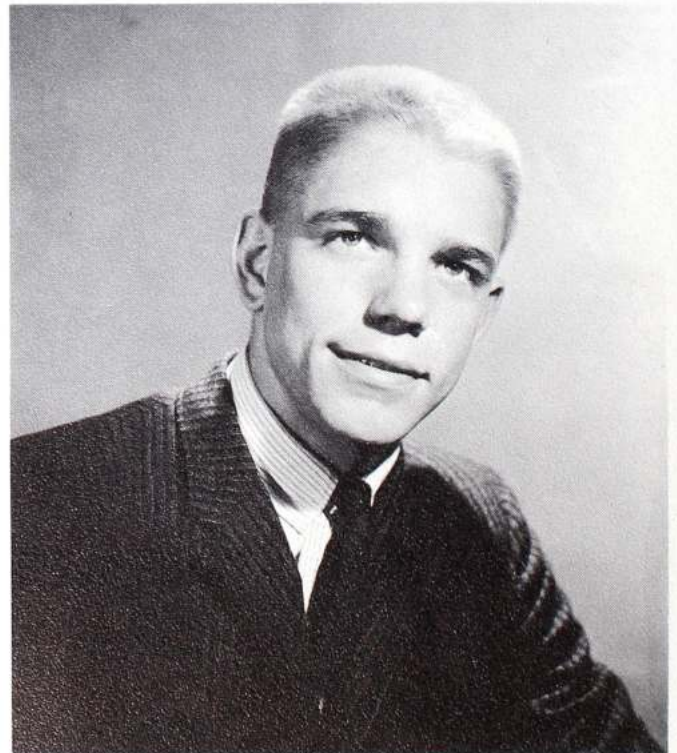

Facing East toward the rugged Wasatch Mountains, the new Box Elder High School reflects the ever changing hues in its own unique coloring.

