MATRIARCHS AND MELODIES

OPERA, INDIGENOUS

On National Indigenous Peoples Day celebrate Indigenous music through a blend of classical and contemporary works featuring arias by Métis composer lan Cusson, selections from Louis Riel and evocative pieces by Serbian-Canadian composer, Ana Sokolović. Emma Pennell, one of Canada's rising opera stars, brings the depth of her expressive soprano voice to each piece, reflecting both personal and cultural narratives.

CLASSIC SOUL AND JAZZ

Ready to dance? With the lush arrangements and vocals setting the tone, this will be a night to remember with classic hits by Al Green, Donny Hathaway, Luther Vandross, The Temptations, The Commodores, Smokey Robinson, Lou Rawls, among many other iconic male soul vocalists — all blended with classic crooning and swinging jazz standards.



SONGS OF FAITH, HOPE AND LOVE GOSPEL, INSPIRATIONAL

Enjoy inspirational music and gospel from Canadian Mezzo Soprano, Melissa Davis. As a dynamic concert soloist, she has played principal roles in many concert and opera productions throughout Canada, the United States, Europe and the Caribbean. Expect a moving three-part setlist comprised of hymns and other songs borrowed from the oral traditions of the African-American culture, like "My God is So High," "His Name So Sweet" and "I Go to the Rock."



SOUNDS OF STORIES

INDIAN FUSION

A blend of Indian classical and jazz, Sounds of Stories features a trio of musicians improvising instrumental music that moves through spoken word poetry, drawing on a range of musical genres to guide stories through live music. Merging pre-recorded poetry by various poets in multiple languages, the accompanying music explores the intersection of sound and story, crafting a unique auditory experience that spans emotions.

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TAKE ME TO THE DANCE?

WESTERN CLASSICAL, FOLK

Escape to the night clubs of Buenos Aires and the cabarets of Montmartre with this powerhouse duo. Bruno-Bridge is a powerhouse violin and accordion duo on stage, giving a mysterious and musical escape into the clubs of Spain and the Moulin Rouge cabarets of Paris. Come to hear romantic favourites alongside new works that will leave you feeling a warm nostalgia and the urge to dance.



SONGS OF BIRDS AND LOVE

EUROPEAN RENAISSANCE

A delightful program of music from the English and French Renaissance with madrigals, rounds, chansons and instrumental music from Ravenscroft, Weelkes, Richafort, Vautor and others, performed with combinations of voices, lute and flutes. Explore love's many expressions and nature's many gifts – perfect for an evening in the Music Garden!



WILD STRINGS AND TUNING THINGS

CONTEMPORARY MODAL

Enjoy an afternoon in the Music Garden, featuring a distinctly Toronto-diverse trio of musicians. This trio of Labyrinth Ensemble musicians will explore a repertoire acquired over four years of study with expert musicians Âriâ Mohâfez, Maliheh Moradi and Evgenios Voulgaris. Pieces from Iranian, Turkish, Arabic and the contemporary modal repertoire will be presented, interspersed with solos from each performer showcasing the technical prowess and sonic richness of modal improvisation.



BAROQUE-MIDDLE-EASTERN-CYBERPUNK

BAROQUE, MIDDLE-EASTERN, ELECTRONIC

Palestinian-Canadian pianist and composer John Kameel Farah melds sound, traditions and technologies with synthesizers and electronics. Moving freely between improvisations, soundscapes and driving beats and rhythms, referring to his unique genre of music as "Baroque-Middle-Eastern-Cyberpunk."

STOLEN DANCES

FLAMENCO

A unique blend of poetry, melody and the unmistakable rhythmic heartbeat of flamenco where four artists share the adrenaline on stage with a mix of heritage and contemporary music that will define this free and poetic performance. Joining Mariana Collado onstage will be local talents Benjamin Barrile on guitar, Ana Lía on vocals and Chendy Leon on percussion.

ALTERNATIVE CHORAL

Join us for a joyful evening of playful rounds, yodelling and enchanting medieval music. Comprised of some of Toronto's most talented and creative vocalists, The Local Singers go beyond traditional a cappella singing, and pay tribute to the awesome power of the human voice.



JOURNEY

PAN-AFRICAN DRUMMING & DANCING

Marvel at the intergenerational Ngoma Ensemble as they drum and dance their way across the African diaspora. *Ngoma*, meaning drum and dance in Swahili, is a virtuosic multi-generational dance ensemble, embracing their African ancestry with contemporary hints of Afrobeat, tap dance, congas and percussion.



THE STRING'S THE THING

EARLY BAROQUE, MODERN JAZZ

From the masterful work of J.S. Bach to the sonic worlds of Brazil, Brubeck and beyond, violinist Mark Fewer transports his audience into mesmerizing soundscapes, accompanied by Nathan Hiltz on guitar and Joseph Phillips on bass.



CELTIC AND CANADIAN

WOODLAND FOLK

Lo & the High Road is a Celtic-inspired, five-piece folk band that mixes traditional folk music and originals. Blending folklore and forest fantasy, tap your toes to favourite Celtic tunes and new Canadian music.

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MEMORIES THROUGH SONG

ALTERNATIVE POP, OPM (ORIGINAL PILIPINO MUSIC)

Featuring original songs, Filipino classics and reimagined arrangements, this concert is an exploration of memories through song and sound brought to life by Belinda Corpuz and a band of some of Toronto's best musicians.

WHAT IS TIME FOR?

INDIE POP. EXPERIMENTAL

A deeply personal performance from two of Canada's most striking creative musicians: JUNO-nominated artist Tara Kannangara and Chris Pruden perform a set of original songs using sharp lyricism, synthesizers, a drum machine and wild trumpet melodies.

ENSEMBLE JENG YI BY THE WILLOW TREE

TRADITIONAL KORFAN

Ensemble Jeng Yi will perform a program featuring traditional pieces and original compositions for Korean percussion. They will be joined by frequent collaborator Joo Hyung Kim on the Kayagum, the Korean zither. Ensemble Jeng Yi will begin the performance not on the stage, but at a distance, from where they will approach, drumming and marching, in the spirit of itinerant bands of old Korea.
