A Message from the Principal

I have loved my first year at Saint Ignatius' College Riverview. It has been a genuine blessing to join this College's mission and for that I am grateful. The greatest pleasure I gain from my role is being involved in the formation and education of our students in the context of our Catholic faith, Jesuit traditions and Ignatian charism.

The history of Catholic education in Australia is over 200 years old. For many decades of the 19th Century, the Christian churches (including our own) were the primary providers of education to Australian children. Catholic schools like Riverview offered a low-fee education to all comers and often no-fee education to the most needy. Our school is an inheritor of this Catholic tradition.

From their beginnings in Europe, Jesuit schools have always relied upon benefactors to support their mission. Riverview's very existence was enabled by the generous benefaction of Fr John Therry. In our early years, it was the Jesuits who assisted poorer students to be educated on the banks of the Lane Cove River. In recent decades, we have relied upon our lay companions to support the Foundation's Bursary and Building Funds.

The Bursary Program provides means-tested bursaries for boys who would otherwise not be able to afford a Jesuit education. We do not provide talent-based scholarships. The Program makes manifest the 'preferential option for the poor' and remains the most important work of the College's Foundation. Each year, boys at Riverview benefit from the generosity of our community.

The Building Fund enables the College to invest in our physical infrastructure. Donations take pressure off school fees and allow continued investment in our facilities. As we approach our sesquicentenary in 2030, the College is reviewing its Master Plan to determine capital priorities. The First Field Precinct (including the Fr Mac Pavilion), the Boarding Houses and the Regis Campus are likely priorities in the coming years.

Thank you for your generous support of this wonderful school. We are most grateful.

A Message from the Rector

One of the joys of being a Jesuit priest is that you are invited to accompany families in times of great joy, as well as sorrow. Thank you for your commitment to our life-giving vision of education; your generosity enables current and future generations to become part of the wide network of relationships that give strength to the much loved Riverview Community.

Jesuit benefaction is steeped in a 475-year history, with the establishment of the first Jesuit school in Messina in 1548.

At Saint Ignatius' College Riverview, our mission is to provide a holistic Catholic education for students, inspiring them to a lifelong development of their faith and the encouragement to make a lasting difference in the world through their commitment and service to others.

Like many independent schools and tertiary institutions across Australia, the College relies on philanthropic giving to help accomplish its mission in ways not possible from school fees alone. Unlike many other schools, our current families are invited to make voluntary contributions to the Building Fund, and we are grateful for their generosity.

The Foundation raises money to fund means-tested bursaries that extend the opportunity of a Jesuit education to students whose families would not otherwise be able to afford it. The Foundation also raises capital for improvements to our campus and facilities. Our physical infrastructure supports our mission to deliver an exceptional education to our students, inspiring them to make a meaningful contribution while at the College and beyond.