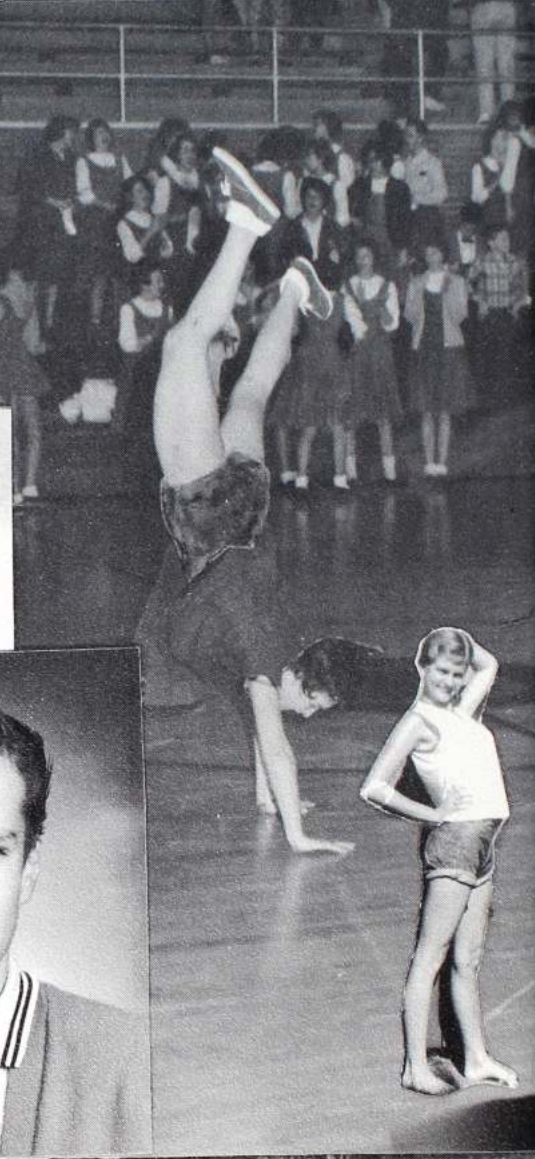

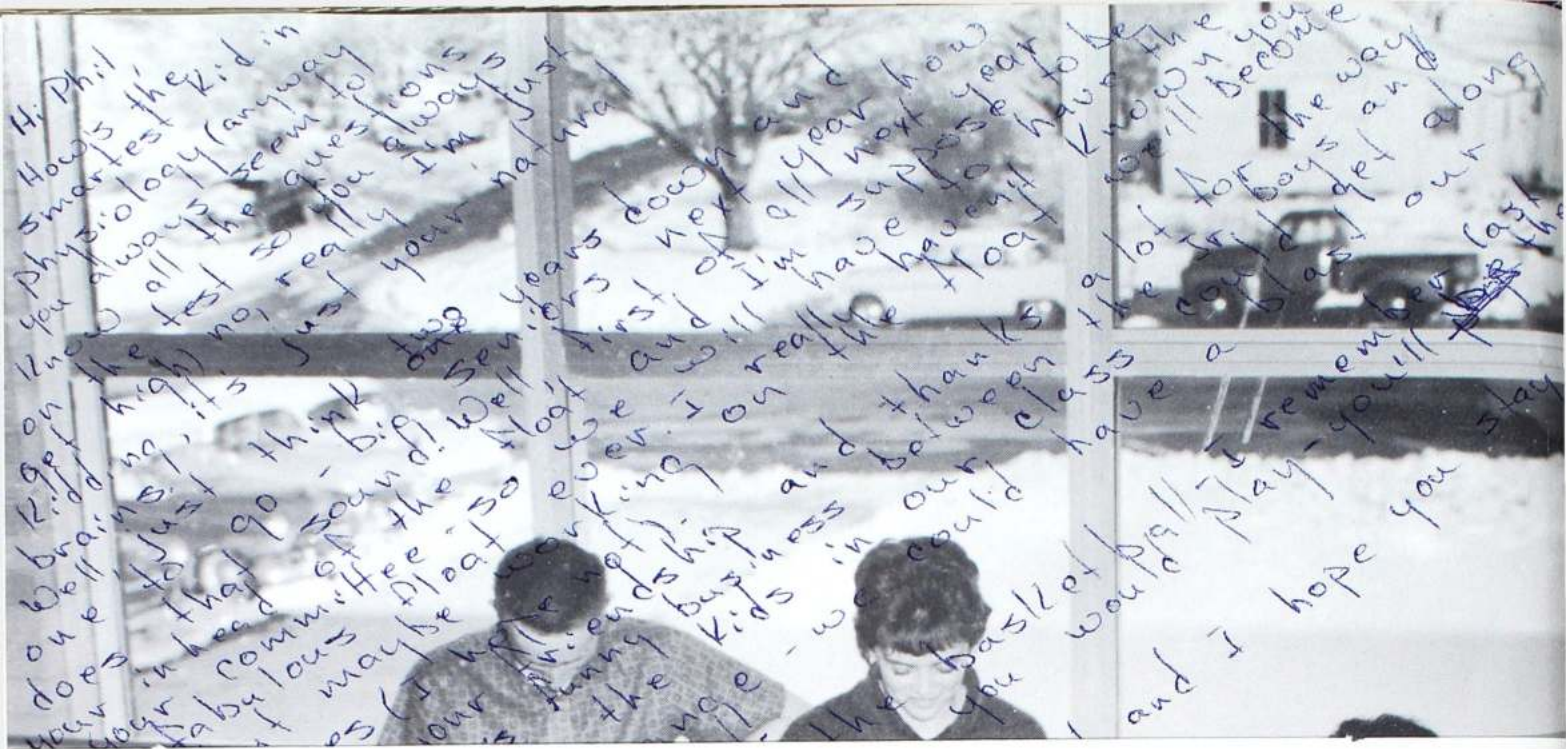
Even back when we were Sophomores we lit the BEE so good, it continued to burn all during the Homecoming game.

