

Thank you for continuing to celebrate the soul of Porsche, on and off the track.




Hi Edward,

9-1-1 in my Porsche 911

From a precision sports car to an emergency bird transport.

love my Porsche. It's my car, not my husband's. It was a birthday present 12 years ago. I'm the only one who drives it. It's not a farm truck, not a grocery getter, and definitely not meant for transporting wildlife. But sometimes, life has other plans.

Living out in the country on our acreage, we're used to seeing all sorts of wildlife - deer wandering through the fields, eagles soaring overhead, and the occasional coyote in the distance. But what my husband saw that day was something entirely unexpected.

One afternoon, he was outside when he spotted something large flying low through the air and then crashing hard into our fence. Concerned, he walked over to investigate and found, to his surprise, a stunned and motionless Loon lying on the ground. We don't have lakes nearby, so how or why it ended up here was a mystery.

By sheer luck, a friend of ours - who happens to be a veterinarian - had just stopped by. He helped carefully lift the bird into a box, adding a shallow dish of water to keep it hydrated. After a quick assessment, he told us the loon was injured and needed professional care. He suggested taking it to a wildlife sanctuary.

I immediately called the closest one, only to find out that they don't take birds. Desperate for a solution, we

searched online and found a woman known for rescuing injured animals. She was willing to take the loon but advised us to try the Langley Animal Emergency Clinic of the Fraser Valley first, as the bird was awake but still not moving.

With no time to waste, we carefully placed the box in my 1998 Porsche 911 Carrera 993, and I headed straight for the clinic. I'm sure it's not every day that a loon rides in a sports car, but that's how this one made its way to medical attention.

My Porsche had officially gone from a precision sports car to an emergency bird transport - and it handled both jobs flawlessly. Maybe not what Porsche had




in mind when they built the 993, but hey, a car like that is always up for an adventure!

The emergency clinic took the bird in right away. After some X-rays, they confirmed it had a damaged wing and head trauma, likely from its unfortunate collision with our fence. The vets had an interesting theory - loons are usually found near water, and they suspected that the bird mistook our shiny barbed wire for a lake and tried to land. They also mentioned that the loon quickly became the most expensive patient at the hospital because it refused to eat anything but live minnows.

Months went by, and I often wondered what had happened to the bird. Then, one day, I got a call from the bird sanctuary in Richmond. They told me that they had cared for the loon until it fully recovered and successfully released it back into the wild.

So, in the end, I had a 9-1-1 in my 911.





A great way to keep your Porsche in top shape.

n January, I had the fortunate opportunity to receive a free Classic Porsche Inspection offered by Porsche Center Richmond (PCR). This is a relatively new program offered by Porsche to provide a comprehensive multi-point inspection of classic cars (15 years or older) to assess condition and report any concerning areas requiring attention. The cost of the inspection varies by dealer, so you can check with your local Porsche Center for more information.


My experience with PCR during the process was courteous & professional right

from the start. Scheduling my appointment slot was easy and done over text, and PCR had a loaner available for me when I dropped my 2000 911 off the evening before my scheduled appointment. Everyone I met during the process went out of their way to take care of me as a customer.

I returned to pick up my car the following evening, where the PCR Workshop Manager Robin Varley met me and went over the 131-point inspection thoroughly. Robin walked me around my car (which they had just finished washing

& vacuuming) and helpfully pointed out a few minor issues that needed attention (burned-out lights) and others that he suggested keeping an eye on. Afterwards, he generously offered me a tour of his garage facilities and thanked me for bringing in my car. The full inspection documentation package arrived via e-mail 24 hours later.

Overall, I would recommend this service to anyone with a classic Porsche or anyone considering buying a classic Porsche as a PPI option. PCR & Robin specifically were top notch!



Passionate about PPF

Protect your Porsche for years, not months.

hen visiting Tiago's Auto Spa in Vancouver's Mount Pleasant district, you can feel the passion for paint protection film (PPF) during a workshop for CWR members. They firmly believe that specialized skills and quality materials are vital for delivering the best protection for your Porsche.

In March, co-owners Tiago Da Cunha and Johnson Li welcomed 30 members to their auto spa to showcase their film installation techniques. Despite the rainy, grey Saturday morning, the enthusiasm of both the members and the co-owners remained high throughout the two-hour presentation.

The technical workshop began with a demonstration of cutting film for a front bumper using a Graphtec cutting machine. This equipment produced a long sheet of film with several vehicle bumper cutouts.

