Using Your School's IDSR to Inform Intervention Strategy

Following the February 2027 release of the updated Inspection Data Summary Report (IDSR), this session will support school leaders to reflect on the effectiveness of previous interventions and plan forward with clarity. Although the IDSR focuses on outcomes for pupils who have left primary school (typically the previous Year 6 cohort), it provides valuable insights into the impact of a wide range of past interventions – not only academic, but also those addressing attendance, behaviour, and the progress of key groups such as disadvantaged pupils and those with SEND.

Session focus:

- Understanding how to use the IDSR effectively to review past interventions
- Exploring trends in attainment, progress, attendance, and vulnerable groups' outcomes
- Comparing IDSR findings with internal evaluation and intervention records
- Identifying successful strategies and recognising where adjustments are needed
- Planning the next cycle of academic and pastoral interventions based on evidence
- Ensuring intervention planning is integrated into wider school improvement work, not seen in isolation.

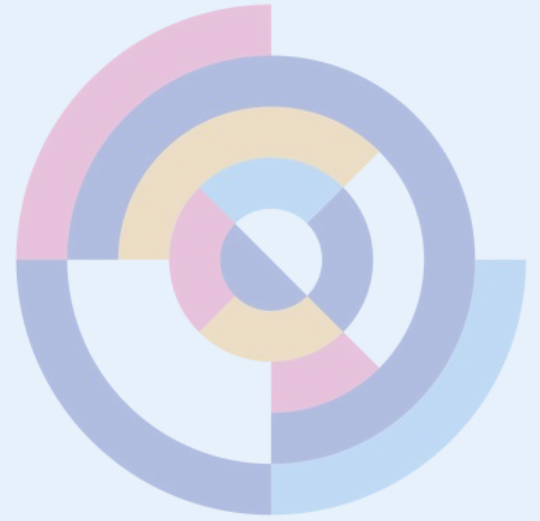

Differentiated Progressive Self-Regulation Development and Intervention

This session will explore what self-regulation is with reference to Polyvagal Theory and the Window of Tolerance. We will discuss why many children struggle with zones of regulation as it requires pupils to self-regulate, understand emotional states and associate colours with these. The session offers reflection on current research into Neuroception for those not yet ready for self-reflection. The training concludes with two practical intervention sessions – including story massage and the use of playdough as a tool for regulation.

We ask that if you are able to have two colours of playdough to hand this will aid you in following the intervention part of the session!

Reflective Conversations After a High Level Incident

This training equips Teachers and TAs with strategies to hold effective reflective conversations with pupils following high-level behaviour incidents, with a focus on supporting learners with SEND. The session will explore behaviour as communication, considering how autism, ADHD, SEMH needs, and communication difficulties can influence triggers and responses.

The course will outline:

- Adapting reflection for a non-verbal pupil using visuals, or breaking down language into short, clear steps for a pupil with processing delays
- Participants will learn how to use restorative approaches and de-escalation techniques while maintaining consistent boundaries
- The course refers to visual examples such as social stories, the Zones of Regulation, or “Now, Next, then” prompts – to guide discussions in accessible ways

Reflective Conversations After a High Level Incident

Supervision has many benefits, but a key one in terms of staff wellbeing is that it reduces the feeling of being alone in managing a problem.¹ Creating a coaching culture in schools can, ‘create positive and supportive organisational climates for personal and organisational growth’ as well as fostering a, ‘way of being, where students and educators flourish.’²

The group becomes the coach. In the session we unpack a live professional challenge. Through a structured “double-loop” framework, participants split their time between:

- Case supervision
- Live skill-building
- The group becoming the coach.

The Practice Circle enables teachers and leaders to move from ‘fixers’ to coaches, staff feel supported through peer supervision, and participants develop practical coaching skills to bring into school, maximising their impact, improving communication and elevating practice.

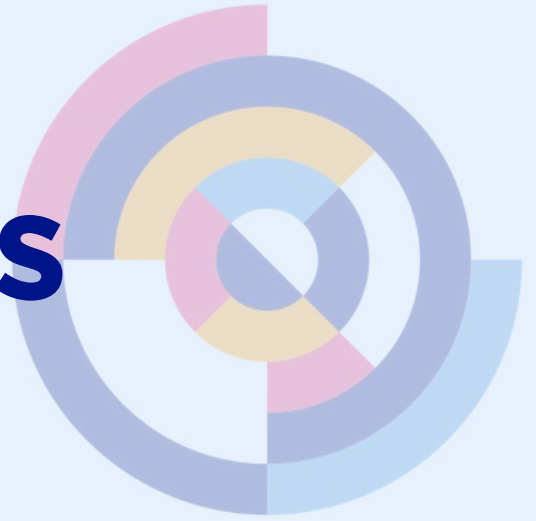

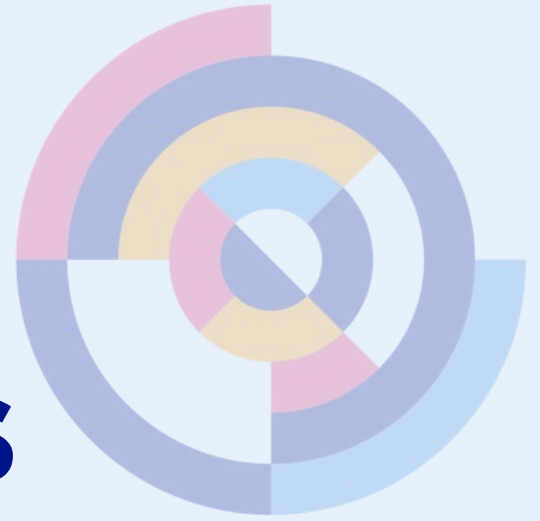
