## message from

## PASTOR SARAH

Dear people of Our Savior's,

Just about eight months ago, I joined you to begin serving as Senior Pastor. Thank you for the warm welcome. I am meeting new people daily, and I look forward to meeting you and sharing in your stories.

The past months have been a season of "returning." We are returning to practices and habits put aside during the height of the pandemic. And yet: the truth is that life has always been a rhythm of separation and togetherness, exile and return. We may prefer the "return" bit, the "bring you back to this place" bit, but that doesn't mean separation isn't part of the story.

Experiences of separation are as old as the ancient stories of the Garden of Eden, the Israelites' exile in Babylon, and the parable of the Prodigal Son. Jesus and his followers were separated by betrayal and death, and then reunited by forgiveness and newness of life. Even on our most "normal" days, our lives are a rhythm of gathering and dispersing, hellos and good-byes.

This past year has been another profound experience of this ancient pattern, and as challenging as it has been, we can take solace in the knowledge that our ancestors, too, experienced seasons of exile. And here is the point: thanks to this history, over time our faith - and our church - has been built to help us live through such seasons with grace and hope.

At our core, Our Savior's is a community of reunion, homecoming, and return. Now more than ever, our congregation stands as a beacon of hope, welcome, and hospitality. Now more than ever, we are called to come together to be the body of Christ, reaching out and meeting people where they are at so that no one journeys alone.

This newsletter is full of invitations from ministry groups to come together as the heart and hands of Jesus. It also tells a story: the story of how, in this congregation, we tangibly experienced God's ancient promise to "give us a future with hope."

I will fulfill to you my promise and bring you back to this place. For surely, I know the plans I have for you, says God, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope. JEREMIAH 29:10-11

The answer is, on both counts, a resounding YES! For some people, the idea of being counted as a disciple is downright terrifying. Can we really find our names intermixed with the likes of Peter, James, and John – with Matthew, Andrew, and Philip? Those first disciples that Jesus invited to

follow are way out of our league, aren't they? Well, not so fast! Upon further review, those disciples were as human and flawed as we are. The truth of the matter is, if Jesus invited them to follow, why not you and me? If Jesus could mold and shape and teach them in the ways and grace of God, why not us? Pretty quickly our thinking moves from scary to inspiring – Jesus was able to take that first ragtag

group and change the world.

What if we began to think of ourselves as disciples of Jesus rather than simply as members of Our Savior's? As disciples, our primary relationship is with Jesus – and Our Savior's is the community of people with whom this relationship with Jesus is lived out and nurtured.

It may be a subtle shift, but it is one that invites us to move deeper and grow in the practices that mark us as disciples of Jesus: worship, prayer, study, service, generous giving, and sharing our experience. These practices not only help us grow in our relationship with Jesus, they strengthen our relationships with each other and open us up to new opportunities and ways of living as God's people.

Inspiring? Absolutely. Scary? That too. These are both embedded in the experience of placing our trust and our hope in God, who invites us to join in the work of caring for all of creation.

## OUR FAITH CAN MOVE MOUNTAINS

### OSLC YOUTH ST. LOUIS TRIP

This summer, June 23-27, our OSLC youth group took a service trip to St. Louis. Three adult leaders accompanied 11 students, from those entering 9th grade to those who just graduated high school.

The project they took on was in partnership with the Gateway Housing Service Project (GHSP), a ministry that makes homes accessible in the St. Louis metropolitan area.

"[The GHSP team] showed kids how to use the power tools; they showed kids how to build," youth leader Molly Neumann said. "I saw their heart for service."

Under the leadership of the GHSP team, the high schoolers built an accessibility ramp for a woman named Barb, who has gone between being hospitalized and being homebound for quite some time. She lives with her daughter Stella and will now be able to get in and out of the house much easier thanks to the hard work of our youth.

However, they did not stop there. Once the ramp was built, the group took up the task of cleaning up Stella and Barb's yard, which was covered in layers of "gumballs": spike-covered seeds from a sweetgum tree that get matted into the ground and can pose a tripping hazard. "There were like 500 layers of them, so I think we spent four hours raking them, just trying to get all of these gumballs up," high school graduate Grace Krueger said. "It was fun. It was hot, but it went pretty quick."

By the end of it, they had filled a trailer with yard bags, Neumann said. But they still wanted to do more. So, they bought some mulch and flowers to make a garden bed.

"They were just trying to think of anything that they could do to help brighten these people's day," Neumann said.

No matter how hot, tired, and sick of each other they got, the high schoolers always rallied, Neumann said. They found joy and opportunity even in the hard work of a service project.

The group also got the chance to have fun and explore the city. They took a riverboat ride and explored the Gateway Arch museum, the City Museum, and the St. Louis Zoo. They went to a Cardinal's game that even the non-sports fans among them were able to enjoy - despite the fact that the team lost! They helped prepare their meals, played card games, and ate pizza so good that they hope to replicate it at a pizza party after the trip.

