Olga Pericet, winner of the 2018 Spanish National Dance Prize, seeks the dialogue between the animal and the instrument in the symbolism of *La Leona*, the famous guitar made by Antonio De Torres, considered by many to be the first prototype of the Spanish and flamenco guitar. *La Leona* is a free-wheeling interpretation inspired by a unique instrument and its construction process, singular, full of nuance, mystery and poetry. Pericet, together with five musicians, puts her bravura to the test, stripping herself physically and spiritually in a unique and intimate experience with the spectators.

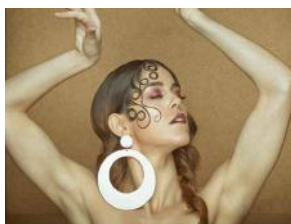


Andrés Marín y Compañía *Jardín Impuro*

Jardín Impuro is a window into the personal universe of Andrés Marín. Winner of the 2022 Spanish National Dance Prize, the iconoclastic dancer and choreographer offers us his art as an act of freedom. A restless and passionate dancer, eschewing any kind of certainty, Marín is profoundly radical in the truest sense of the word: a rooted dancer. He neither breaks from tradition for its own sake, nor clings to it out of meaningless consecration: he has chosen a narrow path which has led him to explore his own reading of flamenco, free of censorship and visionary.

Winner of the 2021 Spanish National Dance Prize, the prodigious young Guerrero and her company immerse audiences into a performance of a thousand dreamlike adventures. As she descends into dreams, she encounters obstacles, but above all the sounds of flamenco, the Soleá, the voice of a Granáina/Bulería or a Mariana...inviting the viewer to imagine and explore the sometimes lonely but dreamlike process of creation.

Celebrating 36 years of Festival Flamenco Albuquerque 1987-2023





In 1987, Professor Eva Encinias was asked by then Chair of the University of New Mexico Department of Theatre and Dance Jim Linnell to create and present a special flamenco performance for the 50th anniversary of the College of Fine Arts. Considering the value for her dance students of seeing a variety of professional flamenco artists, Encinias began the hard work of organizing, curating, and promoting this event. The Festival was so successful that the UNM Department of Theatre and Dance asked Encinias if she could make it an annual event. This was the beginning of Festival Flamenco Albuquerque.

Now in its 36th year, the National Institute of Flamenco has produced the annual Festival Flamenco Albuquerque with community partners the University of New Mexico and the National Hispanic Cultural Center. As the largest, most significant flamenco event outside of Spain, the Festival brings together students, fans, aficionados and some of the world's most acclaimed flamenco artists for one magical week in June.

Over the course of the Festival, students of all levels, including children and youth take daily immersive flamenco music and dance workshops in the Carlisle Gym at the University of New Mexico (UNM) with some of the top names in flamenco. Workshop students are joined by an even larger number of flamenco fans every evening for a thrilling lineup of performances at the Rodey Theatre at UNM, the National Hispanic Cultural Center (NHCC), the "X" Theatre at UNM and Tablao Flamenco Albuquerque inside the Hotel Albuquerque at Old Town. In its depth and breadth, the Festival is unique and attracts significant numbers of attendees from New Mexico, the rest of the country, and the world.

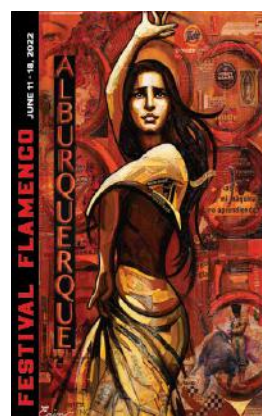
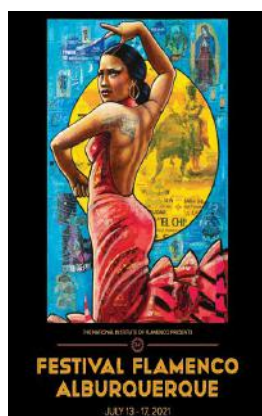
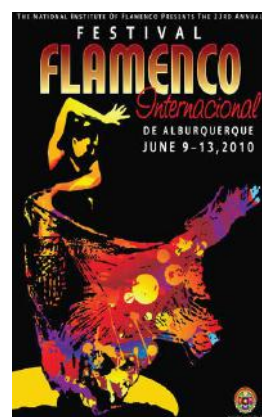
