrive in the morning and have a class breakfast together before gathering with the rest of the school later in the day for a Winter Solstice gathering that includes poetry readings and a selection of holiday songs sung by our Middle School students.

Science Fair

The Annual Woodward Science Fair is a significant part of our science curriculum. Held every year since the 1940s, the Science Fair fosters the science department's goal of guiding students to see the world from an observer's perspective. Students use scientific inquiry methods to critically analyze information and apply it to decisions they make about their immediate and global community.

Founders' Day

All winter, our students in the junior class are focused on writing their Founders' Paper, a thesis paper on one critical aspect of U.S. History. The Woodward School community gathers for our annual Founders' Day in March to celebrate the vision and legacy of the school's founders, Dr. Ebenezer and Mary Greenleaf Woodward.

In the evening, the entire school is invited to campus to celebrate the academic achievements of Woodward students. The program includes the National Honor Society Induction Ceremony, the Founders' History Paper Competition announcement, and student declamation performances.

Night of the Arts

Each spring, the Woodward Night of the Arts highlights student artwork from the entire school year. The art department hangs student art around the school similar to an art gallery. The show's highlight is often the art installation created by our National Art Honor Society (NAHS). A short ceremony inducting our newest members of the NAHS takes place on this special evening.

Graduation

Each year, Woodward's Graduation is held at the United First Parish Church in Quincy, also known as the Church of the Presidents or Stone Temple, established initially as a Parish Church in 1639.

In the church's lower level is the Adams Crypt, where John, Abigail, John Quincy, and Louisa Catherine Adams lay peacefully; this is also where our fall wreath-laying ceremony is held.

COLLEGE COUNSELING AT WSG



The College Counseling process at Woodward empowers our students to take the lead in deciding where they will go after graduation. The College Counseling Office works closely with each student to guide them individually through the search and application process, and to provide support, current resources and expertise in the world of college admissions. Students are encouraged to consider a range of options and taught how to develop college applications that reflect their individual passions, goals and talents. It is our goal to help each girl choose the path that is the right fit for her.

Beginning in grades nine and ten we work through the advisory program and individually in workshops and seminars to help students and families understand and utilize opportunities at Woodward to develop the narrative they will share with colleges during the application process. Each child is counseled on academic pathways, graduation requirements, and college and university requirements. In addition, time is spent discussing individual interests and talents, how to prepare for standardized testing, the importance of service learning and how to best use their free time to enhance their narrative.

By the midpoint of the Junior year, students are asked to schedule weekly individual meetings with the college counselor. Parents are also welcome to schedule meetings. At this time, we will begin to work on applications, develop testing timelines and strategies, and discuss all aspects of the admissions process including the personal essay, supplemental essays and college visits. Parent engagement is very important at this stage and Woodward will offer both group and individual family meetings in order to facilitate the process and answer questions. The administration and faculty know each student well which is evident in the recommendations. This serves our girls well as they apply to universities and for scholarships.



We believe that girls need a supportive environment filled with leadership opportunities that fosters community and experiential learning. Woodward girls empower themselves and others by stepping outside of their comfort zone and taking risks academically and socially. A Woodward education builds confidence and character which provides for a strong foundation for the next phase of their life journey.

Would you like to study in the US? Are you ready for a life-changing adventure? Would you feel most comfortable in a small school environment with individual attention from your teachers? Woodward has a long history of enrolling international students.

At The Woodward School, a student is mentored to be the best possible version of herself. Our all-girls environment allows you to take risks and explore new roles and fields within a sisterhood. Small class sizes ensure that you are known and empowered to be happy and successful.

Join a community of highly motivated students that seek a global perspective and values a multi-cultural, diverse student population. Here you can explore your creativity and ingenuity through classes in the Fine Arts, Theater, Computer Science while pursuing your academics through a rigorous, classic prep-school education.

Our campus is just 4 miles from Boston with easy access to public transportation. Logan International Airport is only 8 miles away. The Woodward School is located in the center of historic Quincy, Massachusetts. Both Quincy and Boston are home to diverse international communities. As a result, there are many international restaurants and shops to meet your needs.



Helping You Achieve

As an international student, you may have specific support needs. ESL classes are available to prepare your academic English skills for university education. Tutoring for College testing such as the SAT is available at the School. College counseling classes start in the 9th grade to find the university best suited for you.

COVID Protocols

The health and safety of our community is paramount to all of us at Woodward. During the height of the pandemic the precautions we took enabled us to avoid any transmissions on campus. With the advent of vaccines and boosters we continue to take every precaution to ensure that our community is safe and healthy and educating every girl in person.

Visa Information

Woodward School is authorized by SEVIS to issue an I20 form to our enrolled students. Prospective F-1 or M-1 students must have the financial resources to live and study in the United States. This includes being able to cover the cost of tuition, books, living expenses and travel. School officials must collect evidence of the student's financial ability before issuing an I20 form. A prospective student must have financial evidence showing that they or a sponsor has sufficient funds to cover tuition and living expenses during the period of intended study.

Evidence of financial ability includes but is not limited to:

- Family bank statements.
- Documentation from a sponsor.
- Financial aid letters.
- Scholarship letters.
- Letter from an employer showing annual salary.



Students must submit evidence of financial ability to the school in order for the school to issue the I20 form. Students must also bring their evidence of financial ability when applying for their student visa with the U.S. Department of State. It is also advised to have the evidence on-hand when entering the country at a U.S. port of entry, in the event a U.S. Customs and Border Protection officer asks to review it.

Once the school receives the evidence of financial ability and the signed enrollment contract, we will immediately issue an I20 form. You can apply for your student visa at the US Embassy or designated Consulate up to 120 days before you begin your studies at Woodward.

Housing

Woodward works closely with each international family to help provide housing options and health insurance for their students. Through the years we have had international students from all over the world. Upper School students may live with a host family in the local area or at a local boarding school depending on availability. We partner with organizations that will coordinate your living agreements and healthcare and act as a liaison between your host, your school, and your own family. Middle School age students must live with a parent or a legal guardian while attending Woodward.