The OSLC youth group unites high schoolers from all different schools and backgrounds to support each other and have fun together. The group is always open for any student to join in, find community, and feel safe.

## WHO ARE OUR PARTNERS?

### **Reformation Lutheran Church**



Our Savior's partners with Reformation Lutheran Church, located in the Milwaukee area, by connecting in faith and in support. We come together for Reformation's Good Friday Neighborhood Prayer Walk, annual fishing outings in Milwaukee and on Fowler Lake, and in open invitation to their Sunday worship services and community Bible studies. We provide backpacks and school supplies to graduates of their SALT (Serving and Learning Together) and ICE (Inspiring Children Everyday) summer programs for youth. **This summer, we sent 50 backpacks full of school supplies to Reformation**. We also help them with their Christmas gift giving program.

### **Promise for Haiti**



Our Savior's supports the Health Partners program within Partners for Haiti. **Through our sponsorship, some of the poorest families of Pignon, Haiti are able to obtain healthcare** at the hospital in Pignon as well as preventive care. OSLC has been sponsoring 10 families since early 2020. We hold fundraisers throughout the year, including a fall kringle sale and a winter wine tasting at Wine Maniacs. We hope to travel back to Pignon in 2023 to visit our sponsored families and strengthen our partnership. In addition, this fall we plan to further educate OSLC within the Sunday Bible School programs about each of our sponsored families and build upon our relationship with Promise for Haiti.

### **Family Promise**



Family Promise provides shelter, food, and support services to homeless families across the country. Our affiliate, Family Promise of Waukesha County, is based in downtown Waukesha and serves those in our community with the support of Our Savior's and other local churches. We not only help homeless families, but also provide emergency help for families at risk of losing their homes. **This quarter, we have helped 61 individuals stay in their homes and 19 homeless individuals to get the support that they need.** We invite you to join us in this partnership to provide meals and funding to help those experiencing homelessness in our community.

## MINISTRIES

### Diocese of Meru | Kikatiti & Kitefu

The Diocese of Meru, located between Mt Kilimanjaro and the Serengeti in eastern Africa, belongs to the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Tanzania and is in partnership with the Greater Milwaukee Synod. Within that partnership, Our Savior's engages in three global missions: a congregation partnership, an education partnership, and an economic partnership.

Congregation Partnership: Kikatiti and Kitefu are parishes within the Diocese of Meru. In 2007, Our Savior's began a partnership with them that committed us to pray for each other, get to know each other, and support each other. Our Savior's mission tithe generously supports these partnerships through joint projects for hunger, clean water, orphans, widows, those who are retired or disabled, women's ministry, health care, and social services. We were able to raise over \$5,000 for hunger relief during their time of drought this summer.

Education Partnership: In 2010, Our Savior's began supporting Kikatiti Secondary School through individual donations for student scholarships (YES), investment in teachers (LIFT), and facilities and supplies (TOOLS). As a result of this support, the pass rate has steadily increased, former students are returning as teachers, and the school is widely recognized as one of the most improved secondary schools. *Economic Partnership*: The Greater Milwaukee Synod has a partnership with the Mt. Meru Coffee Project, which buys, processes, and sells premium coffee. This project provides small Tanzanian farmers market access and price support for sustainable income to reduce poverty. It also provides training to over 2,000 farmers to improve their crop quality and yield.

## **MESSAGE FROM THE COUNCIL PRESIDENT**

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Many of my messages over the past couple of years have looked back at what has happened or looked ahead to the future of Our Savior's.

The future is now!

As we think about our church today, the way we worship, our time together in fellowship, and as we serve others outside our walls, I want you to think about our mission: to share the love of Christ to transform lives. There are three key elements to our mission:

- 1. The love of Christ
- 2. Sharing that love
- 3. Transfŏrming lives

Are those three elements in our lives today? Do those elements reveal themselves in our church life? I think that we all believe that Christ's love is in us, and that we experience that love in different ways throughout our lives.

Has Christ's love transformed us? That is a tougher question to answer, but if we take time to think about it, we can identify examples of how we have been touched and changed by Christ's love. Now for the more challenging part. Have we shared Christ's love? I imagine that we can point to circumstances where that has happened, but is that a regular occurrence? Are we intentional about it?

I think this is the first key element to being a vibrant community of faith: sharing Christ's love with one another and with those outside our church. Let's be intentional about it, reflecting on our days to understand where we have and have not shared Christ's love. Let's look for opportunities to share that love in ways that we may have ignored in the past. Let's celebrate, thanking God for when we experience Christ's love in our lives.

This fall, there will be a review of the visioning work that was done early last year. We will prioritize and confirm what we believe will be the most effective ways we can transform lives, but we can share Christ's love today and every day. The future is now.
