

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ESSENTIAL STEPS IN THE PRE-CONSTRUCTION PHASE






Preparing Your Site

Timelines & Scheduling: Keeping Your New Build on Track

Once your plans have been consented and the contract is signed, we then work out the detailed schedule and put it into a Gantt chart in Buildaprice. This chart helps us plan each stage of the build, ensuring everything is completed in the right order and within the expected timeframe. Before this point, we will have already given you an estimated timeline, but this step refines it based on subcontractor availability, material lead times, and council processing.

Creating a Clear Schedule

To manage timelines effectively, we use a Gantt chart in Buildaprice. This visual timeline helps track each stage of the project, ensuring everything flows smoothly.

A Gantt chart includes:

- Key milestones (e.g., foundations, framing etc)
- Inspections
- Scheduling subcontractors

Common Causes of Delays & How to Avoid Them

- **Slow decision-making** Have your selections ready early to prevent supply delays. We will try to give you as much notice as possible when decisions are due.
- Changes to design mid-process Revisions can push out schedules.
- **Weather or material shortages** These are out of our control, but having buffer time in the schedule helps.

Contract Works Insurance: Why It's Essential

Contract Works Insurance protects your build from risks such as:

- Fire, theft, and vandalism
- Storms, flooding, and other weather events
- Accidental damage during construction
- Costs associated with project delays

We always arrange coverage for longer than expected to allow for unforeseen delays, including changes to scope, supply chain disruptions, pandemics, and adverse weather conditions. This ensures continuous protection even if your project timeline extends.

When Can You Get Full House Insurance?

You cannot get full house insurance until the project reaches Practical Completion or CCC (depending on your insurance provider)

- Practical Completion This means the home is substantially complete and ready for occupation, even if some minor defects or finishing touches remain. At this stage, you can move in, and responsibility for the home typically shifts to the homeowner.
- Code Compliance Certificate (CCC) This is issued by the council once they confirm that the building work meets all approved consents and regulations. It is the final approval confirming the build is legally compliant.

While Practical Completion allows you to take possession of the home, a Code Compliance Certificate (CCC) is needed for full legal sign-off. Some insurers may require CCC before offering full home insurance, while others may accept Practical Completion. It's always best to check with your insurance provider.



Preparing Your Site for Construction

1. Site Fencing & Security

Establishing a secure perimeter around the construction site is needed for safety and compliance. Temporary fencing helps prevent unauthorized access, protects pedestrians, and secures materials and equipment. Depending on the location and scope of the project, additional security measures such as locks, surveillance cameras, or site lighting may also be considered.

2. Delivery of a Portaloo and Site Office/Storage

Providing essential on-site facilities ensures a functional and compliant worksite:

- Portaloo (Temporary Toilet): Required for worker welfare, ensuring hygiene and meeting health and safety regulations.
- Site Office/Storage: A designated space for plans, documents, and secure tool storage, keeping the site organized and protecting valuable materials from weather or theft.

3. Placement of a Bin for Waste Management

Construction projects generate a significant amount of waste, and having a dedicated bin on-site helps manage this efficiently. Waste segregation may also be implemented to separate recyclable materials from general waste, supporting environmentally responsible building practices. Regular waste removal ensures the site remains tidy and free of hazards.



4. Ensuring Clear Access

Proper site access is critical for smooth operations. This involves:

- Ensuring driveways and pathways remain unobstructed for tradespeople, delivery vehicles, and machinery.
- Establishing designated parking and unloading zones.
- Protecting surrounding properties and public spaces from potential disruptions.

5. Setting Up Health and Safety Measures

- Signage: Clear safety signs indicating hazards, restricted areas, and emergency procedures.
- Hazard Identification: Assessing risks and implementing controls to prevent accidents.