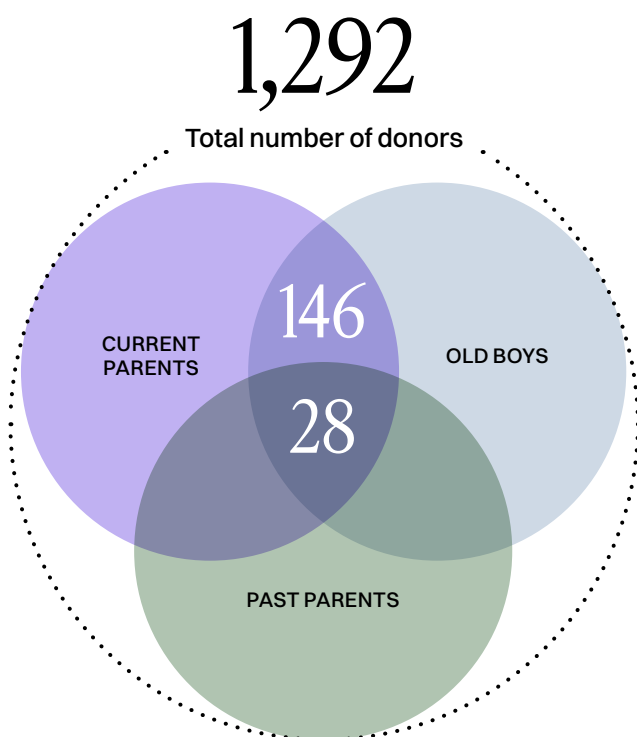

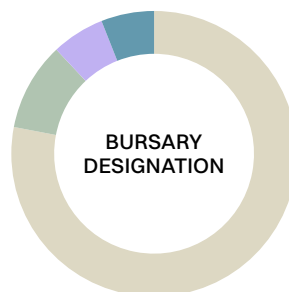

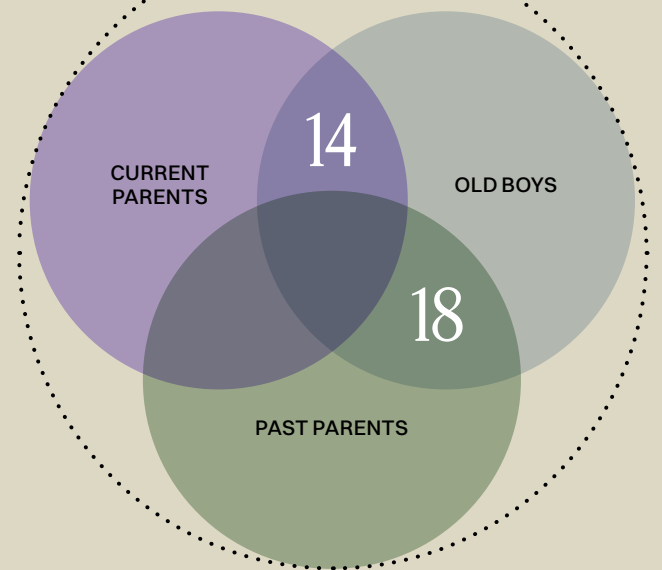

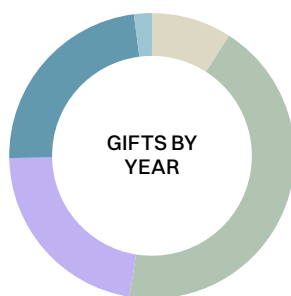

Wingarü Donation Breakdown

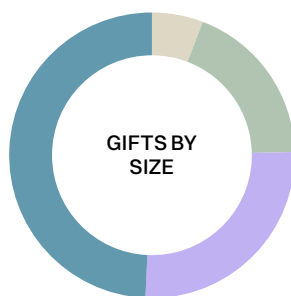

— PAST PARENTS, COMPANIONS

When our twin boys were struggling at their previous school, we began looking for a place that would genuinely support their learning and wellbeing. We had always heard great things about Riverview's learning support program, so we applied, and both boys joined as boarders in Year 9. A few years later, our youngest followed, starting at Regis in Year 5.

The difference was immediate. The boys were in mainstream classes but received the extra help they needed. The rhythm of boarding, with clear routines for study, sport, rest, and community life, gave them stability and confidence. By Year 11, both boys were thriving, even the one who had previously required the most support.

Riverview's Year-Group boarding model creates a strong sense of belonging. Two staff members who made a remarkable impact were Bill Dowers, Ricci Head of House, and Christian Iligan, Head of Volleyball. Both were outstanding in their support, encouragement, and care.

We've chosen to give back because Riverview has had such a positive impact on our whole family. The boys became happier, more grounded, and more confident, and that changed everything for us. We're particularly excited about the new Wingaru science and technology building. It's a much-needed investment in the future, and it's wonderful to see it taking shape.

Ten years on, Riverview still has that warmth, welcome, and community spirit that first drew us in. There really is something special about this school.

— OIU BURSARY AMBASSADOR, PAST PARENTS, COMPANIONS

I started at Riverview in the 1980s and graduated in 1990. My time there was very full: sport, academics, the culture of the place - all of it shaped me. I played a lot of Basketball and Aussie Rules and enjoyed being involved right across College life.

Looking back, what stayed with me most were the values the school instilled: doing things the right way for the right reasons, and leaving things better than you found them. Those ideas have carried through into my work life. They're part of how I lead teams, making sure that effort and integrity sit at the centre of whatever we do.

When it came time to choose a school for our son, Riverview was the obvious choice. My own experience had been so positive, and we'd seen through friends and family that the College had continued to evolve in good ways. One thing Riverview has become particularly strong at is recognising that every student is different, helping each boy to find what he's good at and to thrive in that space.

Our son has found his place through debating. He's had fantastic mentors - coaches and older students - who've helped him grow in confidence and ability. He's even talking about coming back next year to coach, which really captures that Ignatian idea of giving back. He also took part in an immersion in Nepal, which was quite transformative. It opened his eyes in ways that surprised even him and gave him a deep appreciation for service and perspective.

As a family, we've stayed closely connected to Riverview. We chose to support the new Wingaru building because we believe deeply in what the College stands for. We've been long-time supporters of the Bursary Program. We are grateful that the Bursary program ensures that Riverview reflects the full spectrum of society. Having boys from different backgrounds enriches the school for everyone; it's part of what gives Riverview its character and its heart.

Looking ahead, I hope the College continues to evolve for the better but always keeps its Jesuit focus and the values that make it distinctive. There might be another generation of Kapels still to come through, and we'd be proud of that.

Foundation Highlights and Events

2025 Donor Thanksgiving Mass and Reception

In March 2025, we gathered to celebrate the generosity of our donor community at the annual Donor Thanksgiving Mass and Reception. Thanks to the support of our donors, the College's Bursary Program continues to change lives. Philanthropic gifts from our community also made possible the completion of Wingaru, our new science and technology building.

