


Leveled Reader in Filipino

"What are we going to do with beans, mangoes, rice, flour, and spices?" Lee asks.




Jean looks around the kitchen.

Lee takes the beans, rice, and spices. Jean takes the mangoes and flour.


What will they make?

They all clap and agree.


Grammar: Change the following words into adverbs.
