SANCTUARY REPAIRS



Repairing the Ceiling

Date Completed: August 2021

Repairs to our sanctuary's 130-year-old plaster and lath ceiling were completed using historic plaster conservation techniques, underscoring our commitment to preservation while ensuring the repairs will stand the test of time. In addition to the ceiling restoration, the walls and trim were freshly painted, giving our sacred space a rejuvenated and vibrant look that honors both its history and its future.

On Hold

At this time, the repair of two stained glass windows, which are deflecting badly due to age and heat, has been put on hold. As the campaign concludes, if there are funds available for this work it will be completed without delay. Should that not be the case, this work will be deferred and funded in the years ahead either through designated gifts and memorials or through capital improvement funds.

Bathroom and Classroom Renovations

Date completed: September 2023

Both children and adults have been enjoying the newly refurbished classroom spaces. These rooms are now filled with our youngest disciples learning about faith and friendship on Sunday mornings, and they are also frequently used throughout the week to host community group gatherings. One of the classrooms has been transformed into a dedicated office space for our Director of Children, Youth, and Family Ministries, becoming a hub for our Sunday School teachers as they gather supplies and enjoy a cup of artisan coffee!

Our fully renovated bathrooms, including a fully ADA-accessible restroom by Fellowship Hall, are clean, inviting, and well-equipped—a wonderful improvement that enhances both comfort and accessibility for all who visit.









Kitchen Reno

Date Completed: April 2025

The long-awaited kitchen refresh is finally complete, and the results are fantastic! The space is now not only more aesthetically pleasing but also significantly more functional. Step inside and you'll notice beautifully refinished cabinets that enhance both style and storage capacity, along with durable granite countertops that are built to handle everyday use. New, energy-efficient lighting brightens the entire room, while modern stove hoods and clean, updated tiling give the kitchen a fresh and polished feel. Altogether, these updates make the space more welcoming and better suited to meet the needs of our community. Thanks to the dedicated efforts of volunteers, we were able to keep costs as low as possible while still achieving a beautiful transformation. We're excited to see this updated space come to life, bringing our church family closer as we share in fellowship, and also serving as a gathering space for the community.

Estimated Completion Date: Summer 2025

The work on the exterior of the building took time and required a significant investment, but we weren't merely patching up the old structure—we were making long-term, long lasting improvements. Every aspect of the exterior work was carefully planned and executed to ensure lasting quality and beauty. This thoughtful approach reflects our commitment to preserving and enhancing space for the generations that will gather, worship, and grow here in the future.

Rebuilding the Ramp


Date Completed: January 2025

As promised in the Spring of 2024, estimates were obtained for masonry options, as well as for non masonry options (e.g., wooden- and polysynthetic based structures) for rebuilding the ramp. As expected, the masonry options were more expensive, but in assessing lifespan, maintenance needs and aesthetics, masonry was ultimately determined to be the best use of our resources. Once again, in an effort to keep costs low, we used some sweat equity from volunteers for demolishing the old ramp and then we let the professionals take it from there. The results are outstanding—a ramp that seamlessly blends with the rest of the building, offering safety and sturdiness while also enhancing the overall aesthetic appeal. This work necessitated some repairs/repaving of the driveway local to the ramp and these costs were added to the project.









Interior and Exterior Signage

Date Completed: August 2024

Our new signage, both inside and outside the church, has proven to be incredibly helpful. The design is clear, welcoming, and easy to navigate, making it easier for newcomers and regular attendees alike to find their way around. It's a small detail that makes a big difference in improving accessibility and creating a more welcoming environment for all.
