# **CATtitude** 24-hour cat curfew to start 30 September

## Are you a cat owner? Are you prepared for the 24-hour cat curfew?

Now's the time to get ready for the new cat curfew, which requires all cats within the shire to be confined to their owner's property boundary unless the cat is appropriately restrained.

According to Animal Welfare Victoria, cats that are confined to your property live three times longer than those that are allowed to roam. You can keep your cat in the house or flat with you, or in the garage or shed at night. Other options include buying or building a cat enclosure for your yard, or installing cat-proof fencing.



## Fairer fares for taxi passengers

Victorian taxi passengers will soon have more certainty about what they pay when hailing or catching a cab from a rank – and more confidence they can get a taxi when they need one – when drivers become required to use the taxi meter for unbooked trips.

The Government will update the regulations governing the commercial passenger industry, meaning drivers can no longer negotiate a price with customers above the regulated maximum fare and must use their meters for trips from ranks or when hailed on the streets.

The changes, set to come into effect from 28 September, come in time for the spring and summer major events seasons as a result of industry and community feedback.

The updated regulations will make sure for unbooked trips drivers always use the taxi meter to calculate the maximum regulated fare – strengthening protections for passengers, particularly at times of high demand and will remove any confusion over fare rules

The amendments will apply to unbooked trips from a taxi rank or hailed from the street in Melbourne, Geelong, Ballarat and Bendigo.

No changes are being made to prebooked taxi or rideshare services.

The Labor Government regularly monitors and consults with passengers, drivers and booking service providers to improve the industry and these changes reflect recent feedback about unbooked taxi services.

The changes build on the improvements made with the deregulation of the industry - which has increased competition, delivered better services and value for money since the reforms were introduced.

# Review of Barwon River waterway rules is underway

The Corangamite Catchment Management Authority (CMA) is reviewing the waterway rules for the Barwon River through Geelong stretching from Orana Road to the Lower Breakwater (just upstream of Lake Connewarre).

The Corangamite CMA identified a need to review the waterway rules for the Barwon River following Barwon Water's planned removal of four spans of the Ovoid Sewer Aqueduct in Breakwater. The removal of the spans opens the opportunity for the public to access the lower part of the river for the first time in many years as this has been an exclusion zone for safety reasons.

As the existing river rules have not been reviewed since 1991 (32 years), the renewed access to the river around the sewer aqueduct provides the Corangamite CMA the opportunity to review the waterway rules, not just for the lower part of the river, but for the entire stretch from Orana Road to the Lower Breakwater.

Geelong is one of the fastest growing regions in Australia with the Northern, Western and Armstrong Creek Growth Areas combined projected to ultimately provide approximately 60,000 new homes and over 160,000 new residents.

With population growth comes greater demand for access to the river for recreation and enjoyment of nature with the number and variety of river users likely to significantly increase.

Waterway rules are designed to provide a safe operating environment, to cater for a wide range of boating and water activities, to separate different activities where needed based on safety, and to reflect local conditions.

Any changes to the rules will be based on the following principles:

- Managing vessel activities and movement, moorings and berthing locations, and navigational aids that identify regulations and hazards, anchorage and dredging areas
- Minimising the risk of environmental damage from the operation of vessels

- Allowing for the safety and equity of on-water use on the Barwon River for a broad range of users
- Cultural Heritage management and consideration
- Ensuring compatibility of waterway use with surrounding land

The Corangamite CMA is currently in consultation with the main user groups of the Barwon River and key agency stakeholders including the Geelong Water Ski Club, Geelong Canoe Club, Association of Geelong and District Angling Clubs Inc, Barwon Valley Water Ski Club, Geelong Rowing Association Inc, Geelong Cross Country Club, Geelong Field Naturalist Club, Geelong Dragon Boat Club and the Geelong Outrigger Canoe Club. The public will be asked for its feedback on the draft river rules later this year.

No decisions about the rules, including the times that stakeholders have access to the river, will be made while this targeted consultation is underway and until the public has provided feedback.

Corangamite CMA's General Manager Community and Catchment Services Sarah Holland Clift said, "Targeted consultation is still underway, and we have further meetings scheduled with user groups".

"The aim of any rule changes is to foster greater inclusivity and safety for all on-water users, enabling a broader range of individuals to enjoy the Barwon River," continued Ms Holland Clift.

After the consultation period, the draft river rules will be publicly displayed for four weeks to gather feedback from the community. "Through the public consultation process, we aim to consider the perspectives of all river users and establish new rules that accommodate a wide range of recreational activities," Ms Holland Clift said.




This road now leads to the Shire Depot, named after Shire Foreman Ivan Mousley, an employee of Winchelsea Shire for 44 years.

#### The Climate Report

Long-range forecast overview from the Bureau of Meterology

For Sept to Nov, above median maximum temperatures are very likely (greater than 80% chance) for almost all of Australia. For Sept to Nov, warmer than median minimum temperatures are likely (60 to 80% chance) to very likely for most of western and southern Australia.

#### Warmer and drier spring forecast after warmest winter on record

Issued: Thursday, 31 August 2023

The Bureau's long-range forecast for spring 2023 shows below average rainfall is likely for most of Australia along with warmer than usual temperatures.

The warmer spring forecast comes as winter 2023 looks to be Australia's warmest winter on record. The national mean temperature for winter is currently tracking to be 1.54°C above the 1961-1990 average, which would make it Australia's warmest winter since 1996.

