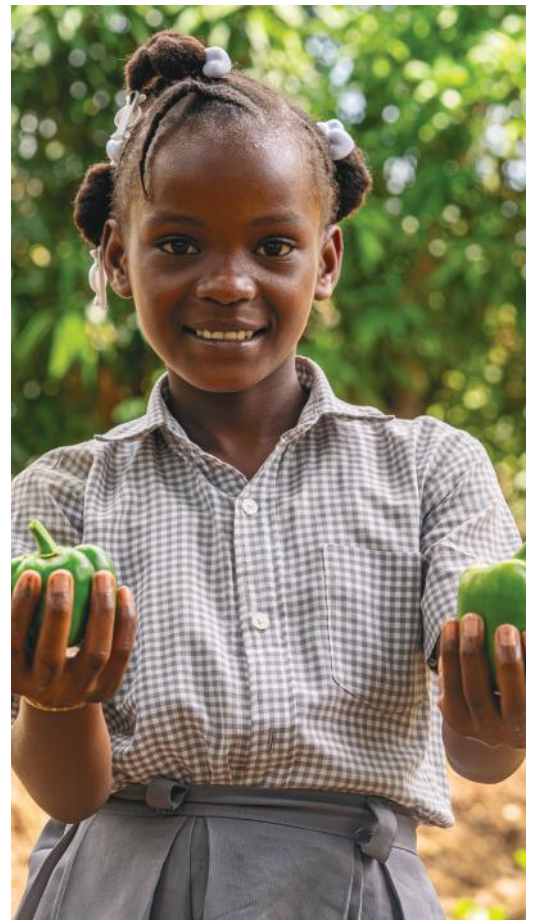

EDUCATION & CLEAN WATER (WASH)

School Improvements Spark Hope in Ricot

Located in the small community of Ricot, in Haiti's Southeast Department, Mont-Carmel School is one of Hope for Haiti's 24 school partners. Before our partnership, the school's building was severely deteriorated. Three makeshift classrooms struggled to accommodate more than nine grade levels (from Pre-K to 9th grade), creating extremely challenging conditions for effective learning. On rainy days, classes often had to be canceled. The school's tin roof was riddled with holes, causing water to pour directly into the classrooms.

Thanks to the work of Hope for Haiti and grant funding from the W.K. Kellogg Foundation, major improvements were made. Three brand-new classrooms were built, the roofs of the existing structures were fully repaired, and new doors were installed to better secure the learning spaces.

In addition, a sanitation block with private toilets and sinks for washing hands was constructed to meet the basic hygiene needs of students and teachers, significantly improving sanitation on campus. Hope for Haiti Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene (WASH) Technician Nahera Porcius provided lessons about proper hand washing and basic hygiene, empowering students to maintain a healthier school environment and to bring this important knowledge home.

Madame Antonine Cléovil, the school's principal, said, "Through this gesture, Hope for Haiti has not only helped expand our school, but also strengthened our hope for a better tomorrow."

In May, our team traveled to Ricot to officially inaugurate the new school block, and the entire community came together for this important celebration. The event was marked by songs, traditional dances, and inspiring speeches from the school director and local priest Father Cazeau Fagant, making it a truly memorable day.

"This new school building is more than a beautiful structure; it is a living symbol of opportunity and progress," said Father Père Cazeau Fagnant during the inauguration. "It represents the chance for more children to receive a quality education in a safe and dignified learning environment."

HEALTHCARE

A Child's Life Saved, A Community Forever Changed

In southern Haiti's remote communities, accessing medical care can be nearly impossible for families living in poverty, especially in an emergency. Hope for Haiti's Healthcare Referral Program helps patients with urgent conditions to get the treatment they need, saving dozens of lives each year.

Fifteen-year-old Zamy Cassami was diagnosed with a life-threatening intestinal obstruction at a local hospital. Unfortunately, her family, who rely on small-scale farming and trade for their income, could not afford the surgery the hospital's doctors recommended. They were forced to seek care for their daughter elsewhere.