At Tiago's, the film thickness measures eight mil, although this can vary by manufacturer, typically ranging from eight to 10 mil. To provide some perspective, the clear coat layer of paint on a brand-new car is about six to seven mil thick, while a piece of newspaper is roughly three mil thick.

Invented in the 1990s by 3M, PPF was

initially developed for the US military to protect helicopter blades from debris. Originally referred to as "helicopter tape," its self-healing properties enabled it to withstand numerous impacts and chips, improving air safety.

As an Elite Dealer of XPEL PPF products, they take pride in using XPEL, which has an impressive 10-year manufacturer's warranty. Additionally, they support their installation craftsmanship with a lifetime guarantee for peace of mind. 
The yellowing of film is a relic of the past, as advancements over the years have made the film more stain-resistant and transparent with reduced orange peel. Over time, the film will incur damage from years of wear, but once you peel away the invisible layer of protection, your original paint surface remains almost like new, as if it were frozen in time.

The second half of the presentation took place in the workshop at the back of the building, where they demonstrated their film application techniques. Participants learned that applying film to the curves of Porsche front fenders poses the greatest challenges of any vehicle and demands extensive experience. When the film is stretched on the surface, the opposite side of the sheet reacts to the pressure. Taigo mentioned that "Porsches are the most challenging vehicles to wrap."

Old soul, new tricks

An Ünstock 911 story.

f you've seen a 1977 black 911S with the plate "OEM-ISH," give me a wave! The plate reflects the build - true to Porsche's DNA but with a few tweaks.

This 911S was previously owned by Greg Bismeyer, a longtime PCA-CWR member, and had already been modified when I got it. Under the decklid sat a 2.7L flat-six from a 1973 911T-a fantastic starting point, but I wanted more.

Refining the formula

A classic 911 doesn't need a reinvention, just the right upgrades. The 7R engine case, the strongest of the magnesium cases, was machined at Ollie's Engineering for durability. The engine was then completely rebuilt with PMO carburetors, Euro Carrera pistons and cylinders, racing cams, and a race exhaust, improving response and power while preserving the car's raw, analog feel.

The 915 transmission received a proper refresh. Guard short gears sharpened acceleration, while a limited-slip differential improved traction. A Wevo gate shift kit and JWest Engineering short

shifter transformed shifting from vague and notchy to crisp, mechanical, and deeply engaging.

At just under 2,200 lbs. with 230 hp, the car now boasts a power-to-weight ratio on par with the legendary 1973 Carrera RS 2.7 Lightweight.

Driving it like it was meant to be driven

Specs only tell part of the story; what really matters is how this 911 feels. It's light, connected, and alive, turning every drive into a symphonic event.

Like any classic 911, it rewards precision. Slow in, fast out isn't just a mantra; it's a necessity. Push too hard into a corner, and the rear will remind you who's in charge. But get it right-trail brake smoothly, settle the chassis, roll into the throttle early-and it slingshots out of the apex, the rear tires clawing at the tarmac. The R-compound tires don't hurt!

Over the past year, I've put over 11,000 km on it, taking it on rallies and road trips. The longest? A planned run to Rennsport Reunion 7 in California, until an electrical gremlin sidelined the 911.

The trip continued in a Kia Soul, which was...not quite the same. But if anything, the experience only fueled my desire for more seat time.

More than the cars-the people

This build has never been just about performance—it's about the people. Late nights in the garage, road trips that turn into stories, and the shared passion that makes every mile more meaningful.

I share that passion with my wife, who's just as much a petrol head as I am. Now, we're building a hot-rod classic Mini for her, because every great driver deserves a car that fits their style. For me, that car is this 911—built to be driven, enjoyed, and pushed on the back roads, just as Porsche intended.

Safe to say, this one is staying in the stable for a while.



Let's talk fuel

ary an opportunity goes by where gathered car enthusiasts leave out a spirited conversation around gasoline. Every owner will voice their preferred brand & grade, all whilst touting the virtues of their chosen propellant. But just how important are our cherished beliefs and theories around fuel? Let's first start by understanding what happens inside our engines during combustion.



Normal combustion is the burning of an air/fuel mixture in the combustion chamber. Normal combustion begins with the flame originating at the spark plug and traveling outward evenly and steadily throughout the combustion chamber. It is very much like blowing up a balloon. As you blow, the balloon expands away from the source of air in a very controlled and even fashion. In a perfect world, the combustion event burns up all the air and fuel in the cylinder, leaving none behind (this is called a stoichiometric mixture).