Bureau of Meteorology climate services manager Dr Karl Braganza said

unusually warm days are likely for almost all areas over spring, especially Western Australia and parts of the south-east. "Spring is forecast to be warmer than usual across the country," he said. "This spring, the forecast shows most areas have a high chance of below average rainfall, and many areas have an increased chance of an unusually dry spring."

Areas with the highest chance of an unusually dry spring are the south-west and parts of the east.

There is always the risk of dangerous and destructive fires in Australia during spring. Australia's fire agencies have identified an increased risk of fire this spring for regions in New South Wales, Victoria, Queensland, South Australia and the Northern Territory as part of their Spring 2023 Bushfire Outlook. Communities in these regions are urged to prepare and review their bushfire plans.

Global sea surface temperatures have been the highest on record for the months of April to July 2023. The oceans play an extremely important role in global climate, including the climate of Australia.

Bureau of Meteorology senior hydrologist Dr Masoud Edraki said the global climate system is looking very unusual right now. "Record high warm sea surface temperatures in all of the global oceans are likely to continue to impact the weather we experience for many months," he said, "We know that a warmer climate does increase the risk of extreme weather including heatwaves and drought."

We are already seeing longer fire seasons, and an increase in the number of dangerous fire weather days over most of Australia. We don't know yet how global warming, and particularly the increased warmth in the oceans, is affecting our typical climate drivers. We'll continue to monitor this closely and how it is likely to affect Australia's climate forecast. Our climate forecast model is consistent with international climate forecasts that show Australia is trending dry and warm for the coming season, particularly in the south-west and much of south-eastern Australia."

## Streamlining teacher recruitment

The State Government is attracting more teachers to work in Victorian government schools with a new recruitment process – making it easier to connect talented teachers with the right job.

Minister for Education Natalie Hutchins today launched the Teacher Recruitment Initiative, which will streamline recruitment processes and reduce the time it takes for local schools to match and fill teaching vacancies.

The initiative makes it simpler for schools to connect with teachers through an easy-to-use centralised recruitment platform that matches applicant preferences and availability with teacher vacancies.

Under the new platform, teachers can create an online profile in the Job Opportunities Pool outlining employment preferences such as their desired location and then be considered simultaneously for vacancies, reducing the need to manage multiple applications.

The Job Opportunities Pool matches applicants' skills and work preferences,

providing a ready-made list of potential hires for school recruiters.

Selected graduates are also eligible to receive one of 400 financial incentive packages of \$5,650 to start their employment at a government school.

Through the Victorian Budget 2023/24, the Labor Government has invested \$12 million to get returning teachers back to the classroom through the Teacher Re-Engagement Initiative, giving paid placements of up to 40 days in schools alongside mentoring supports to help build teachers' readiness to return to the workforce.

In addition, the Labor Government is running a \$4 million targeted recruitment campaign to attract and retain highquality teachers in government schools.

The Victorian Budget 2023/24 includes a further \$32.2 million to support preservice teachers undertaking placements in rural and regional schools and \$9.5 million to enhance flexible and jobsharing working arrangements for school leaders.

## Council draws on community knowledge and passion to help improve health of Karaaf Wetlands

Community knowledge and care for the Karaaf Wetlands are being drawn on to help develop solutions to address the impact stormwater is having on the culturally and environmentally significant saltmarsh.

The Karaaf Wetlands Community Reference Group, which held its first meeting in May, is working collaboratively with Surf Coast Shire Council along with other stakeholders to help ensure the future health of the Karaaf Wetlands is the best it can be.

Karaaf Wetlands Community Reference Group Chair Jeff Rigby said the group brought together 11 passionate, committed and like-minded volunteers from the local community to work with Council and consultants on a program of projects and initiatives to reduce the volume and improve the quality of stormwater that flows into the Karaaf Wetlands from north Torquay.

"The future of the Karaaf Wetlands is dependent on positive and proactive action that is founded on sound science and engineering, the goodwill of all stakeholders involved and a committed and unified approach by all," Mr Rigby said.

The group's first priority is providing input on key projects including:

- Developing stormwater diversion options.
- Improving stormwater quality and monitoring in the existing constructed wetland system.

"We are really fortunate to have so many locals who care about the Karaaf Wetlands, and the community reference group allows us to make the most of the different skillsets and passion in our community," Surf Coast Shire Mayor Cr Liz Pattison said.

"We know that stormwater systems are complex, solutions can be expensive and we want to get it right, so the more information we have the better. We must make sure any diversion or improvement works are carefully considered to ensure there aren't any unintended impacts."

#### Winter Leek and Potato Soup

#### Ingredients

60ml olive oil,

- 1 brown onion chopped,
- 1 clove garlic crushed,

4 medium (700g) Desiree potatoes cut into small cubes,

2 leeks pale section only thinly sliced,

- 1.25I vegetable stock,
- 125ml cream,

Fresh chives,

Croutons and black pepper to serve.

#### Method:

Heat oil in large saucepan add onion and garlic, cook for

3 minutes until softens. Add potato and leek, cook for 5 minutes until leek softens. Add stock and bring to the boil. Reduce heat to medium and gently boil uncovered for 20minutes or until potato is soft. Cool for 10 minutes.

Blend with stick or jug blender until smooth. (You could use a potato masher, but it will be a bit lumpy in texture) Add cream and return to a medium heat for 5 minutes. Serve with croutons and chives or just chives and pepper. And crusty bread. Yum! Free Community Service Advertisements


