






YOUR GUIDE TO Simpsonville



The Greenville County School District is the largest school district in South Carolina with 14 high schools, 18 middle schools, and 50 elementary schools in the district.

The Greenville County School District is deeply committed to providing quality education. They have been awarded National Accreditation from the AdvancED Accreditation Commission, recognizing the school system as a high-quality school district and granting full accreditation to the school district and all of its schools.


Many of the district's facilities have been recognized with state and national awards. The district boasts several National Blue Ribbon Schools, Palmetto's Finest schools, a National PTA School of Excellence, a National School of Character, a South Carolina School of Promise, and another which earned the Baldrige Model of Continuous Improvement recognition.

The Golden Strip Career Center is part of the Greenville County School district, and serves students in the Simpsonville, Mauldin, and Fountain Inn communities.

The Golden Strip Career Center is a place where students learn skills that prepare them for careers. Students not only learn technical and trade skills, but also key soft skills that contribute to long-term employability. Most students at Golden Strip Career Center are also enrolled in non-alternative high schools in the school district; therefore, school bus transportation between these schools and the career center is provided on school days.

A big attraction for many retirees is a tax-friendly state since among their top list of expenses is taxes.

South Carolina is an ideal choice because it is one of the states that offer low taxes. But it is not only the low taxes that make moving here a good choice. Apart from the low taxes, the cost of living is less expensive compared to other states. In Simpsonville, for example, the cost of living was 96.4, below the national average of 100, whereas in Los Angeles CA, Boston MA, or Newark NJ, the cost of living was 131.3, 142.8, an 129.4 respectively.

Plus, there are great retirement communities in Simpsonville. One of the 55+ communities is The Ravines at Creekside. This community is a lighted condominium community with a heated pool, clubhouse, fitness facilities, lawn maintenance, and a very convenient location near Woodruff Road and Main Street in Simpsonville.

Also, there are other independent and assisted living facilities in Simpsonville including <u>The Springs at Simpsonville</u>, <u>Fairview Park</u>, and <u>Harmony at Five Forks</u>.

The downtown area is filled with dining, shopping, and entertainment options.








SHOPPING

Moving to Simpsonville

Research your options



Financing

It is important that you already know how much money you can spend on a home. If you can attach a pre-qualification letter with your offer to purchase a property, a seller will take your offer more seriously because it means that a lender has determined that you are a suitable candidate for a mortgage.

Finding the right home

When searching for your home, having a list of all the things you want and need in your home is important. Note the must-haves, the deal-breakers, and your wish-list to help you target your search. This will save you a lot of time especially if you have a limited time to visit and check the area.

Once you've found the home you'd like to buy, it's time to make an offer. An offer should specify price and all other terms and conditions of the purchase.

Secure Financing


Once your offer has been approved and both sides have signed a purchase contract, it is time to begin the process of securing your mortgage. You will need to meet with your lender within the time frame noted on your purchase contract to formally apply for your loan. Your loan approval will be based on the information you provided to your lender during your initial application, so you should try to keep your financial life as stable as possible during the process any changes to that information could very easily affect your loan approval.

Closing

This is the last step in buying and financing a home. You can check with your buyers's agent about the details of your closing. He or she will be able to keep track of the transaction and communicate with your lender or title company to make sure everything is moving along in a timely manner.

The final walk-through is typically scheduled within the week leading up to the closing date. Your final walk-through is to ensure that any repairs have been completed if stated in your contract and that the home is ready to move into.

Moving

Moving out from your previous home also needs planning. As soon as you know a moving date, get price estimates and a list of services.

Reconfirm your agent if your closing is still on track, once determined, confirm moving and delivery dates with your movers. On moving day, supervise movers as they load and unload at delivery to make sure boxes and other items go to the right rooms at your new home.