A special mass of thanksgiving was celebrated by College Rector Fr Tom Renshaw SJ in Dalton Memorial Chapel, with beautiful music from the Ignatian Choir.

Afterwards, guests came together in the Dalton Quadrangle to hear powerful reflections from Jonah Johnson (OR2015), a former First Nations bursary student, as well as Abang Othow, the mother of a current bursary student. Their stories offered a moving reminder of how the Bursary Program can transform lives and strengthen communities.

Hosted by the Riverview College Foundation, this special evening of gratitude, community and inspiration also featured a wonderful performance by our Year 12 singers, which was warmly appreciated by all.





Jonah Johnson (OR2015)

Former Bursary Student

Jonah, a proud Wiradjuri man from Griffith, NSW, was a boarder at the College from Year 7 to Year 12. A member of Ricci House, Jonah threw himself into College life, enjoying basketball, touch football and rugby. In 2013, he was the first student from the College to be selected to participate in a Jesuit Exchange Program, attending Clongowes Wood College in Kildare, Ireland. In addition, he was awarded the Rachel Ward Prize for Indigenous Leadership at the 2015 Valette Assembly.

After graduating from the College, Jonah completed a Bachelor of Communications (Social and Political Science) at the University of Technology, Sydney, during which time he interned at the Commonwealth Bank of Australia (CBA). He went on to secure a graduate role at CBA, ultimately working as an Indigenous Careers Acquisition Partner. Jonah is now Acting Managing Editor of Digital at National Indigenous TV, based in Townsville, Queensland.

“First Nations students at the College are like pebbles in the water – creating ripples that extend out into their communities, with powerful flow-on effects. What is the impact of each of those ripples? Having a broader societal impact starts with the individual... At its heart, this program is about generational change... Riverview’s bursary program is led by that understanding, and provides layered support – for the individual, to the family, to the wider community. We all have a role to play here.”

Current Bursary Parent

Abang and her son joined the community at Riverview in 2023 when he was offered a place at the College through the Bursary Program.

Abang arrived in Australia in 2017, having fled South Sudan aged 11 after an assassination attempt on her father during the civil war. She spent three years in a refugee camp in Kenya prior to obtaining a humanitarian visa to Australia. Initially, she lived in a St Vincent de Paul Society shelter for women. Now a teacher, researcher and author, Abang spoke powerfully at the Donor Thanksgiving Mass and Reception of her experiences since joining the community at Riverview.

“Here at Riverview I have found a community that I could only dream of in my own childhood. Having grown up in unimaginable circumstances, and then teaching in some of the toughest schools in Australia, I can say without hesitation that Riverview represents the best of what a community can be. Here, the Jesuit tradition of compassion, respect, empathy, justice, and integrity is alive and flourishing.”

The remarkable generosity through the Bursary Program is not just changing lives today, it is shaping generations to come. Your support allows fine young men, like my son, to grow into the individuals they were meant to be: confident, capable, and ready to make a lasting impact on the world. 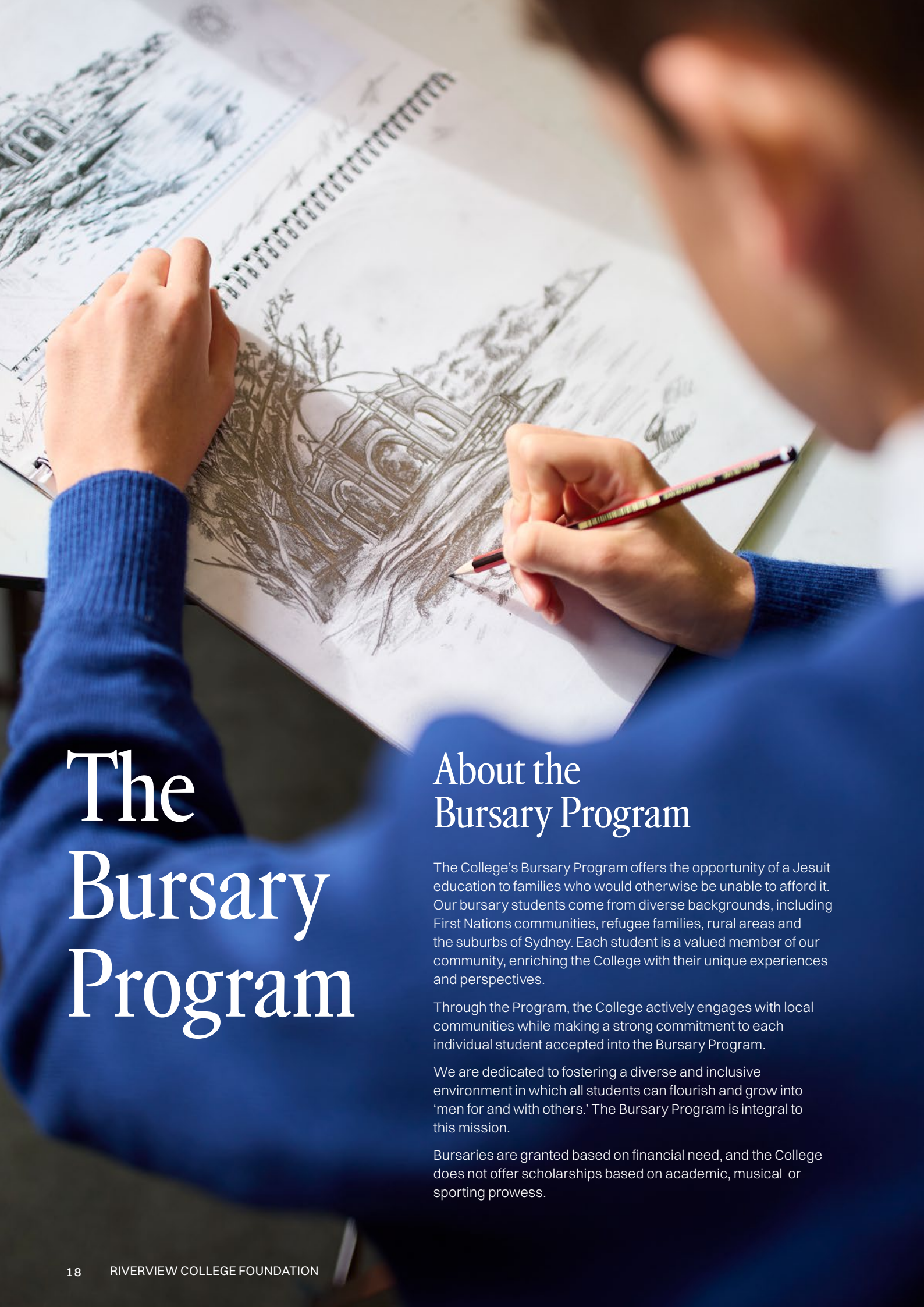