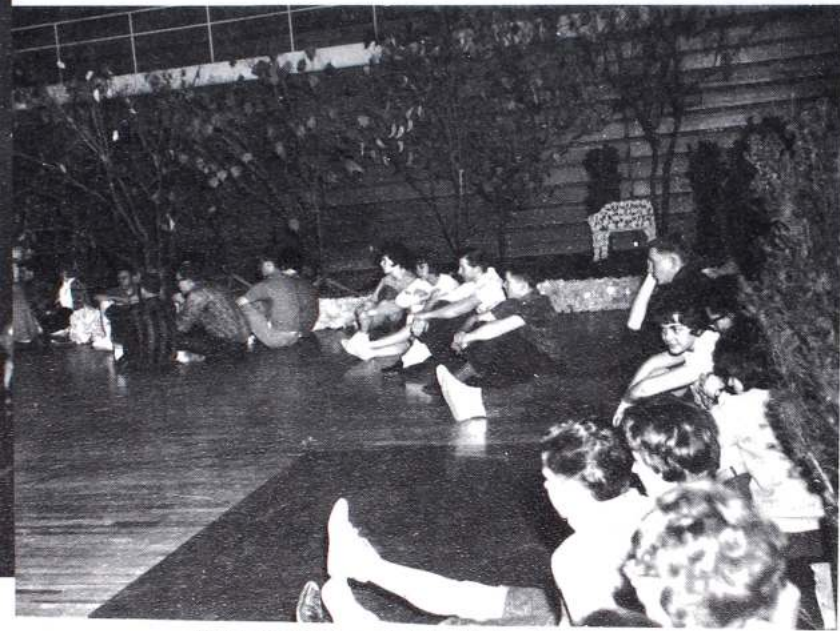
As Friday, March 25, arrived the halls were alive with anticipation of this first Junior Prom to be held in the new Box Elder High School.

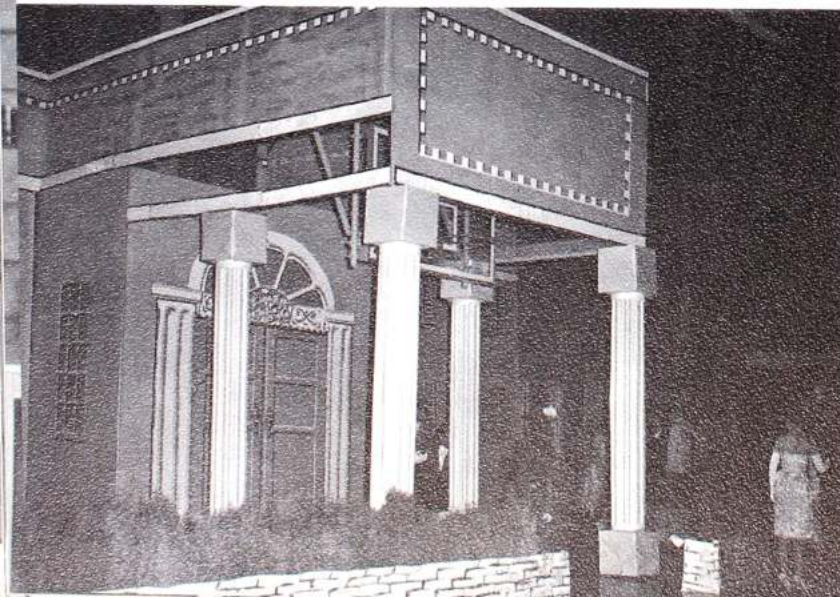
All too soon the orchestra, the Scotsmen of U.S.U., was playing the strains of the last dance and another Junior Prom was added to history.

We can always be proud of Box Elder's athletic endeavors.



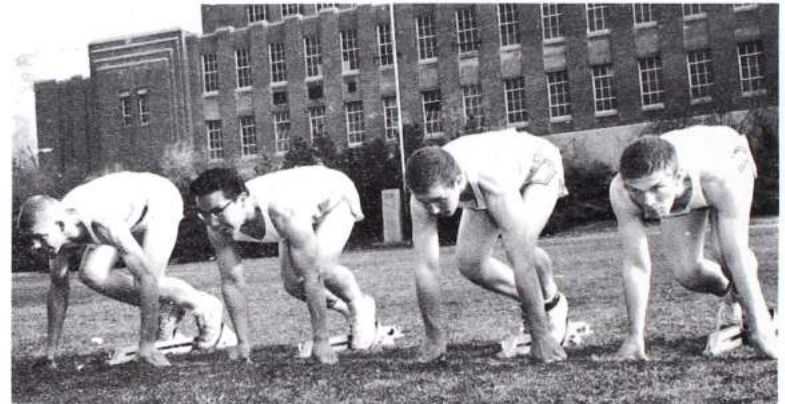
