



Charter International School – Secondary Uniform Guidance

At Charter, we believe that school uniform supports a sense of identity, community, and pride. All Secondary students are expected to maintain a high standard of personal appearance at all times. Uniform is compulsory unless otherwise stated (e.g., non-uniform days or special occasions). All items of uniform can be purchased from the school shop.

Daily Uniform

This is the uniform that students wear on a daily basis for lessons.

- Charter light blue polo shirt
- Dark shorts, trousers, or skirt (skirts must be knee-length)
- Charter jumper (optional)
- Black footwear (shoes or trainers, no obvious additional colour)





PE Kit

This is the uniform that students wear for PE lessons and non house related sporting activities. Students may wear this uniform to school on days they have a PE lesson or sporting event.

- Charter PE shirt or Leadership shirt
- Charter PE shorts
- Suitable footwear for sport
- Charter swimming kit for swimming lessons:
 - Charter swim suit
 - Swimming hat *
 - Goggles (optional)
 - Towel and shower gel

* A swimming hat is compulsory for students with long hair.





Formal Secondary Uniform

On specific occasions, students are required to wear Formal Uniform instead of the daily uniform. Parents and Students will be informed in advance of the occasion if it requires formal uniform:

- Male students: White shirt with tie, dark shorts or trousers
- Female students: White shirt, dark shorts, trousers, or skirt (knee-length)

This uniform is required for events such as:

- Thai cultural events e.g Wai Kru ceremony
- Award ceremonies and additional special cultural events
- Representative events outside school (non-sport)
- Graduation Ceremony (including rehearsals and the ceremony)



House Event Uniform

During house events students should wear:

- House t shirt
- PE shorts
- Either black footwear or appropriate footwear if the event is a sport.



Additional items

For health and safety reasons:

- Jewelry is not permitted, except small earring studs in pierced ears or small objects of religious significance.
- These must be removed for PE and swimming, or covered securely with a plaster.
- Make up should be discreet and suitable for the school environment.

General Expectations

- Students should arrive at school in correct uniform each day.
- Uniform should be kept clean, neat, and in good condition.
- Students must not alter or personalise their uniform.
- To avoid confusion and lost items, all clothing, shoes, and personal items should be clearly labelled with the student's name.
