

Board of Education Updates

The AWLS Board of Education invites all stakeholders to be an engaged member of our school community. Meetings are open to the public and are live-streamed and recorded for those who cannot attend in-person.

Highlights from the July 16 meeting:

District Treasurer, Kerri Johnson provided an overview of the District's finances at the close of FY25. More details are on the next page.

Operations Director, Neil Raymond provided an update on several permanent improvement projects taking place throughout the District this summer. Project information and photos are available on the District website.

Director of Teaching and Learning, Jim Conner shared that grade cards for primary students are being simplified for clarity while maintaining detailed progress reporting and former AWHS Principal, Kevin Pfefferle shared information about graduation requirements and the accomplishments of the Class of 2025.

Superintendent Kevin Herman announced that a new District foundation is in early planning stages to support academics and activities.

Treasurer's Report

As we close out another fiscal year, inflation and rising costs continue to be a major factor facing the District's budget. Like many households we are making ends meet, but we continue to operate on a slim margin, with a cash balance of only 4.6%.*

As always, we are closely monitoring our revenue and expenses - with a focus on ensuring that all financial decisions are in the best interests of our students and our taxpayers.

More financial updates will be shared as they are available.

Fiscal Year 2025 Overview

Real Estate Taxes	\$35,675,682	72%
State Aid	\$8,131,703	16%
Other Local Funding	\$5,885,592	12%
Non-Operating Revenue	\$18,327	0%

The District saw a \$2.9M revenue increase from:

- increases in state funding
- state reimbursement Science of Reading training
- property tax revenues
- payments made by the NEXUS pipeline.

District expenses are increasing due to rising costs for:

- contracted services for student support
- salaries and health benefits
- supplies and materials

School Transportation

Your child's bus route information will be available in the PowerSchool Parent Portal at the end of the day on Monday, Aug. 11. Please plan to be at your assigned bus stop a few minutes early, particularly during the first few weeks of school as families and bus drivers settle into their new route schedules.

Unhoused Families Eligible for Assistance

If your family is experiencing homelessness or is doubled up with friends or extended family members due to loss of housing or financial hardship, your children may qualify for certain rights and protections under the federal McKinney-Vento Act. Contact your child's school counselor or call 419-877-5377 for more information.



Free and Reduced School Meal Applications

Families meeting certain federal income guidelines can <u>apply</u> to receive free or reduced-price breakfast and lunch through the National School Lunch Program. Applications are available through <u>PaySchoolsCentral.com</u>.

STOP means **STOP** for school buses

YELLOW FLASHING LIGHTS = Prepare to stop



RED FLASHING LIGHTS & EXTENDED STOP ARM = Stop at least 10 feet away & wait for the lights to stop

Bus Rider Safety

Stay far from the road when waiting for the bus.

Wait for the driver's signal before crossing, and look both ways for traffic.

Stay seated, keep aisles clear, and avoid eating or drinking on the bus.

Crosswalk Safety

The Whitehouse Police Department created an instructional video for using lighted crosswalk zones in our community. Please watch it with your child.

Please watch for children walking and biking to and from school.

Eight Tips for Easing into a New School Year

As a new school year begins, both parents and children face changes that can feel exciting yet overwhelming. With a little planning and support, families can ease the transition and start the year off with confidence and calm. If you have concerns or need extra support, connect with your child's school counselor.



Start Routines Early

Gradually shift bedtime and wake-up times a week or two before school starts. Do a few practice runs for school mornings to reduce chaos on day one.



Get Organized

Create a calendar for school events, homework deadlines, and extracurriculars. Label school supplies, backpacks, lunch packs and jackets.



Talk About Expectations

Set academic, social or extra-curricular goals with your child. Discuss any fears or anxieties they may have—especially if it's a new school or grade.



Communicate with Teachers

Attend back-to-school night. Introduce yourself to teachers and let them know about any special needs or concerns.



Build a Healthy Home Routine

Plan regular meal times and include nutritious snacks and lunches. Limit screen time and encourage reading or outdoor play in the evenings.



Encourage Social Connections

Help your child reconnect with school friends before the year starts with a few play dates or meet-ups - especially for younger kids or new students.



Check In Regularly

Create a habit of asking open-ended questions like: "What was the best part of your day?" or "What's something that made you think today?"



Give It Time

The transition takes a few weeks. Be patient with your child—and yourself—during this adjustment phase.