By the time they arrived at our clinic, Zamy's condition was critical, and her family feared for her life. Thankfully, Hope for Haiti was able to help. Zamy was quickly transferred to a partner hospital, where she received a life-saving surgery she needed. That surgery, the medicine Zamy required, and all of her hospital care were fully covered by Hope for Haiti's Referral Program.

Today, Zamy is home, healthy, and smiling, surrounded by her family. Her story is a powerful reminder that access to quality healthcare saves lives. Hope for Haiti's healthcare programs ensures that quality care reaches those who need it most, bringing hope, healing, and second chances to communities throughout southern Haiti.

STRENGTHENING CARE THROUGH PARTNERSHIP

Partner Spotlight: Direct Relief

Hope for Haiti's Gift-in-Kind (GIK) program supports our healthcare programs and strengthens the existing medical supply chain in Southern Haiti by importing and distributing donations of medications, medical supplies, and biomedical equipment. Partnership is at the heart of the program, as donors come together with Hope for Haiti to meet the needs of patients in Haiti. The essential supplies they provide are then distributed to a network of 67 GIK healthcare partners throughout Southern Haiti. Last year, these GIK partnerships supported healthcare needs for nearly 1 million patients.

At 82 years old, Bernithe Aris has spent her life working hard to support herself and her family, and was one patient the GIK program helped. Raised in the rural community of Carien, she worked as a cleaner and in the fields, carrying on even after the loss of her only son. Today, maintaining her health is essential to her independence and well-being.

"My health is very important to me," Bernithe shares. "Most of my family has passed away, and I have only a few relatives left."

When a persistent cough left her weak and unable to work, a friend encouraged her to seek care at Dispensaire Kay Timoun Bondyé (DKTB) in Les Cayes. During her visit, clinicians identified low blood pressure levels and a urinary tract infection

and provided immediate treatment. For Bernithe, the impact was profound. "Today, I was able to see a doctor and receive medication," she says. "That has made all the difference."

The medical consultation, diagnosis, and free medication Bernithe received were made possible through Hope for Haiti's partnership with Direct Relief. Through that partnership, DKTB receives essential medicines, protective equipment, and medical supplies.

DKTB serves more than 1,400 patients each year, many of whom rely on donated supplies to access consistent, quality care. Through Direct Relief's generous support and Hope for Haiti's local partnerships, clinics like DKTB are equipped to treat common illnesses, manage chronic conditions, and respond to urgent health needs in underserved communities.

"I am very thankful to Hope for Haiti and the medication donations given to DKTB," Bernithe says. "They are helping people like me in the community."

Bernithe's story illustrates the power of the partnership, as Direct Relief and Hope for Haiti work together to strengthen local healthcare systems and ensure that life-saving care reaches those who need it most.

How Village Savings and Loan Associations are Empowering Women in Lièvre, Haiti

In Lièvre, a rural community in southern Haiti, fifty women in two Village Savings and Loan Association (VSLA) groups experienced a profound transformation in their lives. After a year of hard work in the VSLA program, they came together to distribute their cumulative savings of 1,099,550 Haitian Gourdes (equivalent to more than \$8,400), a remarkable achievement that has had a life-changing impact on their households and community.

These women cannot access formal banking services. Through the VSLA program, they were able to create their own safe and structured environment to save money and access small loans to invest in income-generating activities. Over the course of the year, as they built their savings, they also learned important financial skills, including budgeting and record-keeping.

Esther, a member of one of the groups, shared her story. “Before I joined the VSLA, I was struggling to support myself. I’m a teacher, but what I get in salary isn’t nearly enough for basic needs. Sometimes, I had to wait 2 or 3 months to receive my payment. Thanks to the loans I received from the group, I was able to develop my income-generating activity. This has enabled me to become financially autonomous and better able to plan my future.”

Participating in the VSLAs has both financially empowered these women and fostered a strong sense of community and solidarity among them. By pooling their resources and supporting one another, they have created a powerful means of overcoming financial challenges, such as providing for their children’s schooling, coping with medical emergencies, or sustaining their small farms through crop failures.