The Bursary Program

About the Bursary Program

The College's Bursary Program offers the opportunity of a Jesuit education to families who would otherwise be unable to afford it. Our bursary students come from diverse backgrounds, including First Nations communities, refugee families, rural areas and the suburbs of Sydney. Each student is a valued member of our community, enriching the College with their unique experiences and perspectives.

Through the Program, the College actively engages with local communities while making a strong commitment to each individual student accepted into the Bursary Program.

We are dedicated to fostering a diverse and inclusive environment in which all students can flourish and grow into 'men for and with others.' The Bursary Program is integral to this mission.

Bursaries are granted based on financial need, and the College does not offer scholarships based on academic, musical or sporting prowess.



About the First Nations Program

The College is actively committed to redressing the inequalities of access and educational outcomes, and through our First Nations Program, we support our First Nations students to unleash their full potential.

Aligned with the College's values of justice and equality of opportunity, our First Nations Program aims to inspire every student to thrive and make a positive impact both during their time at school and beyond. Since the College enrolled its first Indigenous students in the 1980s, the Program has grown to become one of Australia's largest school-based First Nations initiatives in a metropolitan setting.

Under the leadership of our First Nations Coordinator, students benefit from a specialised support team, including dedicated Learning Enrichment staff and holistic involvement from the community at all levels. To help nurture their future study and career goals, Indigenous

students receive individual mentorship from members of our Old Boy and current parent communities, along with access to Cultural Support Tutors and Volunteer Academic Tutors.

We celebrate the rich cultural heritage and identity that the First Nations students and their families bring, recognising their significant role in enhancing our community's understanding of Indigenous cultures and the wider world around us. The First Nations Program is underpinned by the College's commitment to diversity and inclusion, helping us move towards a more united and just society.

Financial support for our First Nations students comes from their families, organisations such as Yalari and the Australian Indigenous Education Foundation (AIEF), and the College's Bursary Fund.

The care and guidance provided by the Southwell House team, led by Damien Reidy, left a lasting impact on Jack.

What Jack values most from his time at Riverview is the deep sense of community, and he maintains lasting connections. Inspired and encouraged by his teachers, Jack went on to complete a combined Civil Engineering and Commerce degree at UNSW. Today, he is making a difference as a Traffic and Transport Engineer with Strathfield Council. Jack credits the values instilled in him at Riverview with shaping his journey and giving him confidence to pursue new opportunities.

The OIU's support of Riverview's Bursary Program began in the 1990s with a simple but generous idea. When Michael Punch (former Sportsmaster, long-time 1st XI and athletics coach, and the College's first Head of Foundation) visited Jesuit schools in the United States. He was struck by their strong peer-year bursary culture. Upon his return, he gathered a small group of Riverview Old Boys to explore whether something similar could work here. None of us knew what it might become. We were simply following a generous idea, rooted in a Jesuit impulse to give back. From that beginning, something lasting began to grow.