A common misconception about combustion is that there is an explosion involved. This simply isn't true...once the spark plug ignites the mixture, the flame fills the cylinder in a very quick, yet very controlled manner. The expansion of the flame creates the downward pressure on the piston thus creating torque. If our engines are maintained regularly and running optimally, normal combustion creates peak performance and minimal wear. If normal combustion is not taking place, this is where we begin to see problems.

Detonation (Knock or Ping)

Detonation occurs after normal combustion has been started by the spark plug. Normal combustion expands out, but the gasses on the edge of the flame compress and begin combusting spontaneously. This is most likely caused by excess heat and pressure. The most important thing to remember about detonation, though, is that it occurs after the flame has been initiated by the spark plug.

There are many factors that come together to create a scenario for detonation to occur. While engine design and fuel octane play a significant role, the most common factor is too much spark

advance. Overly advanced ignition timing sets the burn off too soon, allowing pressure to increase too quickly. This is a very high/very sharp pressure spike, and this is what often brings about engine damage.


With detonation also comes heat. You will see higher engine temperatures because the cooling system is having to absorb the excess heat.

Pre-Ignition

Pre-Ignition is the ignition of the air/fuel mixture before the spark plug fires. The fuel air mixture enters the combustion chamber as the piston is on its downward intake stroke.

The piston then returns upward for the compression stroke. The more compressed the mixture is,

the more difficult it is to ignite it. With the piston on the low side of the compression stroke, the mixture is actually easier to ignite than when it gets closer to Top Dead Center (TDC). A hot spot in the cylinder, such as a carbon buildup, can ignite this low compression mixture very early, before the spark plug fires. Now the upward motion of the piston



is fighting the combustion force that is expanding. This adds a tremendous amount of heat and load to the engine, and for this reason, pre-ignition is responsible for much higher cylinder pressures than detonation.

There are no early warning signs with pre-ignition. The best thing you can do to prevent it is to make sure the engine

is maintained properly to minimize potential carbon buildup. From the factory, newer vehicles are equipped with electronic sensors to detect pre-ignition, which will trigger a check engine light.



Now that we understand how combustion works inside our engines, we can discuss fuel properties and its various impacts on combustion.

Octane

Fuel octane rating is a measure of a fuel's ability to resist detonation. The octane requirement of an engine varies with compression ratio, mechanical considerations, and operating conditions. The higher the octane number, the greater the fuel's resistance to detonation during combustion. Although octane can be labeled similarly at the pump, there can be many differences between brands simply by formulation. Some use ethanol to achieve the desired octane, and others may use a combination of chemicals like isooctane in conjunction with ethanol. The end result is the same, but achieved differently. It should be noted that all gasoline now sold in British Columbia contains a percentage of ethanol...and yes, that includes Chevron 94. Marine & farm gas

are the only exceptions under updated regulations of the Clean Air Act that took effect in 2024.

Ethanol: Hero or Villain

Much malaise has been heaped on ethanol over the years...some for good reason, and others via rumors and hearsay. In its basic form, ethanol burns cleaner and more completely than gasoline but contains roughly 30% less energy than gasoline. When ethanol is blended with gasoline, the reduced energy density is barely perceptible and would have little impact on vehicles driven on public roads. Cleaner & cooler burn temperature properties are where eth-

anol shines. Reducing carbon build-up inside your combustion chamber is paramount to engine longevity.

The downside to ethanol is its propensity to absorb water from air. Ethanol blended gasoline requires fuel stabilizer in any vehicle or equipment that sits for extended periods of time. My rule of thumb is two to three

months without stabilizer is acceptable, but anything after that should have the gasoline treated. Ethanol also had a bad reputation for degrading fuel system rubber components, but this was mostly related to owners not keeping up with good maintenance practices on older (pre-90's) vehicles. Any rubber components in a fuel system that are 15+ years old should be subject to intense scrutiny,

> regardless of the fuel type used. The older a vehicle is, the more diligence required.

Fuel Additives

Additives are the arena that fuel retailers love to spar in. This is the area they focus on to drum up brand loyalty and spawn product ambassadors. Additives do play an important

role in maintaining your fuel system components and overall engine health, but pitting one premium brand fuel supplier against another is virtually meaningless. You will notice I used the phrase "premium brand fuel supplier" because these are the companies that consistently adhere to a set of standards regarding fuel additives, not a reference to the marketing of high-octane gasoline sometimes labeled as "premium gas". In the USA, Top Tier is often quoted to reference premium brand fuel suppliers. The trick with all marketing is understanding what the words mean and how they are applied to the product.