Nadine, another group member, expressed her gratitude for the program:

“The VSLA has given me the confidence to dream bigger. With my savings, I plan to start a small business, which will bring in a more stable income. This group has shown me that together, we can achieve much more than we could on our own.”

As the two groups celebrated the distribution of their savings, they began forming new goals and aspirations for the next cycle. Many of the women intend to invest their savings into small businesses, home improvements, or their children’s education, ensuring that the impact of their work in the VSLAs will extend far into the future.



A LEGACY OF GIVING

Honoring Former Board Chair, Mary E. Sommer, and Her Husband Jay Sandak

Leadership at Hope for Haiti has always been about stewardship—carrying forward a vision rooted in compassion, partnership, and lasting impact. Few have embodied that spirit more fully than The Honorable Mary E. Sommer (Ret.), who served as Board Chair from 2020–2025, and her husband, Jay Sandak.

Mary's tenure represented an important passing of the torch from the organization's founding Kuehner family to a new generation of leadership. Building on the legacy established by JoAnne M. Kuehner and carried forward by Tiffany Kuehner, Mary helped guide Hope for Haiti through a period marked by both extraordinary challenges and meaningful progress.

As Chair, Mary provided steady, values-driven leadership, strengthening healthcare and education programs, expanding access to clean water, and reinforcing sustainable pathways for families across southern Haiti. A devoted donor and advocate, she led with both professional expertise and deep personal commitment.

That commitment was shared by Jay Sandak. Through their relationship with the Herbert & Nell Singer Foundation Inc., a family foundation focused primarily on education, Mary and Jay helped secure vital grant funding to support Hope for Haiti's partner schools, creating lasting opportunities for thousands of children.

Mary and Jay's connection to Haiti is more than just professional. From their first visit to Les Cayes to the renewal of their wedding vows there, Haiti became part of their family story, shaping a

leadership approach grounded in respect for the resilience and dignity of the Haitian people.

As she concluded her term, Mary welcomed Dr. Vladimir J. Mathieu, a Les Cayes native and longtime humanitarian, as Hope for Haiti's new Board Chair. While stepping down from the role, she continues to serve on the Board of Directors and Capital Campaign Committee, helping advance plans for a new healthcare campus in southern Haiti.

“To everyone who has walked alongside us in this journey, thank you,” said Mary. “Hope for Haiti is not just an organization; it is a family. And though my title may change, my heart will always remain with this family and the people of Haiti.”

Mary and Jay's legacy is one of generosity, continuity, and hope, ensuring that the mission begun decades ago will continue to thrive for generations to come.

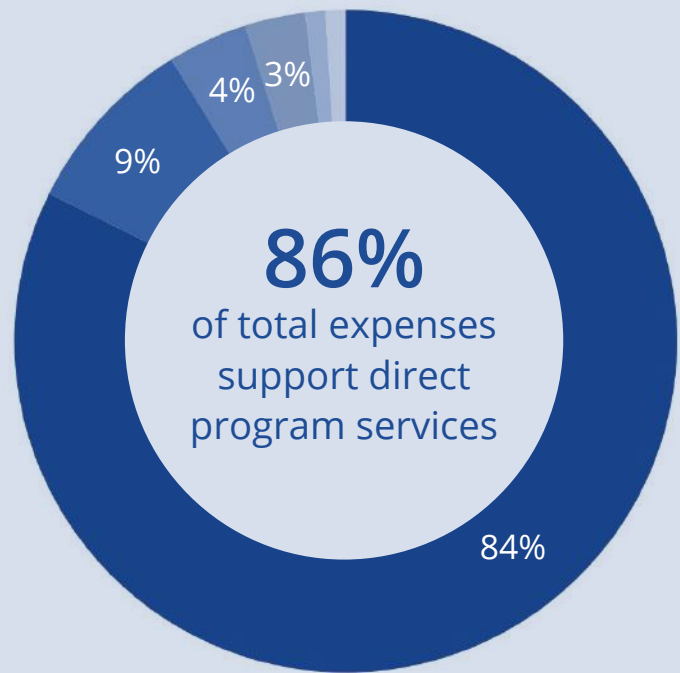


Fiscal Year 2025 Program Expenses Allocation