Over the decades, the program has evolved into a genuinely community-driven effort. Today, more than 100 OIU 'Bursary Ambassadors' represent over 60 graduating cohorts. In the early years we relied on handwritten letters; meeting at the College, sharing a meal, signing envelopes late into the night. Slow, yes, but deeply connecting. As the program matured, we modernised the process while preserving what makes it special: year groups uniting to widen the circle of opportunity.

Since stepping into the role of Chair in 2015, I've watched the program mature. In 2025, we saw renewed momentum, with eight new OIU Bursary Ambassadors, including some younger Old Boys, demonstrating that the desire to give back is alive across generations. A highlight was the Class of 2001, which welcomed 11 new donors in 2025, the highest increase of any cohort. Their surge shows what's

possible when Ambassadors re-energise their peers. More broadly, the number of new Old Boy donors in 2025 surpassed previous years, a clear sign that awareness and goodwill are rising.

Looking ahead, the vision is simple and strong: deeper engagement, broader awareness, and a shared belief that every contribution matters. Not everyone can give large amounts, but most can give something. When a community rallies behind a purpose, even small gifts become transformative.

At its heart, the OIU Bursary Ambassador program remains what it has always been: Old Boys helping the next generation access the same life-shaping Riverview experience that helped shape us. I truly believe this is all about generosity (large or small) opening doors, one year group at a time.

More than twenty-five years have passed since we walked out of the gates of Saint Ignatius' College Riverview as fresh graduates of the Class of 1998. Time has flown, but the Ignatian ethos, Christian values, and Catholic social teaching principles that shaped us as students, together with the friendships we forged, have remained constant. Another constant has been our unwavering commitment to our College's Bursary Program.

As beneficiaries of a Jesuit education, we were gifted the Ignatian lens through which to see and engage with our world: a lens of hope and possibility, responding with kindness and compassion, grounded in the cherished ideals of inclusion and justice. We count it a tremendous honour and extraordinary privilege to be OIU Bursary Ambassadors for our Class of '98. Being advocates and financial supporters of the Bursary Program is, for us, a practical expression of us living with that Ignatian lens, of both imagining and building a fairer and more just world. We see our contribution, modest but meaningful, as helping dismantle barriers that exclude, and expanding compassion to help create a College community of kinship, where everyone belongs.

Reaching our peers, and being reachable, is central to being a Bursary Ambassador. When we started as students, we had not heard of the internet. Even at graduation the 'world wide web' was in its infancy. In our early years out of school, we contacted our classmates by posting each one a signed letter asking for support. Needless to say, we were glad when email arrived! Today we use every available avenue, especially across the digital landscape, spanning our Class of '98 Facebook page to our Class 'WhatsApp Group' Noticeboard; we share news relating to how the Program is unlocking opportunity and fostering equity. In turn, we invite greater participation from our classmates so we can take our impact to a new level.

With gratitude being such a strong Ignatian theme, we are always conscious of thanking our peers for their

involvement. We do not know the financial contribution any individual makes, but we are informed of who has joined us in giving and our shared quest to make a Jesuit educational experience at Riverview even more accessible to those from diverse socio-economic backgrounds. Whether it's thanking someone by phone, in person at a Class Reunion - where we also promote the Program - or at the annual Donor Thanksgiving Mass and Reception, we are always united in the belief that the reward of being involved is, in the end, a matter of conscience. Every contributor from the Class of '98 values the chance to convert into action those values, principles and ideals that were imbued in us as students, with our giving to the Bursary Program a potent vehicle for us to give back to the place that shaped us, taught us so much, and set us on our way.

A great delight for us each year is receiving the yearly story of a former bursary recipient as part of the Appeal. It is very moving to hear their story of personal transformation, and we are always glad to share it with our peers. These stories reinforce our view that supporting students on a Bursary is a covenant between equals, as well as being a powerful reminder of the Program's enduring impact and a compelling call to action — in the spirit of the 'magis'. Such personal testimonies from recipients move us deeply because, in truth, they echo the same personal transformation that each of us had, along with countless other Riverview graduates, from our own Jesuit educational experience at Riverview, which gifted us the Ignatian lens.

Ultimately, we see being an OIU Bursary Ambassador as love with sleeves rolled up: standing in solidarity for and with the poor, the vulnerable, and the marginalised, and helping to erase artificial divisions between "us" and "them," leaving only "us." Through the Ignatian lens, what comes into sharp focus is an exquisite mutuality, and the kind of College community of kinship and belonging that Saint Ignatius himself would recognise.

Looking back on my time at Riverview, I often tell my parents how grateful I am for the education I received. It wasn't just about academics; it was faith, sport, community and service. That holistic formation shaped who I am today.

I started in Year 5 and was the first in my family to attend Riverview, something I felt and continue to feel proud of. From the beginning, I wanted to make the most of every opportunity. Riverview has had a profound impact on my family across generations. My father is an Old Boy, and I attended the College along with my three brothers. I began as a day boy before moving into boarding, and that shift made the school feel like a second home. Boarding forged friendships that have lasted my whole life. Riverview is also the place where I met my wife. Her father and three brothers are all Old Boys, too. Our two boys now have a father, two grandfathers, six uncles, and cousins who are Riverview men, and all our children were baptised in the College Chapel. Riverview really is family to us.