Eventually, over time, carbon builds up in all engines mainly because of the impurities in gasoline. Premium Brand or Top Tier fuels will prolong the process but not eliminate it. The main difference with these fuels is the additives (detergents and cleaners) that are used to reduce carbon build up. When enough carbon buildup occurs, this effectively raises the combustion chamber pressure and introduces potential hot spots. Once at this stage, a thorough fuel system service to clean the components (e.g. throttle body, intake manifold, fuel injectors, combustion chambers, etc.) is recommended. Most people don't realize this is happening until the symptoms of pre-ignition are present and by that time an off the shelf fuel system cleaner generally is not enough to help.

Good Practices

So, what do we do with the knowledge learned in this discussion? Do we need

to rethink our beliefs around fuel & suppliers? Should I continue to advocate for my favorite petrol peddler? To be honest, if you are currently filling your tank with the correct octane fuel for your car at premium branded stations and drive your vehicle at least weekly, your fine! Keep up the good work! If you regularly store your vehicle for longer than 3 months and are not using a stabilizer then do read up about it and implement a routine. If you find yourself in the middle of nowhere with an empty tank and the only option is an independent fuel retailer don't sweat it as one fill-up won't create any catastrophes between your usual tanks at XYZ. If you are constantly on the hunt for the cheapest offerings and regularly fill up at Pete's Petrol or Gary's Gas Shack then I

suggest re-thinking your strategy ASAP. This may seem like a good idea but the instant gratification will trigger a price to pay down the road.

For those of you choosing to add offthe-shelf fuel additives regularly, this isn't necessarily a bad thing, but it might not be providing you with the results you are expecting either. It's best to understand what you are adding and why before outlaying the cash. Do your research and ask questions, there is loads of data out there to digest. Many will call off-the-shelf fuel additives snake oil, while others label them piece of mind. It's safe to say you're unlikely to create any harm by using them, but you might not be getting a lot of value either. Knowledge is power!

Summary

The topic of fuel can be a sensitive as politics, money, and...well let's just leave it at that. Pick your premium purveyor of petrol and follow good maintenance practices is my motto. Does that mean never filling up elsewhere? Certainly not! Vehicle manufacturers design & build our cars to perform reliably in varying situations and environments, so don't chase your favorite brand all over town in the name of sanity. Relax, follow good maintenance practices, and resist to urge to stir it up in your friendly fuel fracas!

Porsche marks fifty years of adventure

This 917 cruised the picturesque boulevards of Paris.

unique Porsche 917 race car departed from the Weissach development center on April 28, 1975. Unlike any previous 917, this vehicle was destined not for the racetrack but, for the first time ever, it was driven on public roads. It was an audacious adventure driven by the passion of a private owner and the commitment of a small team within Porsche to fulfil the wishes of customers, no matter how outlandish the request.

Fittingly, that first exploratory drive did not end after a prudent cruise around local roads, but when the car reached Paris-several hundred miles later. It was a feat that would go on to inspire many more adventures in the decades that would follow.

The car-917 chassis 30-which was

originally raced, featured an array of changes that dominated endurance racing in the early 1970s. Some of the enhancements were mandated by the laws of the time, and others at the request of its owner-Italian businessman and Martini heir Gregorio Rossi di Montelera-known more simply as "Count Rossi", a renowned Porsche enthusiast.

Finished in Martini Silver, the car featured a set of rudimentary exhaust mufflers, additional mirrors, side indicators and even a horn. It carried the mandatory spare tire beneath its rear clamshell. Inside, there were small concessions to comfort-the two seats (a requirement for endurance racers of this period) were re-finished in tan leather (commissioned from Hermes) with accompanying suede surfacers for the

roof lining, doors and dashboard. The gear shifter retained the same wooden finish as the racers, and even kept the same drilled, lightweight key. The car originally wore an Alabama license plate obtained by Count Rossi.

Today, the car is still enjoyed by its enthusiastic current owner on the open roads in the south of France, where it resides-now registered in the U.K. and having undergone recent restoration work (albeit preserving its original paint and interior) to prepare it for its next half century of surprising other road users. Importantly, as its descendants enjoy success on the track today, the spirit and desire within Porsche that allowed the creation of a 917 for the road all that time ago remains very much alive five decades on, prompting the question: what if?


