- THE LABOR FORCE INCREASED BY 4,949 FROM THE PREVIOUS MONTH
- THE NUMBER OF EMPLOYED INDIVIDUALS INCREASED BY 2,189 FROM THE PREVIOUS MONTH
- THE NUMBER OF UNEMPLOYED INDIVIDUALS INCREASED BY 2,760 FROM THE PREVIOUS MONTH
- INDIVIDUALS WHO FILED FOR UNEMPLOYMENT INCREASED BY 52 FROM THE PREVIOUS MONTH
- THE TOP THREE UNEMPLOYMENT CLAIMANT OCCUPATIONS WERE OFFICE AND ADMINISTRATIVE SUPPORT, PROTECTIVE SERVICE & MANAGMENT

- EL PASO, TX MSA UNEMPLOYMENT WAS AT **5.1%** WITH A TOTAL OF **19,660** UNEMPLOYED INDIVIDUALS
- EL PASO, TX MSA ADDED 5,900 NONFARM JOBS SINCE JULY 2022
- EL PASO, TX MSA LOST 900 NONFARM JOBS FROM THE PREVIOUS MONTH



The three Super Sectors with the least employment for the El Paso MSA in July 2023 were:


- 1. Financial Activities









UNEMPLOYMENT in July 2023











Of the **2,044 total** Borderplex claimants, 33 are from the rural areas reflected on the data provided.















TOP UI CLAIMANTS BY ZIP CODE 7/1 to 7/31















UI CLAIMANTS DEMOGRAPHICS – BORDERPLEX REGION








UI CLAIMANTS DEMOGRAPHICS – BORDERPLEX REGION 7/1 to 7/31



As an individual attain a higher education, wages increase. From 2016 to 2021, we see the earnings for both genders increase at each education level. However, regardless of the educational level, women in El Paso keep earning between 23 to 41 percent less than men.