What has always stood out to me is that no boy is left unattended. Whether you're gifted in sport, academics, music, or still finding your way, there is a place for you, and people who genuinely care. That's what my parents wanted for us: to get as much as we could out of the school, but to give back just as much. That spirit of humility and service defines Riverview.

The school spirit is real, and it's infectious. The boys show up for one another, whether it's the 1st XV, debating, rowing, or cross-country, they support each other with pride. As a parent, seeing my boys choose to spend weekends cheering on their school says a lot about the culture.

We choose to donate to the Bursary Program because we know firsthand how life-changing the opportunity can be. A close friend of mine came to Riverview on a bursary, and only later did we understand how much that chance opened doors for him. Giving another boy that same opportunity feels like the most meaningful way we can give back.

Looking ahead, I'm confident the College is in good hands. As long as Riverview keeps forming fine young men – grounded, generous, and connected – it will remain the place we love.

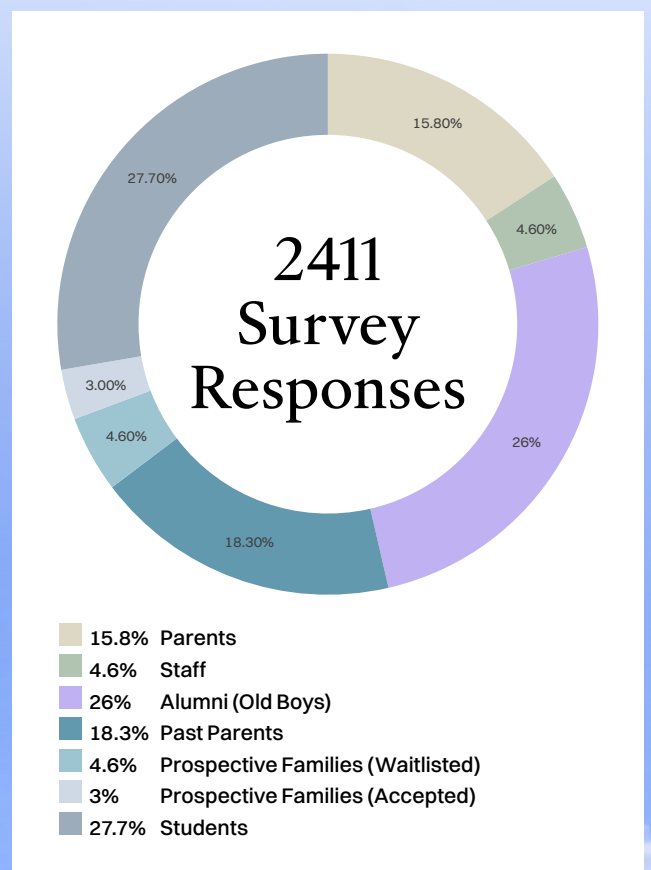
Community Consultation

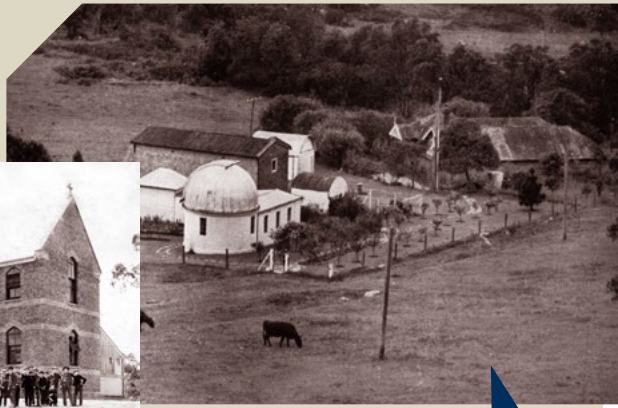

An Evolving Saint Ignatius' College Riverview



1880

1878 28 June

Fr Joseph Dalton SJ purchases Riverview Estate, following a significant bequest from Fr John Therry.

1880 12 February

The College opens its doors with just one cottage serving as classroom, dormitory, chapel and refectory.

1880 September

St Michael's House is completed in the College's foundation year.

1885—1889

The first major building project is completed as the western end of the Main Building (Arrupe) opens.

1908

Fr Edward Pigot SJ establishes the Riverview Observatory. At the time, it was the only fully equipped seismological observatory in Australia.

1909 23 May

Dalton Memorial Chapel Opening ceremony held. A startling art nouveau creation and still an outstanding example of the style, the Chapel is the Old Ignatians' official monument to College founder, Fr Joseph Dalton SJ.

1929—1930

The Main Building (Arrupe) is completed in time for the 50th Anniversary of the College. The Eastern and Doyle Wings are added and the Dalton Memorial Chapel is expanded.

