This show is being performed by kids who have been deprived of the chance to participate in many normal school activities for the past year. They're eager to get back out there to make music and memories together, in whatever form that takes. Tonight's show may not have the same bells and whistles we are accustomed to, but it does have heart.

When the time came to choose songs for this musical revue, I was excited, but also overwhelmed. How am I going to choose JUST 18-20 songs from the entire Broadway repertoire!? It's so vast and there are so many great songs to choose from that I didn't know where to begin. I decided I needed some sort of theme to help narrow my choices down. Then the

idea came to me: all the songs I chose should be representative of the teenage experience. Oftentimes, high school aged students are cast in roles with which they have little to no connection. How does a 15-year-old embody the life of a 50-year-old with 5 children?! I guess the short answer is "acting", but this time around I wanted to give the cast a more immediate connection. Throughout this show, they will be performing music that they can really relate to. Each song has been carefully chosen to reflect their day-to-day life: the ideas of growth and finding your purpose; moments of rebellion and angst; young and innocent love; and finally, acceptance and hope.

I would like to thank everyone for joining us for this performance of A Little More Homework, a show that I hope–especially after this past year–lets our phenomenal cast be teenagers a little while longer.