1958—1959

Wallace Wing classrooms, study hall and science block completed.



2025

1964 February

The Junior School (Regis Campus) opens.

1969—1973

The largest building program ever undertaken since 1885 at the College takes place, including the Vaughan Wing, the Therry Wing, and Saint John's Boarding House.

1985—1995

The Gartlan Centre, The Woods Music Centre, Ramsay Hall, and O'Kelly Theatre are completed.

2000 20 August

Kevin Fagan House for senior boarding students opens.

2003

O'Neil Wing and Therry Campus open.

2008 2 November

Official opening of the renewed Dalton Memorial Chapel and Christopher Brennan Library.

2018

Therry Building opens.

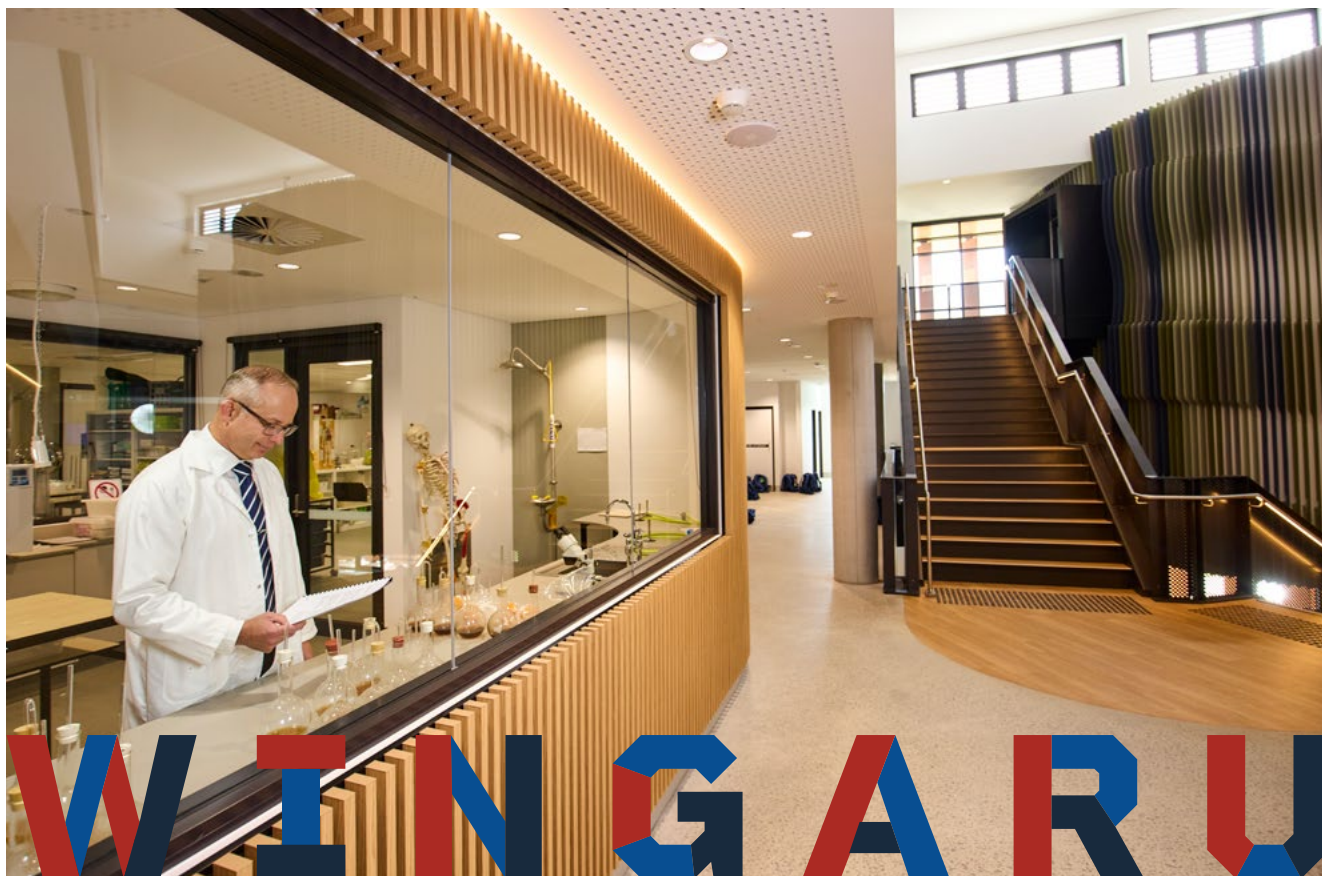

Wingaru: our new science and technology building

In 2025, we opened the doors to our new science and technology building, Wingaru. Already, this remarkable facility is enriching the life of our College. It's a place where students learn, collaborate, and grow within an environment shaped by our Jesuit commitment to excellence in teaching, learning, and pastoral care.

Wingaru was conceived as more than a modern educational space; it is a home for curiosity and formation. Its purpose-built facilities, including the state-of-the-art superlab, open new possibilities for hands-on discovery and interdisciplinary learning. Flexible learning zones and contemporary House Areas offer welcoming spaces that support both learning and pastoral care.

Grounded in respect for Country, Wingaru honours First Nations culture and the land of the Cammeragal clan of the Gai-mariagal Nation. The Yarning Circle centred on a Port Jackson Fig, along with student-created artwork on the louvres and within the building, invite all who enter to pause, reflect, and acknowledge the enduring custodianship and culture that shape our community.

While thoughtfully designed for long-term adaptability, Wingaru is first and foremost a place where students and staff flourish today and into the future.

We remain deeply grateful to all who brought this vision to life. The staff who planned and delivered the project, together with former colleagues who laid its early foundations, have gifted our community an enduring legacy. Most importantly, we thank the donors and families whose generosity made Wingaru possible. Your belief in our mission, and in forming young people of purpose, service, and human excellence, continues to inspire us.

Within Wingaru, the Jesuit contribution to Science over last five centuries has been recognised. There is an image of a prominent Jesuit scientist incorporated into each science laboratory, including Fr Christopher Clavius SJ, Fr Roger Boscovich SJ and Fr Pierre Teilhard de Chardin SJ.

Official Opening and Blessing of Wingaru

On 21 November 2025, the College opened and blessed Wingaru. The Very Reverend Fr Quyen Vu SJ, Provincial of the Australian Province of the Society of Jesus, blessed the building, which was opened by Senator the Hon. Malarndirri McCarthy, Minister for Indigenous Australians and former parent and member of staff at our Jesuit school. Senator McCarthy was unable to attend in person because of Cyclone Fina, and opened the building virtually through a recorded video. Our valued guests enjoyed a performance by the Ignatian Choir as well as a corroboree in Wingaru's yarning circle, performed by our First Nations students, led by our First Nations Coordinator along with local elders.

Moving into Wingaru has transformed the Mathematics Faculty, positively impacting students and teaching staff alike.

From day one, what has struck me the most is the quality of the teaching spaces. The rooms are big, bright and calm, full of natural light, with high ceilings and clean lines. We can comfortably fit a full class (and then some) without feeling as though the boys are being squeezed into a box. The corridors and stairwells are wide, so even when large groups are moving between lessons, things flow smoothly. It feels like a building that has been genuinely designed first and foremost for teaching and learning in the STEM fields.

The classrooms work really well for the teaching of Maths. The technology is reliable - projectors, laptops, graphing software, OneNote; all the tools we use every period are up and running without fuss. At the same time, the rooms still lend themselves to old-fashioned pen-and-paper work when that's what the lesson calls for. The semi-circular "Protractor Room," as it's fondly referred to by the Maths Faculty, is a beautiful example of how space can reflect what we teach. The teachers and students allocated this room are very fortunate.

One of the unexpected positives has been what I call the "fishbowl effect." With so much glass, everyone is always, in a sense, on display. Staff can see into classrooms as they walk past; students know they're visible too. That openness is good for accountability, but it also lifts practice. It creates opportunities for colleagues to observe one another, share ideas and - particularly for younger staff - to discreetly learn from more experienced teachers.

There are also exciting possibilities we've only just begun to explore; adjoining rooms that open into double classrooms, smaller breakout spaces for exams or support, and the capacity to rethink things like accelerated learning and group work. In many ways, we've only scratched the surface of what Wingaru will allow us to do. But even at this early stage, it already feels like a major step forward for Mathematics at Riverview.

When I first set foot in Wingaru, I was really excited about what it could hold - we all were. I love registration each morning; it's such a great way to start the day. The Teresa House Area is spacious and open, and it's easy to chat with our Head of House, ask questions or talk about any problems.

The windows and natural light make a big difference. We now hold Mini House meetings in our new House Area, and last year it was really special to see the Year 12 students receive their new ties there.

Wingarau feels modern and artistic - there's a great atmosphere. The light and space have definitely helped our learning. With new tables and chairs, there is room to concentrate. I take Maths, Engineering, and Chemistry classes in Wingaru, and the "superlab" is the first place we have been able to do proper experiments; there's a lot of space to work in and we're not standing on top of each other. It's safer too. I feel inspired by the new classrooms and I'm thinking about studying engineering after school.

The new Canteen is very inviting. The food is displayed in glass heating boxes, so when I'm lining up I might think "I'll try something new today." There are also designated queues, and a new outdoor area where we can sit and chat - I've seen so many more students connecting, including with staff.

Wingarau really feels like the heart of learning at Riverview. I know how privileged I am to learn in a building like this. It's going to benefit so many boys, for generations. Opening this building is quite momentous, and I really feel part of Riverview's history. I can already imagine coming back one day and seeing the next group of students learning here too and thinking that I was one of the first ones to study and have a House in Wingaru.
